Most importantly, I invite you to consider all the wonders God has done for Morning Star's ministry, its past, present and future. Through you, your faith, and your support, we have reached an important juncture in the history of our ministry together. Now, I believe we are being led with urgency to follow God's lead as our ministry encounters a new era, one of leveraging our impressive building for intentional outreach into our local community.

In the next few days, we will be inviting your participation in one of several small group meetings to pray about and discuss many of the design elements and concepts presented to the congregation this past November. Our hope is that through a more intentional and focused conversation in a small group setting, you will each have an opportunity to ask questions, share ideas, and concerns relative to our work thus far.

Morning Star is your church home. Thus, we are aiming to achieve near 100% participation of our active membership in these small group settings. Most of these meetings will take place at Morning Star and last no longer than 90 minutes in length. Karen Hawkins, I, and other members of the Remodel Committee will be present and lead these important conversations. Sign-up sheets will be available in the Gathering Space, but you may call the Church Office to reserve your spot as well.

These are exciting times for our ministry! I know that God is leading us through your support to share in all the wonders of what the Holy Spirit is up to at Morning Star Lutheran Church!

# INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

It's that time of year again! Winter weather can sometimes become a burden. To keep our congregation safe when the snow flies, our Congregation Council has recently revisited Morning Star's weather cancellation policy.

Remaining in effect will be our weekday cancellation policy. When local school districts e.g., OPS and Westside, cancel school due to weather related incidents, all scheduled congregational activities will also be cancelled. Our Morning Star Preschool will continue its cancellation policy on a case-by-case basis.

On weekends, when inclement weather affects the potential safety of worshippers traveling to and from church for worship, Pastor Chris and our Executive Committee will determine cancellation on an individual basis. Factors that affect these decisions include forecasted precipitation, hazardous road reports, extreme wind chill, and/or the ability to clear our parking lots and sidewalks of ice and snow for the safety of our worshippers and staff.

We will aim to communicate any worship cancellation at least two hours in advance by "robo" call to our membership as well with WOWT (Channel 6 online/television).


### Lean on Me Saturday & Sunday ~ January 14-15 First Lutheran Church in Kearney
