# Message from Pastor Chris

Dear Morning Star Lutheran Church Families and Friends,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. As we enter the solemn season of Lent, we once again turn our gaze toward the Cross. Often however, I find myself, during the Lenten journey, tempted to rush through it all, foregoing the pain of the Cross in order to get to the glory and celebration of Easter.

Truth be told, as one of the most impatient people I know, it would be enticing to just 'skip ahead' in order to get to the good stuff. Maybe I've been influenced too much these days by the cultural expectation of instant gratification. Or, perhaps, I just want to avoid the pain. After all, who among us is entirely comfortable with muddling through such a penitential season in order to be confronted by sin, mortality, and the agonizing pain of Jesus' Cross?

The problem is we need Lent. As Christians, we need to journey through these forty-days where we are forced to look in the mirror of our lives. We need to see ourselves as humans, who despite our so called 'free-will,' are completely reliant on God for eternal salvation. We need to find the courage to see ourselves as completely and totally dependent on the grace of a God who loves us no matter what, who would die for our sin.

The reason we need Lent is because we need to absorb the reality of God's eternal promises into our very bones and the very depths of our humanity, both individually and collectively. That despite our own fallibility as human beings, we are still, without condition, rescued by a Redeemer, who while suffering on a Cross, would even dare extend his forgiveness, with its invitation to paradise, to a crook who hung nearby.

Remember, even though God's grace is freely given, no one ever said it was cheap. During this season of Lent, I am reminded that we are so cherished by God that he spares no expense in activating the eternal promises through his death and resurrection.

In the meantime, I invite you to join me to continue on this journey. My hope is that you not only find gratification and blessing along the way, but I hope you rediscover the discomfort of facing a cosmic reality of exactly why we and this world urgently need the Cross.
