



### FROM PASTOR CHRIS

Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries ~ I Corinthians 4:1

"The most beautiful thing we can experience is the mysterious."

~ Albert Einstein

I have a good friend with a Ph.D. in Physics. He is trained to examine his world through the lens of the scientific method. His reality is based on what can be observed, tested, and analyzed. If you want a chuckle, just tell him that some claim *Bigfoot* is real. He'll scoff. Quick he is to dismiss its non-reality based on the fact he has never personally witnessed such a creature. There are no peer tested studies. Neither has anything ever been published in a scientific journal. Fair enough. Interesting to me, he is also a person of faith.

Soon, we will gather to proclaim our faith in the mysterious. With gusto we will follow the pastor's bold proclamation, "Christ is Risen," with our own "He is Risen Indeed!" Our words will echo through the assembly with assurance. It's powerful. It's the assertion upon which our entire faith rests. Without those words, there is no Easter. There is no church. There is no guarantee of new life. But remember, the Resurrection is not peer reviewed nor published in some scientific journal. It has never been proven nor analyzed. For all intents and purposes, the Risen Christ is still quite...mysterious.

Thomas is a disciple characterized by a pejorative. Through the years, he's been ridiculed as a *doubter*. He was skeptical because of his absence. He wasn't with his colleagues upon that first occasion of the Resurrected Jesus mysteriously appearing before his friends. Thomas had to see to believe. He needed proof. He needed to gaze his own eyes upon the radical new thing which God had done in the Resurrected body of Jesus, this teacher who died but had risen to life on the third day. Eventually, he did see Jesus and believed. I appreciate Thomas.

Thomas reminds me that not all activity of God fits neatly into the framework or paradigms of human understanding. Think about scripture. Moses encountered a burning bush unconsumed by flame. Manna was provided to starving Israelites in the wilderness. All who gazed upon a serpent on a pole were healed. Jesus turned water into wine. A storm on the Sea of Galilee was tamed by his outstretched arm. The blind and lame were healed with nothing more than mere words. Do we need to understand how all this happened to believe? No!

The Resurrection of Our Lord reminds me that we are indeed 'stewards of God's mysteries' as St. Paul so lovingly tells the faithful in Corinth. Not everything God does is explainable or deserves answers. I would like to know how Jesus walks through a wall, but that is for another day. The truth is, much of what God does is God's business, not ours. God does what God wants, how God wants. If God's great mysteries were revealed, would we even begin to understand how the divine works anyway?

A story is told about Thomas Jefferson who once tried to bring the Bible 'up to date' according to the contemporary understanding of his day and age. Imagine Jefferson with scissors and glue clipping the Word of God. Only those passages of scripture that conformed to his limited understanding of the world would remain. Jefferson's Bible became the teachings of Jesus and I Corinthians 13. God had been reduced to conform to Jefferson's myopic worldview.

Indeed, the Resurrection challenges human limits of understanding. There is no framework for us to possibly comprehend it fully, at least in this life. It stretches the boundaries of what we consider possible in the universe. Easter is neither rational nor reasonable in its proclamation from the angel to the first witnesses of the empty tomb. The reality of Risen Lord is incomprehensible upon entering a locked room to breathe on his friends and declare his Peace. There is nothing sensible about God doing God's new thing in sending his only son to die for human sin. It might be mysterious. But it's also quite glorious. That's the point.

This Easter, I am not suggesting we check our brains at the door. Rather, I am inviting us to embrace the beautiful mystery of God's providence for our lives and our world. That there is something sacred in suspending our need to control or understand or to fully master God from a finite point of view. After all, there are such things as miracles. And the miracle of the Resurrection is gloriously unified with another miracle, the redemptive promises of Christ. We too will live again. It is not something for us to fully comprehend. It is something to finally trust. Thomas did.

Blessed Easter to you and yours as we celebrate the mystery of the Risen Lord and the promise that we are eternally his.
