Dear Morning Star Lutheran Church:

When Jesus prepared to leave his disciples, he didn't leave them aimless. He sent them into the world. Scripture is ripe with stories of the apostles being sent out to tell the story of the Risen Lord. This was the basic modus operandi of the early church, to spread the message of salvation and introduce the world to a loving and gracious God. This was its mission. This was its purpose.

A wise mentor once taught me that a church without a mission is dead. Like a sailor without a destination or no clear idea where to go, the sailboat meanders adrift. It's dead in the water. The sailor requires a destination or a goal to adjust the sails relative to the winds of the sea. Morning Star Lutheran Church is no different.

As we enter the New Year, I am reminded that we too are like sailors embarked on an urgent mission to share the Gospel. Yet we must be certain of our destination. As such, it is time to examine the navigational charts and adjust our sails accordingly. To accurately plot the course, we must all participate in checking the winds and listen to the Holy Spirit.

The very first part of this course-plotting activity is for each Morning Star member to complete a congregational health inventory. This document titled, *“Strength at the Center: A Congregational Health Inventory,”* is a research tool developed by Senior Consultant, Roy M. Oswald, of the Alban Institute. I invite you and any Morning Star voting members of your household to follow the instructions on page one of this document. This may also be completed online by activating the QR code below.

Please take time to provide a candid assessment of each area of our ministry together. There are no right or wrong answers. In many cases, you may not know how to rate a specific item in the inventory. In those situations, please leave the response blank. For your convenience, these may be completed and submitted online. Hard copies of the completed inventories (sent to each home) may be returned to the church office or the Lobby area when you arrive for worship. If you require an additional hard copy of the inventory, please contact the church office. The summation of these completed inventories (due February 1) is the very first step in enabling our *“At The Crossroads Strategic Planning Team”* to construct the next steps of our planning process.

In case you are wondering, strategic planning processes do not provide quick fixes or easy answers. In many ways, the church of today is not the same church many of us grew up in, let alone five years ago! The world has changed. Family patterns are different. New challenges in the culture have arisen. But we trust that God is always doing a new thing. As such, I pray that this process be one of deep discernment and prayer on the part of our congregation. We have no idea what tomorrow will bring, except to know that God has a preferred and promised future for Morning Star Lutheran Church.

Thank you for taking time to engage this first step of our strategic planning process. Your generosity of time, prayers, and thoughtfulness are treasured. In the meantime, please take note of the following key events you are invited to participate in below. Remember, the greater our congregation's participation, the more effective this planning process will be. So, not only do I invite you to mark these upcoming events on your calendar, but I encourage you to see yourself as a fellow sailor assisting us in the navigation of opportune seas of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the world.



January Green Envelope

Each day, our neighbors struggle to find the nutritious food they need. Food insecurity is a real problem in our region, and its effects are devastating. Founded in 1981 and headquartered in Omaha, Food Bank for the Heartland has a vital focus: to provide food to children, families, seniors, and veterans facing hunger in Nebraska and western Iowa, to ultimately eliminate hunger, and to serve our neighbors with respect, integrity and urgency. The Food Bank serves 93 counties—77 in Nebraska and 16 in western Iowa. They see the fight against hunger as an ongoing, collaborative effort working with individuals, organizations, food manufacturers, grocery stores, the USDA and Feeding America to procure food. They purchase food to supplement donations. Volunteers help keep the 76,000 square-foot warehouse running quickly and efficiently. Ninety-six cents of every dollar they receive, goes back into the community. Your Green Envelope offering will go to the Food Bank for the Heartland.




