

Here are this month's highlights from Corvetteblogger.


- **Chevrolet is offering \$4,000 loyalty rebate for current Camaro and Corvette owners on new 2025 Corvettes**

Chevrolet is now offering a new \$4,000 loyalty rebate to current Camaro and Corvette owners now through January 2nd, 2026. You must currently own a 2011 or newer Camaro or Corvette to qualify, and no, you don't have to offer it as a trade-in.

The \$4,000 rebate is good only on in-stock sales of new 2025 Corvette Stingrays, E-Rays and Z06's.

A nationwide search of the Chevrolet Live Inventory Tracker shows that there are currently (as of December 03) 1,540 2025 Corvettes still available at Chevrolet dealers. That Live Inventory can be further broken down by model: 159 Stingrays, 421 E-Rays and 960 Z06's.

We're also hoping that dealers will stack this rebate on top of any other offers they have, but obviously that's up to the individual dealer based on how many cars they need to move. Large dealers with inventory are more likely to offer these on top of any other discounts, so check with your dealer for details.



- **GM raises prices on ZR1 and destination fee increases \$500 on all Corvettes**

It's the holidays and it's usually the time of year when things start to slow down, especially when it comes to official news from GM. But, that doesn't seem to be the case this year!

All 2026 Corvette models will see a \$500 price increase on the cost of the mandatory destination charge from the assembly plant to dealerships. Previously, it was at \$1,995 and now it is going to \$2,495. FYI, it was just \$1,695 in January 2025



Also, the MSRP of the 2026 Corvette ZR1 is going up by \$1,600. We are assuming that this price increase is for both Coupe and HTC models and covers both 1LZ and 3LZ trim levels. Here is the pricing with that increase, not including the destination charge. The previous 2026 MSRP is in parenthesis (A) while the final number (B) was the original pricing when the MSRP for the 2025 ZR1 was announced in January 2025:

- **ZR1 Coupe 1LZ: \$182,000 (A \$180,400) (B \$173,300)**
- **ZR1 Coupe 3LZ: \$193,000 (A \$191,400) (B \$184,300)**

- **ZR1 HTC 1LZ: \$192,000 (A \$190,400) (B \$183,300)**
- **ZR1 HTC 3LZ: \$203,000 (A \$201,400) (B \$194,300)**

Now, here's the real kicker for those with a current order in the system for a 2026 Corvette. There will be no order price protection for these increases, which went into effect on Monday, December 15th.

Statement from GM: *The DFC (delivery freight charge) listed on the window sticker reflects the cost of shipping vehicles from the factory to dealer showrooms. We review these charges periodically and adjust as needed to keep in-line with the overall industry average.*

• **C8 production tracker shows (6) 2026 Corvette ZR1X's have been completed**

Thursday, December 11th, kicked off the start of the December order cycle for the Chevrolet Corvette and dealers only received allocations for the four current models being produced: Stingray, E-Ray, Z06 and ZR1. It appeared to us that the start of ordering for the upcoming ZR1X has been pushed back again.

But, then we found out through our dealer network that Chevy has directly placed several allocations for the ZR1X in the last 10 days (as of 19 Dec) or so to a select few dealers for retail orders. At least one of those cars – VIN 004 – was showing to be completed from an internal screenshot.



So we turned to Roger Kiel's C8 Production Tracker on Facebook to see if there was any more news about the supercar and, sure enough, Roger is now reporting that six ZR1X's have been completed.

In addition to the six completed ZR1X's, Roger also states that GM has built a total of 72 ZR1X's that are Captured Test Fleet cars. I haven't seen that number before and we'll see if we can get confirmation on that as well.

Our current working theory on this is that Chevy wanted to get a few cars ready prior to the assembly plant shutting down for the extended holiday break. Officially, the plant is now closed for the holidays and will restart operations on Monday, January 12th. By going direct to the dealers, they are also able to avoid any disappointing news about options not being available. We have heard that the Alcon brakes are still very limited.

The next public showing of the ZR1X is expected at Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale in mid-January. There, a special "one of one" ZR1X in the Stars & Stripes livery will be auctioned off with the proceeds going 100% to the Tunnel to Towers Foundation.

A DAY AT HAYNER



On Tuesday, December 23rd, 24 members of the BCC spent the afternoon at Hayner. First, we toured the Hayner mansion on Main Street in downtown Troy. The home was built back in 1914 by Mary Jane Hayner, the widow of William Hayner. The mansion (now the Troy-Hayner Cultural Center) is an example of the Romanesque style architecture and was designed by Cincinnati-based Allyn Engineering Company.

During the Christmas holidays, each room of the mansion is decorated in a Christmas theme by various local artists and groups. Each room is decorated differently. The overall theme at Hayner this year was based on the movie National Lampoon's Christmas vacation. You'll see several references to that as you look through the pictures.

Our tour was conducted by Rachael Boezi, the Assistant Director of the Hayner Cultural Center. She first gave us a little history on the mansion, details on the design and the Hayner family. She then led us on a tour of the three floors.

After our tour, we then headed over to the Hayner Distilling Company. We were greeted by Greg Taylor, co-owner of Hayner Distilling. Also joining us was Andrew Wannemacher, the other co-owner of Hayner Distilling.



Greg reviewed a PowerPoint slide presentation of the history of Hayner, when the original distillery was established (1866), when it closed (1920 during prohibition) and when it was re-launched (2018). After the presentation, we did a blind tasting of four Bourbons and then rated each one. After that, we enjoyed pizza from Papa John's along with some spirited conversation. Before we left, several members purchased some Hayner items (Bourbon, hats, sweaters, hoodies and the like).

It was a great afternoon. Thankfully, the weather cooperated which made our afternoon at Hayner a lot more enjoyable.


