
VICTORY CHURCH CAR & BIKE SHOW

"The Greatest Spectacle in Racing"

Unless you have been to the race, it's really hard to put into perspective that slogan "The Greatest Spectacle in Racing". I've seen that posted dozens of times over many years and never really gave it much thought. While I do consider myself a

car guy, I've never been a huge "track" fan unless it was two NHRA Top Fuel beasts going head-to-head down the quarter mile.

Now I understand. Big time.

Cindy and I had the pleasure of attending our first Indy 500 race on May 30th. BCC member and our good friends Gary and Patty Wagner could not attend the event this year. Instead of letting the tickets go to waste, Gary was kind enough to call and ask if we would like to go. I hesitated at first (I know, I know), but finally told Gary that we'd take the tickets and go to the race. I'm glad I did.

I'll dispense with a lot of detail and just say that Gary's advice on getting to the track, where to park and the best way of getting to the seats was spot-on. Of course, when you've attended the race for about 50 years, you pretty much know all of the minute details. His advice came in very handy.

We arrived about 8:15 just as Gary had suggested. Traffic was fairly light, and we were able to find parking right on Georgetown Road

light, and we were able to find parking right on Georgetown Road which leads right to one of the entrances to the Speedway. From the time we parked to the time we sat down in our seats was less than 30 minutes.

This was the view when we sat down. Hardly anyone in the stands. Note the *clear blue skies*.





Boy, did the view in the stands change by noon! Attendance was supposed to top out at around 135,000 race fans (or 40% capacity). I am convinced that the crowd was quite a bit bigger than that.

The other thing that Gary had told us is that there is always something going on around the track well before the race. Whether it was a parade of cars (all Chevy) driving around the track with various dignitaries or the Perdu Marching Band or tributes to past racing champions, you didn't go more than 15 minutes without seeing something or someone going by the stands.



The theme for the race was "Back Home Again", welcoming back race fans after not having fans in the stands for last year's delayed race (something like 720+ days). Of course, just about every fan in the stands stood and sang "Back Home in Indiana", the song that has been sung just before starting the cars for over 50 years. And, there were something like 600 track personnel standing around holding signs that suggested you wear a face mask. The nice thing was, it was not enforced.



I wish that I could share the sound from the track as those 33 cars went flying by. I did make 8 or 9 short videos at various stages of the race, but the video files are just too big to include in this Newsletter. They are even too big to send in an e-mail. So imagine, if you will, a swarm of bees – like a swarm of maybe one or two million **pissed-off** bees just flying by and the sound lasting maybe 20 seconds. That's what we heard all afternoon. Also, the sound system on the track is excellent. There are speakers every 20 - 30 feet on the poles so you don't miss any announcements or track action.



Under those *clear blue skies*, this year's field of 33 drivers ran qualifying times up around 233 MPH! By the end of the race, the field had set a new track record for average speed – 190.69 MPH. The old record of 187.433 MPH had stood since 2013.

But the star of the show this year was big-time fan favorite Hélio "Spider Man" Castroneves! Driving for **Meyer Shank Racing** out of Pataskala, OH, the ever popular Brazilian driver (a three-time Indy 500 winner in '01, '02 and '09) strategically battled it out and held off Alex Palou to win his 4th Indy 500 title by a ½ second. That puts him in some rarified air for sure. There are only four 4-time winners of the Indy 500 – A.J. Foyt, Rick Mears, Al Unser Sr. and now Hélio.



And, if your curious just how much Hélio and the Meyer Shank Racing team earned by taking the checkered flag, how about a cool \$1,828,305. Not a bad pay day! And, thanks to Gary and Patty Wagner, we were there.

If you're a bucket list type of person, especially someone interested in racing – or fast cars – or perhaps maybe millions of pissed-off bees, this race should be in your bucket. I would only hope that you would have a Kodak-type day with temperatures in the low 70's so you could enjoy the day like we did. Oh yeah, did you note the *clear blue skies*?

We had plenty of **help!**







A C8 CORVETTE - IN 1/10th SCALE

Bash at the National Corvette Museum. A company called *Traxxas* (they make remote controlled vehicles of all types) was getting ready to release their 1/10th scale version of the C8 Corvette. I was so impressed with the car that I had to order one for my Corvette collection.

Now mind you, I am not into remote controlled cars of any kind. I've never owned one. But when I saw this car, I just had to have one. A pretty accurate rendition for sure.











The plastic body easily unclips from the frame revealing a quite detailed and functional chassis. It is all wheel drive with four wheel independent It has steerable front suspension. wheels with adjustable camber and soft tires. In the picture above, you can see a detailed shot of the engine through the rear window. The thing will do 30 MPH and can be easily geared to do 70 MPH! Not sure if I'll ever run it as intended, but it does fit in nicely with my existing Corvette collection.



The car is 1/10th scale, so it's about 19" long, 8" wide and 5" tall. Hey, the way the C8 market is going right now, I may offer it up and see if I have any takers. I'm thinking base price - \$60k. NO MARK UP FROM STICKER! Well, the sticker from a real C8.

NORTHEAST OHIO WINE TOUR

I thought I'd provide an update on our upcoming trip to N.E. Ohio and Grand River Valley Wine Country. The dates for the driving event are Tuesday, July 27 through (into) Thursday July 29.





We plan to leave the Dayton area between 9:00 and 10:00 am. We have a block of 10 rooms set up at the **Holiday Inn Express in Madison, OH**. To book your

room, just call the hotel at (440) 307-4449, tell them you are with the Brookville Corvette Club and that you want one of the rooms from the block. Our Club rate is \$99.00 per night. This is a relatively new hotel (opened up about 2 years ago). Very modern. Nice, clean large rooms. The common area in the lobby is large and can seat 50 or more people. What's nice is that the hotel is situated right in the middle of wine country, so it becomes a great base for us to travel from.

I took an expeditionary trip up to NE Ohio in mid-June. I visited around 15 wineries, talked with many of the owners/managers and spent time looking around the grounds of each one. I can tell you that this will be a truly unique trip. Not only are a lot of the wineries in close proximity to one another, but you will enjoy many of the drives around the area. The roads are all in very good shape. Most of the parking lots at the wineries are stone or gravel, but they appear to be well maintained. In a couple cases, the parking lots are paved.

Do you like a red wine, or do you prefer white? Or, perhaps a nice ice wine is on your list. Or maybe rosé? Do you want to drink a beer? Bottom line, you will not want for the appropriate libation during the trip. There is something for everyone.

Over the next couple weeks, I'll send out more information and communication to everyone as we get things firmed up. We have some special stuff planned that will enhance your visits to the wineries.

This is one trip that I don't think you're going to want to miss. For those of you that did the Bourbon Trail 1 & 2 a couple of years ago, this ranks right up there with those trips. Really.



BLOOMINGTON GOLD - INDIANAPOLIS

or about 48 years, Bloomington Gold has been the benchmark Corvette car show. It first debuted back in 1973 in Bloomington, III. It was a one-day show that was aptly named Bloomington Corvette Corral. The next year, they expanded the event to two days and then the show just continued to




grow and evolve. In 1993, the show moved to the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. Then, in 1998, the show (owned by Dana Mecum) moved back to Bloomington. In 2002, the show moved to St. Charles, IL (a really cool town) and then to Champaign in 2013.

In 2015, Bloomington Gold made a big move to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. That opened the show up to many other local venues, events and drives. You could even take your 'Vette out onto the track at the Speedway and do a lap. Then, a couple years ago, Bloomington Gold moved to Lucas Oil Stadium. Again, a big move but to a super-big venue.

So, a few of us decided to head over to Indianapolis on Friday, 18 June and attend the first day of Bloomington Gold. The weather was iffy when we met up in Richmond to caravan over to Indy. That said, Bob Freshour and I went ahead and drove the 'Vettes over. Those other guys that joined us drove "regular" vehicles.



We arrived at Lucas Oil Stadium (my, my, that's a big building) without any problems (a lot of construction in and



around Indianapolis right now). Bob and I (Cindy was with me and Gary Bell joined Bob for the drive) were able to park right up close to the entrance to the building. Those other guys, well, here's a telephoto shot of them walking through the parking lot after parking their cars somewhere near Louisville (or thereabouts).



Once we got through the gates, we went inside. The area where all the 'Vettes were parked was along the inside promenade that runs around the periphery of the inside of the stadium.













Here's a panoramic shot of the field at Lucas Oil Stadium.



First opened to the public in 2008, the "House that Peyton Built" cost \$720 million to build. The stadium covers 1.8 million square feet and is about 2.5 times larger than the old RCA dome that it replaced. The seating capacity of the stadium is 67,000 for football and can be expanded to over 70,000 for basketball and other major events. There are 139 suites including 8 field suites just 10 feet from the field. The Quarterback Suite on the upper deck can accommodate 200 guests.

Here's the motley crew that made the trip from Dayton (well, Cindy's not motely). Then, below, you

can see how serious the judges are when working to certify a 'Vette for Bloomington Gold certification.





While we had a nice time at the event, I'm not sure that I'd return. Seems to be a shell of the event that it used to be according to those that have been going for years. I'd prefer to see it return to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. I think there would be much more to do there.


NCM BRICKS FOR LARRY AND RON

If you travel down to the *National Corvette Museum*, you would be overwhelmed as you approach the front entrance. There are hundreds – no, thousands of bricks, stones, benches and placards that have been placed in and around the Museum to recognize various Corvette Clubs, members and friends of the Museum.

Also, located on the walkway leading to the main entrance are memorial bricks. These bricks (of various sizes) are placed by Clubs and/or family members in remembrance of a Corvette enthusiast who is no longer with us.

Last year, two of our members passed. First, Larry Atchison and then shortly thereafter Ron Carbaugh both left us. It's hard to lose members, let alone that they were active in the Club and really good friends. As is customary, we ordered memorial bricks engraved with their names to honor their love of Corvette and as a permanent reminder that they will always be with us in spirit – and in stone!

Both bricks are located in Section 4C at the entrance to the Museum. The easiest way to locate the bricks would be to go inside, ask for **Becky Madison**, the Membership Services Coordinator. She can tell you where Section 4C is and, knowing Becky, probably walk you out and take you to both bricks. I'm sure that they are close together.






