## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### ***How Does One Live Their Baptism?***

Martin Luther taught we are to daily renew our baptism. We rise and say, "I am baptized in Christ." It's as simple as that!

Whether we are young or old, this daily renewal of baptism leads to a practicing of faith and deepening of discipleship. We do not have to discern how to follow Christ alone or without assistance. Instead God sends the Holy Spirit to call, gather, and sustain us in God's grace, connecting us to brothers and sisters in Christ who also are living out their baptism.

"Baptism inaugurates a life of discipleship in the death and resurrection of Christ. Baptism conforms us to the death and resurrection of Christ precisely so that we repent and receive forgiveness, love our neighbors, suffer for the sake of the Gospel, and witness to Christ." (*The Use of the Means of Grace: A Statement on the Practice of Word and Sacrament*, principle 14, page 20)

### ***How Can We Renew Our Baptism Each Day?***

We can renew our baptism in a variety of ways. Here are a few possibilities:

- Each morning, rise and say Martin Luther's words, "I am baptized into Christ."
- Each day, pray for the Holy Spirit to be your guide and keep you near Jesus Christ.
- Each night, place water on your forehead, make the sign of the Cross, remember you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the Cross of Christ forever.
- Combine all of the above.

### ***How Do We Renew our Baptism at Church?***

Here is the question asked by the presiding minister during the Affirmation of Baptism.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

- ...to live among God's faithful people,
- ...to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- ...to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- ...to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- ...to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

**RESPONSE: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.**

This five-fold question then becomes a five-fold guide for living your baptism as a disciple of Christ and become gifts to discover as you walk in the newness of life in Christ.

### ***What Are the Five Gifts of Discipleship?***

At the Affirmation of Baptism, we are asked to continue in the covenant God made with us in Holy Baptism. This

process of continuing in the covenant of baptism includes five parts-not requirements, but rather gifts from God to help shape our new life in Christ.

**Inner Gifts:**

- LIVE** among God's faithful people
- HEAR** the word of God and **SHARE** in the Lord's Supper

**Outer Gifts:**

- PROCLAIM** the Good News of God in Christ through word and deed
- SERVE** all people, following the example of Jesus
- STRIVE** for justice and peace in all the earth

**How Are These Gifts to be Used?**

Each of the five gifts of discipleship has the potential to deepen our understanding of what it means to follow Jesus. The Holy Spirit provides these gifts of discipleship with each of the five gifts flowing and overlapping with the others.

On a daily basis, we are invited to live, hear, share, proclaim, serve, and strive-in the name of Christ. God guides and shapes us in the living of our baptism in the newness of life in Christ as we practice our faith each day.

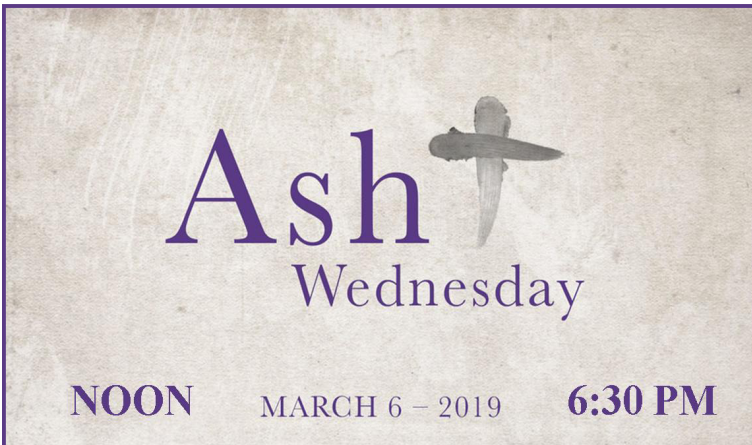
These five gifts help us to practice our faith and serve as a reminder of who has claimed us in Baptism. If we do not practice faith, it is easy to get confused, complacent, chase other dreams, lose focus, and wander away from God's calling-not reflecting our new life in Christ and the love of God. It is God's work, but our hands as we are sent out into the world to be a visible witness to the love of Christ.

This Lent, I invite us to think more deeply about our baptism. This will include worship, faith formation, and fellowship, all of which will be centered around each of the five gifts of discipleship. My hope is that we can journey together in strengthening our relationship with each other and with the one who claims us unconditionally in Water and Word!

## Green Envelope

Morning Star Lutheran Church is part of a 15-church coalition working together to build a home with Habitat for Humanity. Our Green Envelope offering for March goes to purchase the materials needed to make the home ownership dream a reality for a family in 2019.



Nearly three-fourths of Omaha families earning less than \$35k a year are paying more than they can afford for housing, not leaving enough for other necessities like good nutrition, health care, transportation, savings or education. Habitat Omaha works with families to help them acquire the access, skills and financial tools necessary for them to be successful homeowners.

The Faith Build start date is tentatively set for July 27<sup>th</sup> with the new house going in at 3019 Pratt St. We will have opportunities to offer hands-on help throughout the summer as well as at our God's Work, Our Hands Sunday in September. More info to come!

Our music staff selects music that is meaningful for each week's worship service, reverential or inspiring, interesting to sing or play, and the appropriate level for the choir of the week.

### Adult Choir

If you can carry a tune and know a little bit about reading music, the choir wants you! Choir practices are held Sundays at 8:00<sup>AM</sup> to run through the anthem and again at 9:30<sup>AM</sup> for future services. Once a month there is an evening rehearsal (usually the first Thursday at 7:30<sup>PM</sup>) to get an introduction to the upcoming anthems. CDs are provided to practice with at home. It is helpful if you can commit to two Sundays per month. Email reminders about rehearsals are sent out. The adult choir sings almost every week at the 8:30<sup>AM</sup> worship service.

The handbell choir requires a month long commitment as they play just once a month, usually the last Sunday at the 8:30<sup>AM</sup> worship service. If you can count and swing a bell, we would love for you to join us! You do NOT need to know how to read music. We teach as we go. Bell choir rehearsals are Thursday evenings at 6:30<sup>PM</sup> and we will send out email reminders.

### Worship Team & Special Music

Singers for the 10:30<sup>AM</sup> worship service are also needed. Come rehearse with us on Wednesdays at 4:30<sup>PM</sup>. We always welcome special singers and instrumentalists at all services.
