

The Primary 2 Classroom is on the upper floor next to the Computing Suite. We have 26 children in our class with 14 boys and 12 girls.






School Vision and Values

Our Routines


Morning

Our Curriculum

Literacy

We shall continue to follow the North Lanarkshire Literacy Pack introducing phonemes and common words. We shall develop our reading, writing and comprehension skills.

Numeracy

Continue with partitioning of Numbers up to 20. We will become excellent at reading, writing and recognising numbers to 100.

Mathematics

Explore 2d shapes and 3d objects and identify, name and describe their features. Create a tiling pattern with 2d shapes.

Home Learning

Every month, we will send home a grid of suggested activities through Parents' Portal that you can cover to reinforce learning at home. Hard copies can be obtained through the office.
