Starting the Day

Children in Primary 5 enter by the same door as Primary 6 and Primary 7. They are welcomed into class by th teacher. They use the same door to leave and in case of fire.

The children usually have a starting task while registration takes place. The tasks will vary as the year goes on. The children are currently learning card games which they can then choose to play if they are finished work. The purpose of this task is to foster friendships, turn taking and numeracy skills and to give a relaxed, fun start to the year.

Equipment

If possible, children should bring water every day and a writing pencil. If they have a home reader, they should also bring it every day in the plastic wallet provided.

Gym

We usually have gym at 1.15 p.m. on a Tuesday and at 9.30 a.m. on a Thursday. There will be a block of Tennis lessons starting on Friday 24th October and ending on Friday the 12th of December and for this block P.E. will be on Tuesday afternoons and Friday mornings. If possible, children should wear their gym kit on P.E. days. For safety, trainers or gym shoes should be worn, long hair should be tied back and jewellery, like earrings, should be removed or taped. If children want to leave kit in school, it can be left in a labelled bag on their cloakroom peg. We will be going swimming at the end of February 2026 and more information regarding this will be given nearer the time.

Labels

Please label your child's clothing and belongings, including their gym kit, with their name and class to avoid them being lost. I have a laundry pen so I can lend this to children to write their names on the care labels. If anyone would rather I did not do this, please let me know.

Timetable

The class have Mrs Carleton for Digital Literacy and Health and Wellbeing from 11.45 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. on a Wednesday. Literacy

The children will further develop their reading skills through a variety of texts and will start with a variety of shorter texts including poetry. They will also be developing their handwriting, spelling, punctuation and grammar skills. Our writing skills will be developed using a range of contexts from across the curriculum e.g. Social Studies. Listening and talking will be key to many areas and will help the children achieve their right to be heard as well as furthering their understanding of texts.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Primary 5 have started with some revision of basic skills. They will further develop their knowledge and understanding of Place Value, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, Fractions, Decimals and applying their skills in problem solving. In Mathematics, the children will learn about Area, Length, Perimeter and Shape. We will focus on Money during 'Maths Week Scotland' and we will be learning about Time throughout the year. The ability to add and subtract mentally to 20 and recall the multiplication tables and division facts will help with this learning. Practising these skills at home can make a difference.

Health and Well-Being

Much of the focus for Health and Well-being this year will be on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, our Class and Positive Relationships Charters and the SHANARRI indicators. The aim is to embed these in our day to day lives.

Events

I am planning to invite Primary 5 parents and carers to help us make Christmas decorations at the end of November and to attend a Scottish themed Assembly sometime near the end of January as we will be learning about 'The Scottish Wars of Independence' and 'Scotland' in Social Studies and the Scots language in Literacy. The exact dates will be confirmed later this term.

Parental Support

The support of parents and carers is vital for our school community and much appreciated. The most important thing to help the children's learning is that they feel happy about coming to school. I hope they will feel this and want to work with you and your child to ensure it.
