







### So, then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God

#### Ephesians 2:19

Family Systems guru, Rev. Peter Steinke, shares an important story from Robert Persig's *Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance*. Interestingly enough, Persig describes how monkeys are captured from the wild in India.

Imagine a coconut shell hollowed out and chained to a stake. The shell is filled with rice. It's a delightful delicatessen for the monkey. The hole is whittled out just wide enough for the monkey's hand to enter through. Yet it's far too narrow for a monkey fist full of rice to exit.

As the illustration goes, the primate's hand is trapped by its own stubbornness and rigidity. There is no possibility of compromise for the hungry hand. Without sacrifice, he wants it all! As the author notes, the monkey cannot think clearly enough to understand that *"freedom without rice is more valuable than capture with it."* He just wants the darn prize!

I invite you to think about that for a moment. What are the things in your life that have become so vital to your sense of value, your ego, or your sense of self-worth in this material world that you'd risk becoming stuck in the hole of a coconut? What fistful of loot appears more valuable than an empty fist of freedom without it?

I wonder about the age we live in. Yes, Covid-19 is enough! Yet, we'd be incredibly naïve to suggest that this year will only be remembered because of a virus. Now, as we enter the height of another contentious election cycle, I can't help but notice how political divisiveness is plaguing, indeed crippling our relationships with one another. We are all aware of the cultural pressures of being on the correct side political certainty and truth! Right or Left. Conservative or Progressive. Blue or Red. We're all aware of the political divides. Yes, they even exist in the pews of a wonderful congregation like Morning Star Lutheran Church!

The truth is that rigid divisiveness has become an overwhelming and ubiquitous dynamic everywhere we turn. In this era when we need to be "right," (or perhaps to prove others "wrong"), accusatory fingers have been pointed towards everything from Congress, to City Hall, to the talking heads on cable television. Even friends on social media have had become alienated. It's hideous. It concerns me. After all, the need to be "right" or to "win," has become like the intoxicating and urgent pursuit of a foolish monkey who simply cannot grab enough of himself. He will do whatever it takes to reach his open hand deeply into the coconut of a personal justification of self-worth. But in his own rigidness, he will never be able to let go!

Regardless of political posture however, the hungry monkey won't heed the warnings. He definitely won't listen to another point of view. He doesn't care if the other might have a valuable point to share. The freedom to be in relationship with another who might be different from him is worth far less than his hunger power grab to be right. In such primal need (or greed) for victory of a glorious loot of self-righteousness, he forgets about what is most important to his life...a loving relationship with God and with his neighbor. He's turned in upon himself. This is the essence of sin.

As we approach an important election cycle, I am reminded that Jesus could care less about how you are registered to vote. He doesn't care if you consider yourself a Progressive or a Conservative. He doesn't care if you live in a blue or red area. None of that matters when we confess our faith together and remember ourselves as citizens of the Saints living in the gracious Kingdom of God.

Instead, what our Savior does care about is how you convey love for your neighbor. Jesus cares how you are oriented to **Live** among God's faithful people; **Hear** the Word of God and share in the Lord's Supper; **Proclaim** the

good news of God in Christ through word and deed; Serve all people following the example of Jesus; and Strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

As Baptized children of God, we are called to be better than the monkeys chasing the futile coconuts of self-aggrandizement in this life. We are called to be disciples regardless of political persuasion. We are called to listen to others. We are called to see value in those whom we disagree with. We are called to be enriched by our differences, strengthened by our diversity, and justified by God's gracious love for all of Creation regardless of skin color or political creed. This is what it means to be a citizen with the Saints! It's what it means to be a disciple.

I don't know what the outcomes of our next election cycle will be on November 3. Neither do you. But what I do know is that Jesus died on the Cross for you. He died for your neighbor. He died for this wonderful world that is full of its wonderful diversity and differences and even its brokenness and sin.

So regardless of how you plan on marking your next election ballot, please know that God will continue to care immensely for how we care for one another in this world and in our community of faith. I pray that our Lord will continue to give us the wisdom to get over ourselves so that we might get on with sharing the fruits of His kingdom with the world. This is the coconut worth striving for.


