Those exhaust tips can get quite dirty over time, especially the two outer ones (and it's even worse on the Z06). Just spray the product onto the tips or on to a microfiber towel. Give it a little time so soak, and then just wipe it off. Your exhaust will look as good as new.

Thanks for the "tip", Fred.

Another tip cleaning "tip". No sooner did Fred send his cleaning tip in than I saw another cleaning idea. This one is a video from Brink of Speed, where he polishes his exhaust tips using a product called Blue Magic Polishing Cream. The short video provides you with all the information you need to polish your exhaust tips back to a bright finish.

Frankly, there is a plethora of products out there that will work great if you want to polish your exhaust tips. Find one that works for you and stick to it.



If you have a C8 and are interested, the two parts numbers to order are #855719, which is the center mount, and #217097, which is the MagnePro Magnetic Phone Holder. If you don't have a MagSafe compatible phone (e.g. wireless charging), you can order the holder that you just slip your phone in to. Installation takes about 20 minutes from start to finish.

Makes for a nice, clean install and gets your phone up and out of the way

Total price for the mount is around \$150.00.

Then, in March, the Museum released their Christmas ornament for 2025. Lo and behold, the ornament bears a striking similarity to our Banner.


It was purely by accident that both just happen to have the same Corvettes in their design.


There are a lot of ticked-off potential buyers of the ZR1 right now. Can you blame them?

MARCH HIGHLIGHTS FROM CORVETTE Blogger.com

C8 Bronze Wheel Option from Wheel Craft of Mentor, OH

Keith talked about his experience with Wheel Craft out of Mentor, OH. Wheel Craft can provide PVD Bright Chrome wheels for any Corvette model equipped with any wheel. Keith just happens to have a set of chrome wheels on his Hysteria Purple 2025 ERay. He really likes how the wheels brighten up the car and brings attention to the bright red calipers and the huge carbon ceramic brake rotors.



Having said that, Keith wanted to talk about Wheel Craft's Bronze wheel finish and how it can transform the look of your C8 Corvette while also making them stand out from the crowd.

Chevrolet offers an accessory wheel in Bronze for both the Stingray and Z06. When you buy these accessory wheels, they are added to your order IN ADDITION to the factory wheels that you select. And these accessory wheels are not cheap as the Z06 Bronze Spider-design wheels are \$3,695 while the Stingray's 20-spoke Bronze wheels are \$3,195.

Both look fantastic on the C8's when paired with the right color combination, that's for sure. As many of you may remember, Joe Ricketts and I both experienced first-class treatment from Wheel Craft last year when we both switched to PVD chrome wheels from Wheel Craft.

• [SPIED] Corvette Engineers Testing 2026 Corvettes: New Interior?

It has been rumored for the last two years that a refresh was coming to the C8 Corvette's interior. Some spy photos from spy photographer Glenn Paulina may just provide a hint. Glenn recently caught up with two different Corvette engineering groups testing what appears to be several ZR1's and quite possibly some ZORA prototypes in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. The front radiators of all five were clearly visible that show mounted radiator that was added to the E-Ray for cooling the front electric motor.



In the picture to the right, that is a ZR1. However, there is a radiator (circled) that right now is only installed on Corvette E-Rays that have the electric motor in the front.

If that is the case, you then have a ZR1 with 1,064 HP out back and also an electric motor up front that would have roughly 250 HP. Add those numbers up and you get a Corvette with horsepower numbers around 1,314 HP. Could this be the much anticipated ZORA???




The other big news is that this group of 2026 Corvettes could be showing the long-rumored new 2026 dash which surrounds the C8 Corvette's infotainment screen. There were also some spy photographs that were taken at the Milford Proving Grounds that give us a better glimpse at the refreshed interior.



In the picture below, the top photo shows what the 2026 instrument panel looks like. You can see the big change on the top of the dash right behind the infotainment screen. Right below that is an insert of what the current C8 instrument panel looks like, with that valley right behind the infotainment screen. On the 2026, the infotainment screen is now surrounded by leather wrap. What it clearly does not show is whether the center stack of climate control buttons has been removed. My guess is that the climate control buttons are now on the touch screen infotainment unit (ala the new Cadillac Mystique).



Nope! Here's a photo of the new 2026 Corvette interior and it shows that the HVAC buttons have now been moved to just below the infotainment screen. That'll work I guess. I'm still OK with the "wall".





• Corvette Wins 2025 Best Resale Value Award from KBB



If you are looking for yet another reason to buy a mid-engine C8 Corvette, here's the latest.

The C8 Corvette just took first place – again – in the 23rd annual **Kelley Blue Book 2025 Best Resale Value Awards** in the Sports Car category for the sixth year in a row. Chevy's sports car was also a member of the "2025 Best Resale Value: Top 10 Cars" division of the awards, joining the likes of the Ford Bronco, Honda CR-V, Mercedes-Benz G-Class, Porsche 911 and five Toyota models to represent "the best of the best" while also beating out hundreds of other vehicles.

70th Anniversary Publication

Could this be that very last Corvette publication/brochure ever?


Published in November of 2022, this 12"x9"x1/2", \$50, 112 page treatise on Corvette is the last printed information booklet to come from Chevrolet. It covers Corvette from the beginning through 2023 – the 70th anniversary of the car.

The publication, is printed on heavy stock with an embossed C8 emblem on the thick cover with the top, side and bottom edge gilded in silver. It covers the entire history of the C8, from Zora's dream to the final product. Pages 81-89 are dedicated to the history of C1 through C7.

Designed to be an expansive marketing piece, it contains all the information you would find in earlier Corvette brochures – only a fancier presentation.

It will remain to be seen whether or not Chevrolet does continue the tradition of issuing a new brochure for each year of Corvette. With no printed brochure for the 2024 and 2025 model year C8, this, indeed, may be the swan song for any future Corvette brochures.

If that is the case, what a shame.






On March 7th, a large group of BCC members headed up to Troy to spend the evening at **Craft & Cured**, a casual, artisanal craft brew destination. Located in a totally restored bank building (built in 1930) smack dab in the middle of downtown Troy, it offers three floors of casual seating and three uniquely themed bars.

Craft & Cured was established some years back and was actually first opened in downtown Dayton. A little over 2 years ago, C&C was looking to move to another location. Eventually, the owners sat down with the owner of the old bank building in downtown Troy. According to one of the owners of C&C, the offer to move to Troy was too attractive to pass on. Now open for a little over 2 years, C&C appears to be doing pretty good.

When you walk into the building, the interior takes your breath away. The ceilings are 3 stories high and finished in ornately carved and painted wood. The basement level is finished (although we did not go downstairs).

The first floor is the original bank floor with a beer/wine bar towards the front and a bar in the rear where you can order food. The second floor, accessible by stairs, is open to the lower level and has a beautiful bourbon bar built in towards the back. Lots of open seating with great views of the interior and a large window in the front with views of downtown Troy and the fountain.



So we wandered around and took some pictures of the evening.























Crafted & Cured is really more of a specialty establishment focused on craft beers, bourbon/whiskey, meat and cheese trays and the such. If you are looking to come here for a nice dinner, this is not the place.

The building and décor is beautiful. Hard to believe that this was built as a bank let alone that it was completed in 1930 – right after the Great Depression.

That said, if you are looking for a casual spot you could stop at after dinner, relax and have an after-dinner aperitif, you should consider checking this place out. It is quiet and there are plenty of cozy places to sit and talk.


