#### Literacy Focus:

Literacy in Primary 1 is taught in an active learning environment.

#### First 6 weeks

Phonological Awareness (this includes the teaching of rhyme, alliteration, syllabification and word awareness)

#### Phonics

2 individual sounds per week will be taught (not in alphabetical order)

#### Reading

This consists of fluency, blending sounds, decoding and comprehension.

Reading will begin around September/October.

#### Spelling

There will be 3 common words per week.

Many of the common words can not be sounded out and therefore require a lot of reinforcement to help remember them.

#### <u>Writing</u>

This will focus on the formation of letters [starting point is essential] and constructing words into simple sentences with capital letters and full stops.

### Numeracy Focus:

The teaching of Numeracy in Primary 1 is delivered in an active learning environment.

The children will be taught Number work on a Monday-Thursday

Shape, Time, Measure and Data Handling will be taught on a Friday.

The Numeracy curriculum will cover the topics:

- > Formation of numbers
- > Counting
- > Addition and Subtraction
- > Fractions
- > Money
- > Shape, Time, Measure and Data Handling

Throughout Primary 1 all areas of the curriculum will be covered either as discrete subjects or as part of an interdisciplinary topic. As well as the core subjects of Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing, the curriculum areas include Social Studies, Sciences, Expressive Arts, Technologies and R.M.E.

This term we will start with 'People who help us in school'.

Our science topic will start with 'Day and Night' and 'Seasons'.

Primary 1 have the role of leading the Nativity in December. They will have a busy few months in the lead up practising lines and songs. More information will follow.

### Learning through play:

We are very fortunate to have access to a large open area where the children can explore play opportunities.

Through play, the children learn a variety of valuable skills.

#### Children learn:

- how to negotiate rules and relationships and how to imagine and create.
- · to answer their own questions

# How you can help.....


- · Read as much as you can with your child.

- Encourage opportunities and experiences to practise numeracy and literacy skills in real and meaningful ways e.g. look for numbers you see around the house and in the shops, play board games which use a dice, point out the time on a clock at breakfast and bedtime etc
- · Provide opportunities for fine motor skills e.g writing or drawing - forming letter and numbers, cutting skills etc
