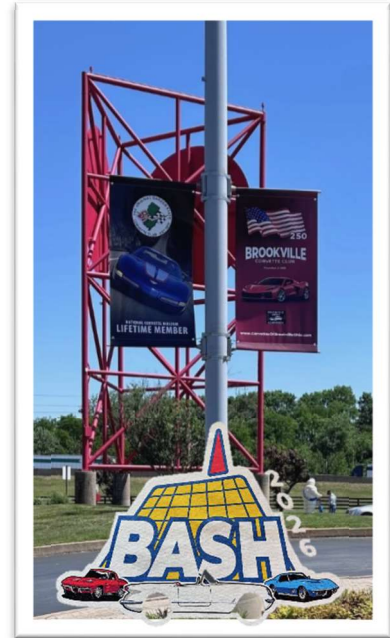

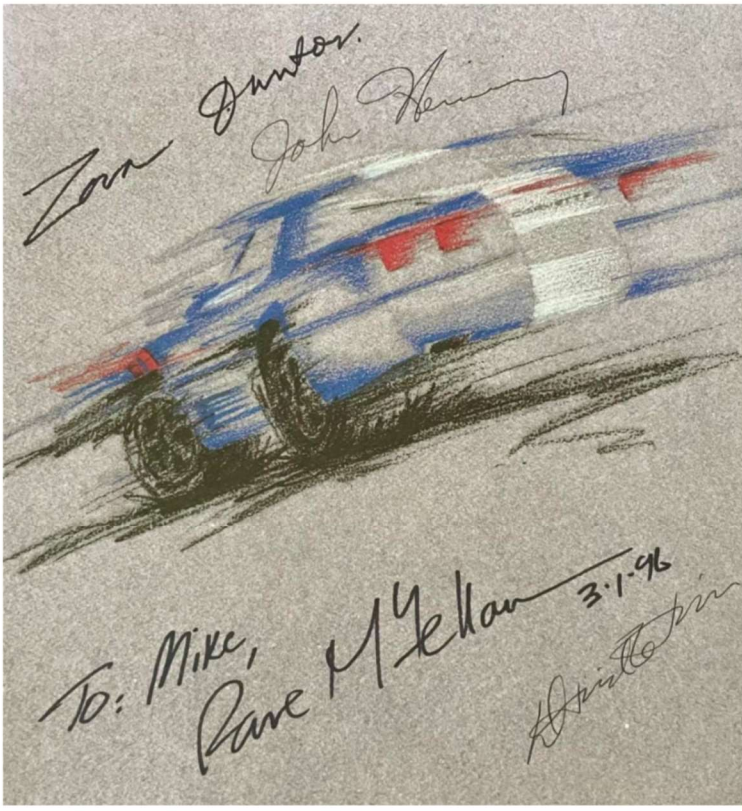

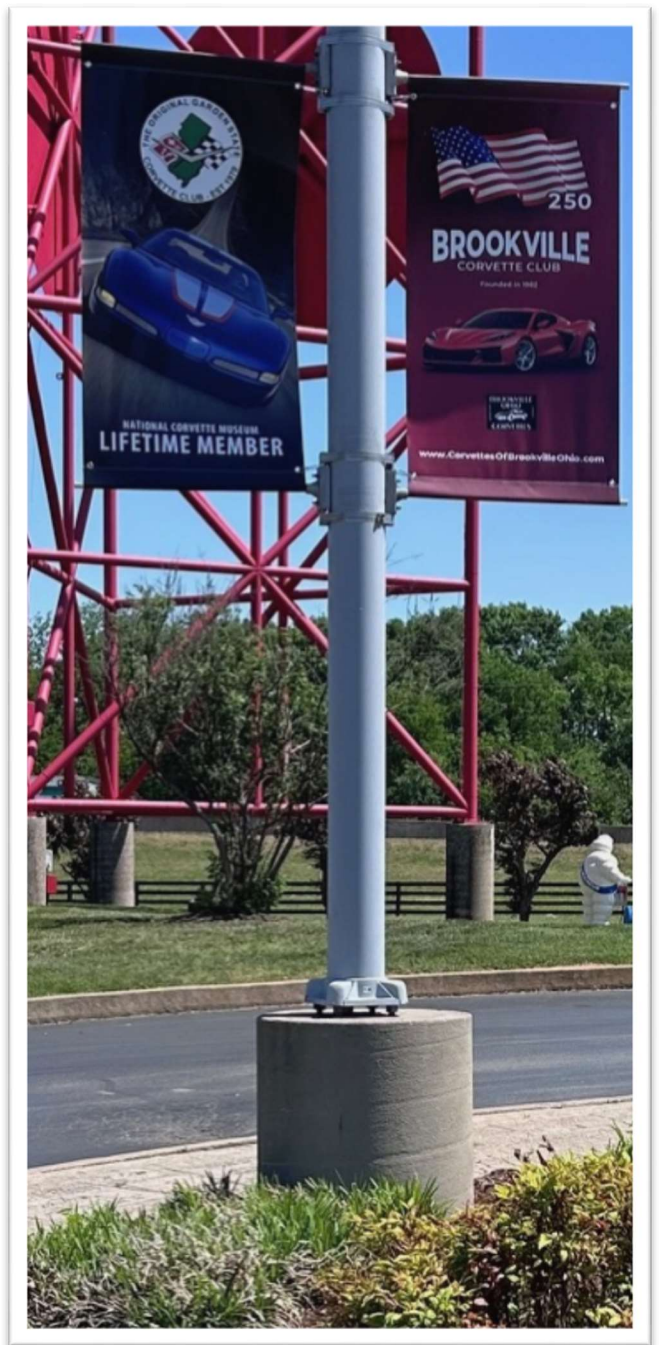

COVERAGE OF THE 2026 MICHELIN BASH



**NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM
APRIL 23 - 25**



From April 24 – 26, several BCC members drove down to Bowling Green, KY to attend the annual Michelin Bash, the first major event each season for the National Corvette Museum.

In addition to the organized drives (we did one), Museum tours and presentations, we had some unique opportunities to meet, talk to and dine with some great Corvette people. That's all covered later on in this review.

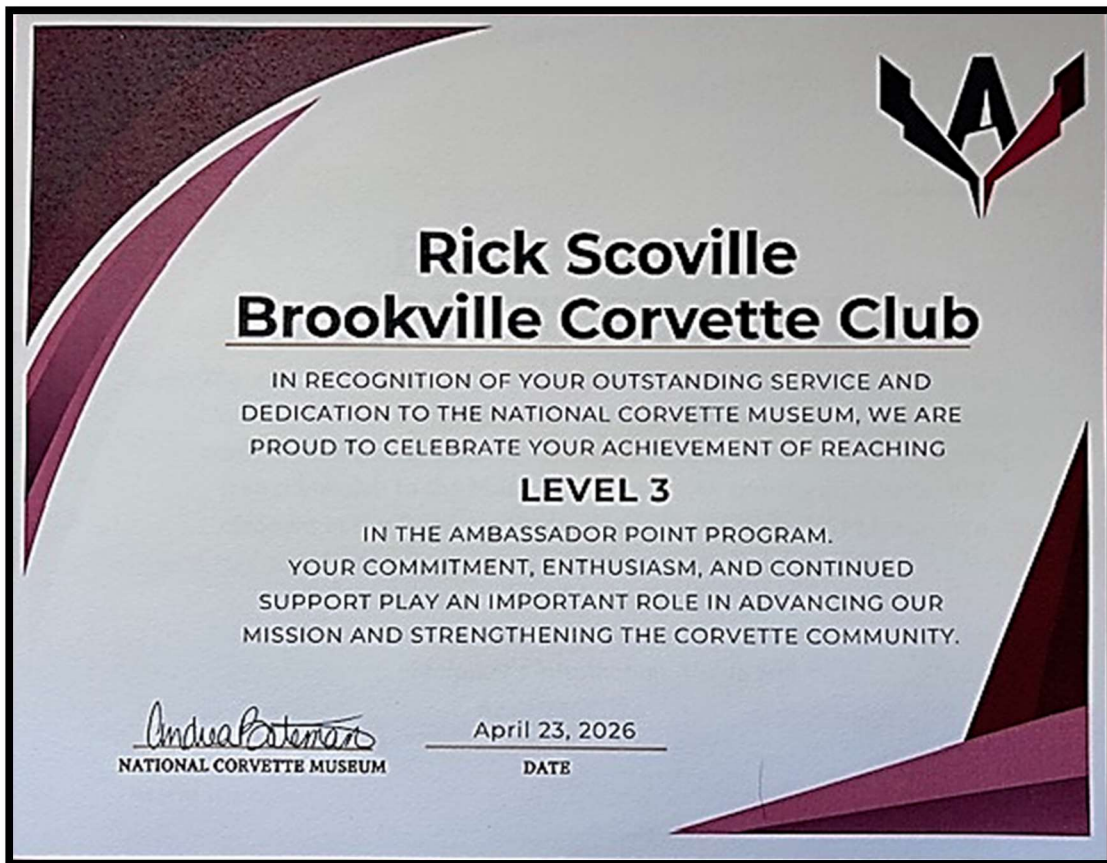
The first thing we can report is that it appears the **Bash is Back!** Bryce Burklow, **President and CEO**, reported that the initial registration figures totaled 1,200 participants. However, there was a huge crowd that arrived on the first day that had not pre-registered. So, total Bash participants were much higher than the 1,200 people that had pre-registered. If you walked around the Museum property, you could tell that the place was packed. All of the parking lots were filled end-to-end with Corvettes. Quite the sight!

The other thing that people noticed was that everyone was truly excited to be there. All of the Museum employees were busy, but everyone went out of their way to interact with the crowd. It did feel like the pre-Covid days: big crowds, lots of Vettes and plenty to see and do.

AMBASSADOR MEETING

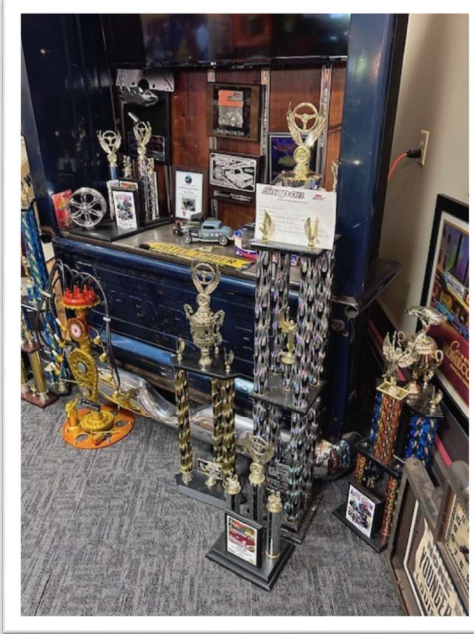
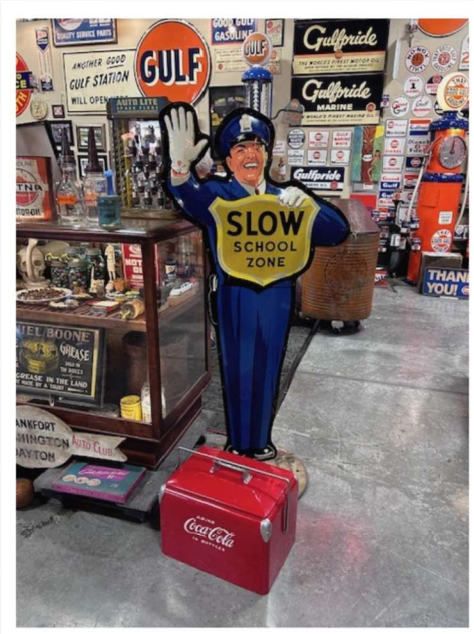
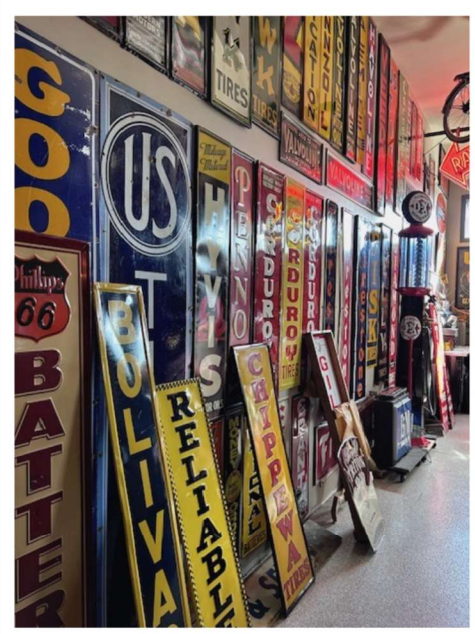

FRIDAY BASH EVENTS

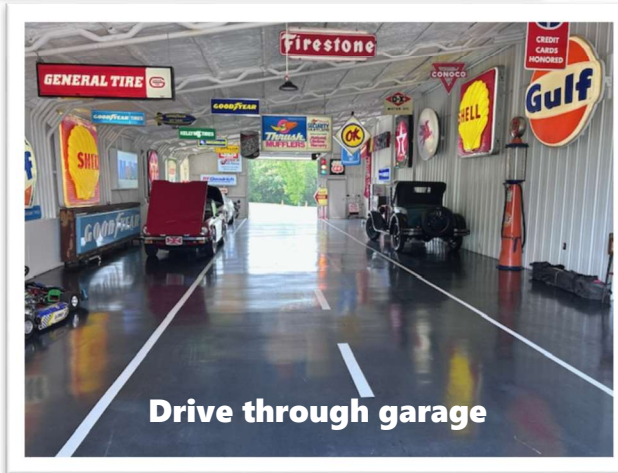

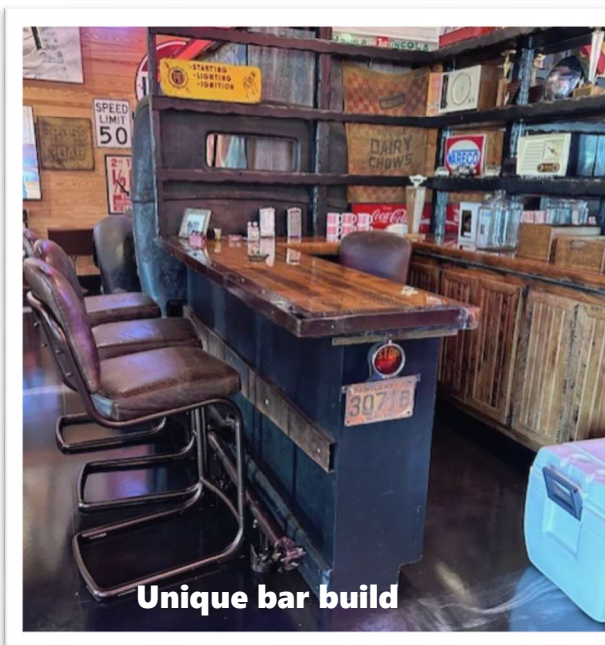

In the picture above, that is a 2026 ZR1X with the Stars and Steel USA package. The car was factory ordered by Tim and Melanie McMichael, major donors to the National Corvette Museum. Mike Furman handled the ordering process. According to Mike, the car is loaded with an MSRP of \$274,680! Tim also did the Engine Build Experience (another \$10k) with his son. There are only 9 White ZR1X's that have the Stars and Steel package.

Above right, Gary and I went over to the new Collections Building currently under construction and did a hard hat tour. We were also able to sign the metal studs located in what will be the entrance to the facility when finished. Pretty cool.

APRIL HIGHLIGHTS FROM

Here are this month's highlights from Corvetteblogger.

- **General Motors delivers 6,235 new Corvettes during 1st Quarter 2026**

GM is out with their first quarterly sales report for 2026, and we do consider it to be pretty good as far as first quarters go. They sold 6,235 new Corvettes during the time period spanning January 1 through March 31. That number was down about 500 units from the same period in 2025 in which 6,794 Corvettes were delivered. That was an 8.2% decline year over year.



On the rebate front, GM has kept the \$4,000 loyalty rebate on 2025 Corvettes for current Corvette and Camaro owners and it's now been extended through April 30th. Just checking the Chevrolet Live Inventory tracker

and it shows 326 remaining 2025 Corvettes at dealers. They can be broken down with 46 Stingrays, 114 ERays and 166 Z06's. There are some crazy deals to be had with dealers, so keep that in mind if you want a new Corvette at a killer deal.

As we look forward to the 2nd quarter, we are hoping to see the Grand Sport and the new LS6-powered Stingrays starting production sometime in June. Chevy originally told its dealers that the 2027 model year would start on Monday, June 1st. It would be great to see the new Grand Sport coming off the line as soon as possible.

- **Chevrolet confirms approximately 25k units produced for '26 model year**

A highlight of the National Corvette Museum's Bash event is the official "What's New" seminar with members of the Corvette team and from that we got some news regarding the 2026 model year production stats.

The number they provided for total production during the 2026 model year was approximately 25,000 Corvettes. While not yet official, GM knows exactly how many orders have been accepted and sequenced through the end of the model year which is on May 29th. With the assembly plant having the next two weeks off due to supplier constraints, that leaves just three full weeks of 2026 production remaining.

With approximately 25k units produced, the models break down as follows:

- **Stingray:** 62% or approximately 15,500 units
- **E-Ray:** 5% or approximately 1,250 units
- **Z06:** 26% or approximately 6,500 units
- **ZR1/X:** 7% or approximately 1,750 units



We also got the build numbers for one of the two Special Editions offered during the model year. We don't have the numbers yet for the ZR1X Quail Silver Editions, but we do for the RPO USA Stars & Steel Corvettes. Chevrolet is celebrating the 250th anniversary of the United States with 250 of these featuring both Arctic White and Black Corvettes with a special flag design which were built across the five different models.

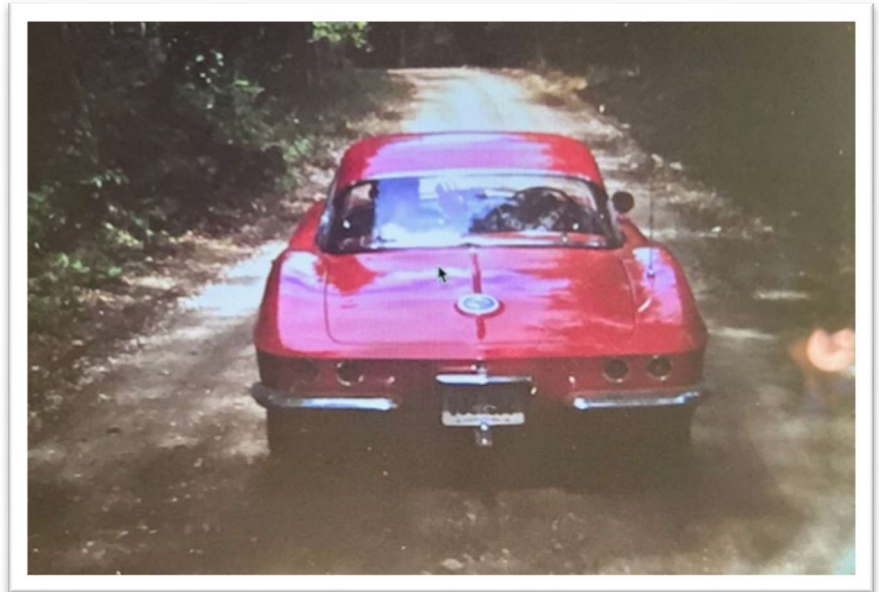
