

### The World of Immortal Women +

The Immortal world exists in another dimension accessible only through a dimensional portal disguised as a giant Tapestry. The tapestry hangs in the Bastille - a castle-like structure - home to the Guild of Immortal Women. As each Immortal is allowed one mortal life to be famous, they must spend the rest of eternity keeping a low profile; the Tapestry provides a place to lay low and hide from prying cameras and video recordings.

The Immortal Women are charged with maintaining the portal (Tapestry) to keep the link between this world and the Immortal world intact. If this link were to crumble, the Immortals would be trapped.

When Abbey loses her memory and is sent to an institution, the Weave of the Tapestry starts to fray. The Aunts must help Abbey remember who she is so she can assist with the Tapestry repair before it's too late.

## Cast of Characters



### Abbey

The lead heroine of GUILD, Abbey has amnesia and has forgotten she is an immortal. The story revolves around the "aunts" (other immortal women) helping her remember who she is. Abbey's mental issues began when she became famous for a second time - a taboo to the Immortals. (Her first life was Joan of Arc; her second was Amelia Earhart.)



### Detective Mathers

Called in to investigate a dead body found on the Women's property, he finds himself attracted to Abbey and curious as to the cause of her amnesia. As he digs deeper into the homicide, he discovers the women of the Bastille are hiding something.



#### Aunt Ruth

The oldest of the Immortals. Ever since her life in pre-Christian times, she has become quite fond of baking and needlepoint.

And killing wayward Immortal men who get too pushy.

## Cast of Characters



### Aunt Boo

Otherwise known as Queen Boudica, Aunt Boo is the slightly paranoid, always angry protector of the Immortal Women. With a fondness for swords and nudity, she is mostly known for her violent over-reactions to people who trespass on the grounds of the Bastille.



### Lynn

Overworked, underpaid and perpetually single, Lynn is the social worker tending to Abbey. During routine case management services, she gets a hunch that Abbey isn't crazy or schizophrenic.

But what is she?



#### Aunt Eleanor

Matriarch of the Immortals.
She loves Abbey like a daughter, but her priority is to the well being of the Guild. So when Abbey brings Detective Mathers into the fold, she's faced with the decision of what to do with him.
