Mi'gmawei Mawiomi Business Corporation Scholarship and Bursary Program 2025

Guidelines & Application

The Mi'gmawei Mawiomi Business Corporation (MMBC) is proud to present a scholarship and bursary program to support students who are achieving academic success and are financially in need of assistance. The MMBC acknowledges the importance of education for our First Nation members and, therefore, has developed a program to help students achieve their academic goals.

Below are the program awards available this year:

- Limited 10 Scholarship awards of \$2,000 per student
 - Limited 5 Bursary awards of \$1,000 per student

NOTE: The Scholarship and Bursary Program is only available to registered band members from the communities of Gesgapegiag, Gespeg, and Listuguj. Additionally, the program has transitioned to a competitive process, resulting in a limited number of scholarships and bursary awards. This means that the scoring process has also changed, so please submit your best application. Lastly, we've changed how the awards will be disbursed if you are selected; see information below.

Application Deadline:

- Deadline to submit your application: August 15, 2025 at 12:00 p.m. (noon) EST.
- The application must include all supporting documents in a single submission. Please do not send multiple files. Only submit when you have everything ready.
- Submit documents that are clear and easy to read. Please scan your documents into a digital format, if possible. Any blurry or unreadable documents may delay or deny your application.
- Download, fill, and submit your application by email to info@mmcorporation.ca.
- Late or incomplete applications may not be accepted.

Eligibility:

- The <u>Scholarship Program</u> is meant for students who are in good academic standing and achieving a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 (B average) or higher and demonstrate a financial need.
- The **Bursary Program** is designed for vocational students and those who demonstrate financial need.
- Scholarship and bursary applications are open to all First Nation students who are members of one of the three Mi'gmag communities: Gesgapegiag, Gespeg, or Listuqui.
- Eligible applicants that will be considered are:
 - students who graduated from high school and are furthering their education; or
 - students who will be attending or continuing vocational training; or
 - students who will be attending or continuing college education; or
 - students who will be attending or continuing university education.
- College and University students must be attending an approved educational institution on a full-time basis. Please contact us if you are unsure if your institution is approved.
- Vocational students are eligible to apply for the bursary program.
- Each applicant may only apply for **one** fund: either a scholarship or a bursary.
- MMBC employees and board/committee members are not eligible for this program.

Award Disbursement

If you are selected for an award, your award will be divided into two payments. Half will be provided shortly after being selected for an award, and the remaining half will be provided before December 31st. To receive the second half of your award, you must provide proof of completion for the previous semester and proof of registration for the following semester. If your program ends before December 31, please notify us so we can modify your award disbursement accordingly.

How Applications Are Scored

This appendix outlines the scoring criteria used by the MMBC Selection Committee to evaluate applications for the Scholarship and Bursary Program. Applicants are encouraged to review these criteria carefully when preparing their submissions. Each application is scored out of 100 points.

Scholarship Applicants - Scoring Breakdown (Total: 100 points)

GPA: Up to 25 points – Based on academic achievement from your latest transcripts. A GPA of 3.0 (B average) is the minimum.

Essay: Up to 40 points – Evaluated for addressing the essay question, clarity of goals, originality, structure, community impact, grammar, and purpose.

Financial Need: Up to 15 points – Determined by your submitted budget, income, and stated financial circumstances.

Alignment of Career Goals with Funding Need: Up to 10 points – Determines how well your funding request aligns with your education and future goals.

Application Completeness: Up to 10 points - All documents submitted, accurate, clear, and on time.

Bursary Applicants - Scoring Breakdown (Total: 100 points)

Essay: Up to 40 points – Evaluated for addressing the essay question, clarity of goals, originality, structure, community impact, grammar, and purpose.

Financial Need: Up to 30 points – Determined on your submitted budget, income, and explanation of financial circumstances.

Career Relevance (Vocational Path): Up to 10 points – How well your chosen training aligns with your future career.

Alignment of Career Goals with Funding Need: Up to 10 points – Determines how well your funding request supports your educational and career objectives.

Application Completeness: Up to 10 points - All documents submitted, accurate, clear, and on time.
