Our Curriculum

This session in Numeracy, we will be working on Place Value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and some 2D shape and 3D object work.

In Literacy, we will be reading the class novel, "The Invisible Boy" by Sally Gardner and will be learning skills such as prediction, sequencing events and making inferences through this text.

We will be reinforcing and learning new phonemes (ue, aw, oi, au, ew, ow, ou, igh, y, and magic letter "e", tch, ea and wr)

P3 will be focussing on descriptive, narrative and procedure writing. We will be learning all about Harvest through out topic, "Fork to Farm" and will be leading an Assembly for the school in October. Later in the year, we will be learning all about "The Egyptians" and "The Amazon Rainforest" and will host a "Display of Knowledge" for parents and carers.
