



# **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHRIS**

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us."

Luke 2:15

In the story of Christmas, the ordinariness of the world is confronted by the extraordinary nature of God's power. Shepherds meet angels. A small town in Judea gets put on the cosmic map of God's creation. Word is made flesh. Human fear is transformed by divine presence.

Here, in this juxtaposition of ordinary and divine, we retell the story of Christ's birth. It is a story that speaks a promise. That in the monotony of daily life there endures the powerful presence of a God who chooses, out of great love, to reveal himself to us. It's the story about a God who makes sacred the things that seem like nothing. It's a God who can turn a backwater town into the world's last best hope. It's a God who, in the twinkle of an infant's eyes, can glimmer light into the darkness.

The ironic truth is that God unveils his power in things which seem humble. Think about it. If the power of the incarnation was revealed in God's ability to move mountains, perform tricks, or rebuke nature in some awesome way, it would not make sense. We wouldn't relate. Instead, God reveals his power through the ordinary, in the least of these, to make much of the very little. Through such ordinary stuff, Christ becomes magnified for all to see. For all to believe!

Let's face it. Christmas has become a time of great expectation. The decorations get brighter. The gatherings get bigger. Commercial ventures capitalize on the synthetic joy of conspicuous consumption. Much of this is fun. But does it tell the story of two young weary travelers who had no place in the inn?

Do our seasonal celebrations, with all their merry and might, convey the story of a Christ child wailing in the darkness? Will our hustle and bustle help us to remember the hopeful cries that pierce the still of a Bethlehem night? Will our stressful calendars allow us to hear the cries of promise from a Calvary cross?

This season, amid our wanting and waiting and for the highly anticipated and expected, perhaps we should remember to also make some room for the ordinary. After all, I'm reminded in the Christmas story that in the ordinary we encounter the unexpected. It's in the familiar where we become the most surprised. Even in the dimmest, loneliest places of our lives, God's light can shine brilliantly. Remember, it's in these places that God chooses to encounter us.

The prophet Isaiah's words seem so poignant this time of year. He says, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined!"

My prayer is that whatever place or station you find yourself at this season, you will experience the great light of God's promise that comes into our world in the baby Jesus. May the light that glimmers from the Christ child brighten your days and give you hope for all your tomorrows.
