


School Vision and Values



Our Curriculum

<u>Literacy</u>

Our current class novel is Wonder by J.R. Palacio. Through work on this book the children will develop skills in: summarising, predicting, visualising and inferring.

Numeracy

We are primarily focusing on addition, subtraction, division and multiplication using place value this term. We will also start to delve into fractions, decimals and percentages.

HWB

We will predominately be concentrating on the zones of regulation during class Health and wellbeing lessons.

Across the Curriculum

In Science we will be looking at chemical reactions and writing Science reports. Our topic this term will be the formation of rivers and mountains and the use of urban and rural land.

We will showcase all our learning at our leavers' assembly in June!
