



Message from Pastor Chris

*Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice,
"This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!"*

~ Mark 9

Every once in a while, I like to geek out on Bible stories. Okay, it's more than once in a while. Maybe you've come to expect that from your pastor. Who knows? What I do know is that I have genuinely come to appreciate the season of Epiphany, that 46-day season of light and revelation between Christmas and Lent.

So often in the church year, Epiphany has seemed like a bit of a let-down, an afterthought following all the energy, celebration, and hullabaloo made of the birth of Jesus. But the truth is that we need Epiphany. We need to hear the stories presented to us and the church during this season. We need them not only for how they reveal the nature of the Word made flesh in Jesus, but also for the way in which they speak the truth about our own lives of faith.

Because I'm excited, I want you to be excited, too! After all, in the weeks between the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan to that mystical mountain top experience in the Transfiguration lies a treasure trove of lessons, stories, and ponderings that feed the faith. Join me now as I take Epiphany week by week in what we might look forward to experiencing in the story of salvation before us this season!

January 10, The Baptism of Our Lord: We hear again the story of John's baptism of Jesus in the Jordan (Mark 1:4-11). In a glorious encounter with the Spirit, Jesus hears a voice from heaven, *"You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."* On this day, we remember our own baptism and the significance that Jesus is baptized with us!

January 17, Epiphany 2: The call story of Samuel is part of our readings this week. His mentor, the priest, Eli, helps Samuel to interpret the voice of the Lord who calls out to him, *"Samuel! Samuel!"* When Samuel finally positions himself to listen, God reveals new plans. If only we were always capable of humbling ourselves before the Lord in order to listen to the new things he is about to do through us and for us. (1 Samuel 3:1-10)

January 24, Epiphany 3: If you want to read an entire book of the Bible in one sitting, I invite you to turn to Jonah. This week, we read the entire third chapter! Jonah has just been spat up on the shore from a fish and is about to approach the city of Nineveh. While there, he prophesies the message God had commanded him to speak. Eventually Nineveh changes its ways and witnesses God change God's own mind about the calamity that he was threatening to bring upon those wretched people. I wonder, does God really change God's own mind?

January 31, Epiphany 4: This week, Paul is concerned about food sacrificed to idols. I will explain this one in our weekly Bible Study on Wednesday. What really fascinates me is Mark's story about Jesus teaching in the synagogue. There, a man with an unclean spirit speaks and actually confesses who Jesus is as the *"Holy One of God."* Imagine that! Scribes and disciples remain perplexed about Jesus, yet an unclean spirit knows exactly who Jesus is in the cosmic order. Go figure. (Mark 1:21-28)

February 7, Epiphany 5: It's Super Bowl Sunday. There's no better way to prepare for gameday than to consider the story of Jesus healing Simon's mother-in-law as well as several others with illness and demons. Famished from a full day of ministry, Jesus goes off to pray. But he cannot seem to escape the need to stay



focused on mission. Even in the middle of the night, Jesus travels on to neighboring towns throughout Galilee to proclaim the Good News. I just hope Patrick Mahomes has that kind of energy left in the fourth quarter as he leads the Chiefs to victory!

February 14, Transfiguration Sunday: I love this story. Imagine being Peter, James, or John experiencing this incredible scene where Jesus not only turns dazzling white, but Elijah and Moses come out of nowhere to talk to him. If Moses epitomized the prophets of the old, Jesus represents something new. Echoing the voice of the divine in baptism, the cloud proclaims, *"This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!"* Again, we might ask ourselves how well we are ready to listen to him when we come down from the mountain and enter the valleys of life below.

I can't wait to encounter these stories and more once again! I hope you will join us in worship!

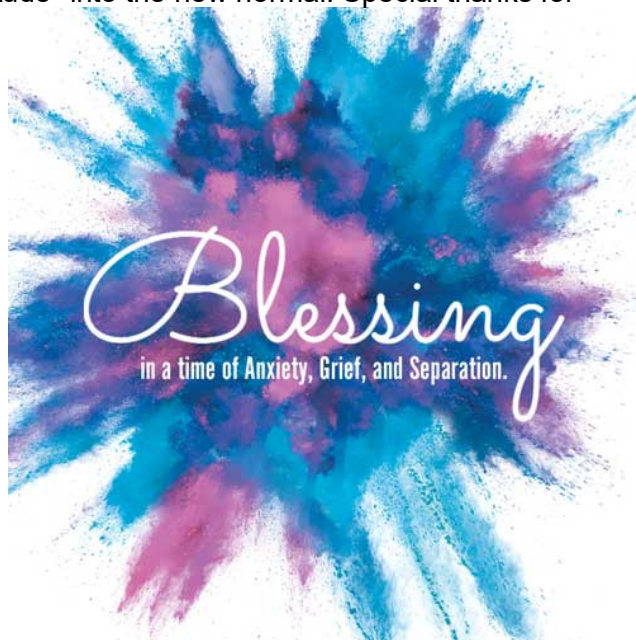

Message from Pastor Glenn

As 2021 is unveiled there are two questions that I have been tasked with providing leadership for congregational teams seeking answers that will help us move forward as a congregation. The first question is, "How do we reopen for

in-person worship now that vaccines have become available?"

The second question is one that strikes close to my own heart. It can best be expressed in two separate, but intimately related, questions. First, how can we as a congregation better support and care for persons and families who have been afflicted and affected by addiction? Second, how can we as a congregation work to help prevent addiction from taking root in our families and communities?

The Covid Task Force, which was established back in March 2020, will be addressing the first question. We are meeting. Please address your thoughts and questions regarding reopening the church for in person worship to me either via email or regular mail and I will forward them to the rest of the team. This will help inform our discussions and recommendations to the Church Council.

The Faith Partners team, which has been on hiatus because of the Covid pandemic, will be involved in team training beginning Thursday, January 7 and continuing the next two Thursdays, from 7 to 9^{PM}. Again contact me if you are interested in attending any or all of the sessions.
