


ARCA MENARDS SERIES RACING





BRITISH CAR DAY

or those of you that are not aware, one of the largest British Car Show events takes place every August at the Eastwood Metro Park. The 36th annual **British Car Day**, sponsored by Miami Valley Triumphs and the MG Car Club, is a gathering of all cars British and boy do they gather a crowd.



Several years ago, I had the pleasure of bumping in to Rick and Prema Ray at a Corvette event down in Bowling Green. We had participated in an organized drive over to Trooper Island. During lunch, Rick and I just happened to be standing in the buffet line and struck up a conversation. The next thing you know, a friendship is established and we have kept in touch and participated in several Corvette adventures since then. This is the second time Cindy and I have attended this show.

In addition to Rick and Prema owning a Corvette (2018 Torch Red Grand Sport), they also own several British cars. They belong to the West Virginia British Car Club out of Charleston, WVA. One of their cars is this 1980 (British Leyland) Triumph TR-8 that has won many awards including First in Class in

2019 at this very show.



We joined Rick and Prema at this year's event and spent a few hours walking around the show and looking at all of the cars. It was a learning experience for me. I know almost nothing about British cars,

while Rick is at the other end of the spectrum. I had a chance to meet many owners that Rick knows well and had a few laughs while marveling at everyone's knowledge of these cars.

On the next couple pages are images taken at the show. The final count from the show was 293 cars and motorcycles. The marques included Aston Martin, Austin Healey, Bentley, Jaguar, Lotus, MG, Spitfires, Sunbeam and Triumph. There was really something for everyone.

The guy that owned the black MG (above right) was 6' 5" and fit in it with no problems. He did admit, though, that it's really tough to see stop lights. You go when the car next to you goes – more or less.

The white car to the left is a 1961 Triumph TR-4 hardtop (VIN #288) from **Macy's Garage** (Mark & Tonda Macy) out of Tipp City. The car is owned by Tonda and has had a full concours restoration. It's a 100-point Best of Show winner. Macy's is recognized world-wide for their frame-off restoration of the TR series — that's what they specialize in. They employ 9 - 10 craftsmen and they have a long back-log of work in the shop at all times. In the picture to the left, you'll see just the side of a yellow TR. Mark told me that it is his daily driver — a "beater". Believe me, his idea of a beater and my idea of a beater is 180° degrees apart. The car was beautiful.

Here's a cute story. In the picture to the right, that is Debbie Ferratt standing to the side of her 1958 Triumph TR-3. In 1965, her Dad purchased the car for her as a high school graduation gift so she had reliable transportation when she entered college at Ball State in the fall. The car is pretty much in original condition (which is immaculate) and has only 23,000 miles on the odometer. When I kiddingly asked her if she knew comedian and fellow Ball State alum David Letterman, she replied that he actually was a classmate of hers and graduated in the same class. She really didn't know him all that well, and she joked about thinking of selling the car to him. At the end of the day, the car is a family heirloom and will never be sold.








There were only 59 cars in attendance and about 22 of those were Corvettes.


