

2022 Camping Information

Moor & Coast are running a temporary campsite in August at Whitby Rugby Club.

Friday 19th August to Saturday 27th August **2022**.

NO DOGS ALLOWED

General Information:

- Toilets and showers are available.
- The campsite will be at Whitby Rugby Club from 12 noon on Friday 19th August till close at 2pm on Saturday 27th August **2022**.
- There are a limited number of pitches available to visitors who wish to visit the town.
- The site was used for the past few years during Whitby Spring Sessions and has proved popular with those camping on it. The ground is flat; sort-grassed and has easy access. It has indoor toilets, hot showers, and fresh water. It does not have electric hook-ups.
- Staff are not responsible for personal property or possessions.
- The campsite is within walking distance from the town centre.
- Children are not allowed to camp without adult supervision.
- Wet weather conditions can cause a problem, but the rugby club staff will make every effort to accommodate our campers. Please be advised by them if the weather is wet.
- Awnings are allowed at no extra cost.

Fire Regulations:

Fire regulations must be followed. No open fires at any time. BBQs must be off the ground and are of a recognised design. Open flames must not be used in tents or fabric awnings.

Vehicles:

You may park your vehicle next to your tent or caravan, but please leave a gap of TEN FEET (3 metres) between your pitch (and car) and the next. There is plenty of room on the site. Please pitch your tent/camper/caravan in line with the next. It is much easier for the stewards to keep watch on lines of pitches rather than encampments.

It may be easier for you to leave your car on-site and walk into town. Parking in Whitby is limited, and car parks can prove expensive. Vehicle movement at night must be restricted.

Pitches:

On departure pitches must be vacated by 11am on the day of your leaving. You may be able to park on-site after packing your things away, but please tell the stewards of your intentions before 11am.

Noise:

Please keep noise down to a minimum when moving around the site especially after dark and returning late at night. We would like to keep the site friendly but quiet.

Camp-site Stewards:

Stewards are there to help with advice about the site. They will keep watch over the site but are not security personnel. They, the Rugby Club, or Moor & Coast Festival are not responsible for the loss or damage of any item brought onto the campsite or any personal injury suffered.
