
















HAIRPIN STRAIGHTENER

The Legend of Mr. Corvette



He's wrestled Tom Cruise, played (and beaten) a man in ping-pong for a date with his daughter and owned 21 sportscars. No, this is not a Dos Equis commercial pitch. Rather, this is the story of the top spokesperson/salsams in Chevrolet's campaign against the likes of Ferrari, Porsche, Lamborghini. He is Mike Furman, aka Mr. Corvette.

Today, he has sold over 4,500 of the cars in his career and, in 2001 became the No. 1 Corvette salesman in the world. But his story starts in New Jersey, when, as an accomplished competitive wrestler (how he happened to dislocate Crusie's shoulder) he found an even greater passion. "The first moment I knew I was a Corvette fan was spring of 1978 when all the car magazines did articles on the 1978 Corvette, which was the Indy 500 Pace Car for that year's race," says Furman. "I thought it was cooler than the other side of the pillow."





Here are this month's highlights from Corvetteblogger.

• The 2026 Corvette Build & Buy Configurator is now Live



We finally got the news that we have been waiting for from Chevrolet as the Build and Buy Configurator for the 2026 Corvette model year has finally come on-line. It features all the latest options and pricing details on the four current Corvette models offered: Stingray, ERay, Z06 and ZR1.

Chevrolet has already offered four order cycles for the 2026 model year, so this will be a huge help for buyers and sales reps alike who are trying to build out their Corvette prior to ordering.

Earlier this year, we did get pricing for the 2026 models, but now having them on the configurator makes it much easier to see the progression of pricing with each model. Each of these trim levels does include the mandatory \$1,995 shipping charge.

Below are the four current variations of the C8 Corvette and the base pricing for each trim level for both the coupe and hard top convertible (HTC).

When playing around with the configurator, I maxed the ZR1 out with the most important options that a buyer may select and came up with a final price of \$248,395, which included NCM R8C delivery. I could certainly have gone higher by adding car covers and other nickel and dime options, but I felt like this build is representative of a car that would be ordered by most.

You will note in the ZR1 table above, there is no 2LZ Trim Level for either the coupe or HTC. Also, as of this writing, pricing has not yet been established for the upcoming ZR1X that is due out very early next year.

ZR1X – The end of Corvette as we know it?

(Note: if you want to read the entire ZR1X article, head over to Corvetteblogger.com and pull up the week of Sept.18th. There's a lot more detail.)

By now, we all know the drill: the ZR1X is a marriage of the ZR1 and the ERay. Along with the 1,064 HP, 5.5L DOHC flat-plane crank twinturbo LT7 V8, team Corvette borrowed the ERay's electric motor and amped it up to 186 HP. The combined result is 1,250 HP and



almost 1,000 lb-ft of torque, making the ZR1X the fastest Corvette ever made. It streaks to 60 mph in under 2 seconds and tops out at 233 mph.

What will all this cost, and when will it go on sale? According to the latest GM media release: "The 2026 Corvette ZR1X will start with an MSRP of \$207,395 and top out with the new Quail Silver Limited Edition at \$241,395. The ZR1X will be available by the end of the year followed by the Quail Silver edition in 2026 and will be built at the Bowling Green Assembly Plant.

The Corvette Zora

We all hoped that this big Kahuna Corvette would be called the ZORA but, alas, it was not meant to be. According to *Road & Track*, A GM spokesperson set the record straight: "The ZR1X is an extension of the ZR1 family, so we believe ZR1X is a fitting name for the new variant. We knew Zora was broadly speculated by enthusiasts, but since it was future product, it was never something we weighed in on." The spokesperson continue on by saying, "what I can tell you is the team felt this Corvette was deserving of the ZR1 designation and it was an opportunity to show that even though ZR1 and ZR1X are different cars, they have strong familial resemblance and represent the ultimate Corvette performance."

The Real Story

Once we regained our composure after the ZR1X reveal, we realized there is more to this Corvette milestone than meets the eye. Not only is this the end of the road for the current mid-engine development team, but the C8 has only a few years left in its current guise. We also think this will be the end of a single-platform Corvette portfolio and the beginning of a multi-model sub-brand of Chevrolet.

With the C8, Corvette enjoyed its second-best sales year ever in 2023, with 53,785 units built. The 1979 model year retains number one status at 53,807 cars pushed out of the St. Louis factory. In the pantheon of Corvette engineers, these achievements dwarf all five previous Corvette head honchos, even Zora. That may raise some eyebrows, but we can all agree the C8 is the fastest, best-handling and best-built Corvette ever.

Enter the New Team

GM insiders filled all these roles, and you can bet the competition was fierce for these positions. Meet the new leaders of Corvette:

- Tony Roma Executive Chief Engineer for Global Corvette and Performance Cars. He worked on the C4 at the beginning of his career with GM and will be only the sixth leader of Corvette since 1953. He replaces Tadge Juechter and comes from Cadillac after a long stint with Blackwing and Celestiq EV development. He is also a skilled race car driver with a second-place finish in the 2023 24 Hours of Daytona.
- **Amy Masica** Chevrolet Marketing Director. A longtime GM employee with extensive in-house marketing experience.
- Austin Fisher Corvette Product Marketing Manager. A holdover from the old team. A sevenyear veteran of GM, he replaces Harlan Charles.
- **Devon Blue** Corvette Program Manager. A long-time GM employee, she has held this position since 2022.

• **Josh Holder** – Vehicle Corvette Chief Engineer. Another hold-over from the old guard and retains his previous title. He brings much of the IP from the old guard with him.

Rumor has it that the C8 will live to 2028, then the C9 will debut as C8.5, like the C6 was to the C5. Think re-skinned and refreshed with largely carryover mechanicals. This is a great way to amortize the development costs of the C8 mid-engine architecture by extending production to another generation.

National Corvette Museum celebrates its 20,000th R8C Museum Delivery

Picking up a new Corvette at the National Corvette Museum is a dream come true for many enthusiasts, including this writer.

In fact, when we say "many", we can actually quantify that number now as the NCM celebrated the delivery of its 20,000th Corvette on Tuesday as part of the popular R8C Museum Delivery program.

Launched in 1995 for the 1996 model year deliveries, the R8C Museum Delivery program has grown into one of the Museum's most beloved programs, attracting Corvette



enthusiasts from all 50 states and numerous countries around the world.

Many significant Corvettes have been delivered through the program, including the final C7, the first mid-engine Stingrays, many Z06's, ZR1's, Grand Sport, limited-edition Corvettes, significant numbered Corvettes from the assembly plant and celebrity and VIP deliveries.

Owners who order their cars through the R8C program pay \$1,495 and receive detailed vehicle orientation with the new owner, followed by a thorough delivery presentation of their new vehicle. The highlight for me was seeing my new 2020 Stingray roped off and displayed like a "VIP car" and then riding out of the Museum in my new 2020 Stingray as staff members and visitors and clapped with approval.

Participants also receive NCM membership, a personal special VIP guided tour of the NCM, a unique decal placed inside the driver's door jamb, a personalized interior dash plaque, a personalized wall plaque and an individual photo in front of the Museum.

- Modified Winner: Dave Hineman


All three of the winners took home very expensive hardware while Kathy left with the gorgeous crystal mug. Just look at their faces. The epitome of excitement.


