CORVETTE CORNER WITH Mike Furman National Corvette Specialist

This month, we introduce a brand new segment to Flags. I reached out to Mike Furman from Criswell Chevrolet in Gaithersburg, MD and asked for his permission to use content from his weekly vlogs/blog. When attending the Michelin Bash at the Corvette Museum each April, Mike just happens to stay at the same hotel that we do (Marriott Courtyard). For the last several years, I have run into Mike sitting in the lobby of the hotel. We've had several great conversations, and Mike always shares some of his Corvette-related experiences from the last 47 years. This year, we talked about his weekly blog and I thought it would be a great addition to Flags if we could use some of the content that he sends out. He didn't hesitate to say yes.

As most of you know, Mike is the Number 1 Corvette salesman in the world and has held that position for many years. Just a few of his accomplishments:

- In his sales career, Mike has sold over 6,650 Corvettes to date and well over 8,000 other types of vehicles for Chevrolet
- Mike began his career back on July 26, 1978
- He has been a Lifetime Member of the National Corvette Museum since 2002
- He has been a member of the NCRS since 1990
- Mike has personally owned 27 Corvettes and 44 muscle cars in his lifetime
- He has accumulated a host of awards and accolades from Chevrolet and General Motors over the years.
- His current Corvette is a 2025 Riptide Blue ERay







APRIL HIGHLIGHTS FROM CORVETTE Blogger.com

• Corvette Assembly Plant Undergoes Staffing Reductions

Since the beginning of the year we've been following the "project improvements" that were scheduled for the Corvette assembly plant in the first half of 2025. The plant has already closed for three of the four weeks planned for downtime with the final closure happening the week of May 19th.

Our friends over at MidEngineCorvetteForum.com tell us that 31 BGA employees were laid off while another 43 senior employees with 25 years or more experience selected an early retirement buyout with their employment ending on June 1st. The buyout off reportedly includes a \$50k bonus as well.



Thanks to Roger Kiel's Production Tracker on Facebook, we can see that production levels are extremely lower than they were before the assembly plant did its two-week closure at the end of March. Whereas the assembly plant was previously producing between 140 – 180 Corvettes per day, the daily production over the last three weeks (April) has ranged from 29 to 94 cars total.






• GM's Latest Patent Detects Potholes and Warns Authorities About Road Conditions

The C7 Corvette has been plagued for years with the issue of cracked wheels sometimes caused by potholes, or at least that's where General Motors has tried to shift the blame in some cases.

Recently, GM filed a patent for a new system that automatically identifies road hazards like potholes, flooding and damaged road signs through the use of sensors and cameras already in place on many of its newer vehicles and then compiles a report from this information and forward it to governmental authorities in charge of fixing them. In theory, this could speed up repairs.



GM's new system would apparently make identification of such road issues automatic through the use of GPS hardware to determine the location of the issue, with cameras, infrared detectors and LIDAR sensors taking photos and collecting more information about the problem. Then, it would just become a matter of getting the proper governmental parties to pay attention and assign crews to repair them.

EPA Officially Rates the Fuel Economy of the 1,064 HP Corvette ZR1

We know, we know....you're not buying the new Corvette ZR1 for its fuel economy. After all, this is the car that can drain a full tank of gas in just under 11 minutes while driving at wide-open throttle.

Unfortunately, the Corvette ZR1's fuel economy numbers aren't the greatest and it's



one of the reasons why it has a \$3,000 gas guzzler tax added to each and every one. So, how bad is the ZR1 at sipping fuel? The governments Fuel Economy.gov website has America's newest supercar listed at 12 MPG city and 18 MPG highway for a combined 14 MPG.

Unlike the 2023 Corvette Z06 which initially received two different ratings based on whether or not the car had an aero package, there is no distinction for the ZR1 which has just the one rating on the FuelEconomy.gov website.



• Andy Pilgrim Joins the National Corvette Museum Board of Directors

Growing up in Nottingham, England, he probably wondered if he could have dreamed of being inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame one day. But, that's exactly what happened to this storied Corvette Racing driver back in 2012, and now he's just been appointed to the Board of Directors of the National Corvette Museum.

"To be welcomed into the National Corvette Museum is an incredible honor", the 68-year-old Pilgrim says. "The Museum represents the heart and soul of the Corvette community, and I look forward to supporting its mission, engaging with fellow enthusiasts and giving back to the people who've given me so much over the years".



"Pilgrim brings a rare combination of professional racing experience, Corvette passion and a strong commitment to public service", said Bryce Burklow, NCM President and CEO. "His legacy is deeply woven into the fabric of Corvette Racing, and we're excited about the insight and energy he will bring to the Board as we look to the future".





This exhibit is a limited-time engagement.
















RANDOM PICS AROUND THE BASH

I didn't take as many pictures this year as I've done in the past. Focused on a few specific things, especially the ZR1. There were at least 12 Engineering ZR1's at the Museum. Really hard to realize that all of those cars will soon be crushed once their engineering job is done.







Above, the **Competition Yellow** ZR1 has the ZTK package, which means all carbon fiber ground effects including that monstrous big wing in the back. That wing is larger than the wing that was on the 2019 ZR1.

The **Hysteria Purple** ZR1 is the low-wing version. This version is the fastest ZR1 produced, meaning it will reach a top speed of 233 mph. The ZTK package, because of the immense downforce produced by the big wing, is slower than the low-wing version.

On the right, that is the 5.5-liter, twin turbocharged **LT7 V8** that produces 1,064 HP @ 7,000 rpm and 828 lb-ft of torque at 6,000 rpm. It will push the ZR1 to 60 mph in 2.3 seconds and do the standing quarter mile in 9.6 seconds.

In the immortal words of the great actor Leslie Nielsen - "Let 'er rip!"



For the second time in three years, someone has placed a Michelin Man sticker on my driver's side window. Only on my car. No one else's. Inquired at the Michelin booth. Not them. Is this an inside job? Probably, but it is cute. I wonder who.....?



Two new colors for 2026. They are bringing back Blade Silver Metallic and also adding Roswell Green Metallic. The two existing colors being discontinued in 2026 are Rapid Blue and Sea Wolf Gray. This was the only sneak peek that Chevrolet provided during the Bash.

On Saturday, after the Ambassador's Meeting, I had the pleasure to spend about 45 minutes with nonother than **Kai Spande**, recently retired Plant Director of the Bowling Green Assembly Plant. Towards the end of the Ambassador's meeting, I happened to say hello to Kai standing in the back of the Corvette Theater. He had just grabbed a donut when I interrupted him.

After he laughed about the perfect timing during his first bite, we just started to talk. At that moment, my focus was on paying attention to Kai and trying to ask him the right questions. He actually became quite engaged and began telling me stories of his time at Corvette, how he managed the business and stayed engaged with the plant employees and his staff. As he said, being the director of the assembly plant was the job of a lifetime. It was the perfect way for him to wrap up his long and storied career with General Motors.

When Kai decided to retire, he was careful when it came to announcing the timing, especially with the plant employees that he had come to know. It was no secret to anyone how much Kai was liked, and his departure would be a shock to many.

Kai decided that he would purchase a new Z06 just before he retired. He filled out the order, checked off all the boxes, and ended up with a \$170k, Red Mist Metallic HTC. A pretty nice package.

Below, that is Kai's finger pointing at the Engine Build Badge displayed right in front of the engine. Here's the story on how that tag came to be.



So, Kai decided that he wanted to participate in building his own Z06 motor. To do that, he needed one of the designated builders of said engine. He actually requested that Todd Browning be his builder. Kai knew Todd very well and thought highly of him and his skills. When Todd found out that Kai was going to be helping to build an engine, he was surprised. That never happens – ever. And to have the Plant Director make the request was a big surprise. However, one thing was not told to Todd.

The day came to build the engine. Kai met up with Todd and they began the build. It takes roughly one-half day to build an engine from scratch. So Todd and Kai had plenty of time to talk and enjoy the build.

With the build complete, Kai thanked Todd. He then told Todd that the engine was going to be for Kai's new Z06. Todd was taken back and slightly confused. At that point, Kai then broke the news to Todd that he was going to retire, and this build was really his swan song as Plant Director.

Todd was stunned. He actually teared up and had to walk away from Kai. Todd was one of the first plant employees to find out that Kai was retiring. After collecting his composure, he and Kai "had their moment" and went about their business.

And here was Kai's last request. He made sure that the Engine Build Badge had both his name and Todd's name etched side-by-side. It makes Kai's Z06 a 1 of 1, with no other Engine Build Badge having two names.

Todd will remember that build for years to come.

I suggested to Kai that the next time I'm in Bowling Green, I would like to get a picture of the Badge. Kai's response: let's go out to the parking lot right now to see the tag and the Z06. And we did.

Kai and I traded contact information which included Kai's personal cell phone. Next time I'm in town, Kai agreed that we should get together just to catch up.

I'm there, man. I'm there! A great Corvette moment!


