PASD "Step-by-Step" 5K Walk - April 7

Parkinson's Association San Diego's (PASD) "Step-by-Step" 5K Walk is an annual "happening" that combines a fun outdoor event, with optional exercise, and information from major Parkinson's organizations – AND is an important fundraiser for PASD's services to people with Parkinson's county-wide.



Talk to anyone who's done the Walk in previous years. It's a great social event in a nice venue – Liberty Station, Point Loma. It's a super event, whether you walk the whole 5K (3 mile) route or take any **or all** of the shortcuts – or you just go for the fun of it.

PASD provides services all across the County, including

- ◆ The "Good Start Program" helping recently-diagnosed folks understand the disease, the options for services, and offering hope as scientists move toward a cure,
- ◆ a sponsorship through FACT Facilitating Access to Coordinated Transportation a non-profit service that coordinates transportation resources for Parkinson's-related events (including the 5K Walk) or appointments offering travel for people with Parkinson's and their care partner for FREE or reduced cost,
- ♦ a **website** with valuable Parkinson's-related resources, and contact information for more than 20 Support Groups in our area including NCPSG chapters, helping people locate nearby meetings and activities,
- Equipment exchange, providing mobility equipment for Parkinsonians, available for free, and accepting donated equipment, and
- Special programs like the educational, motivating "Empowerment Day", and partnerships with the Davis Phinney Foundation's "Sidekicks" linking Parkinsonians with youth through art.

We encourage you to join our NCPSG Team on the Walk, or form your own team under our banner, and to encourage family & friends to donate.

Tri-City Hospital Exercise: Under the leadership of physical therapist **Tracy Park**, Tri-City Hospital offers an exercise program specifically designed for Parkinson's. **Jim and Miriam Campbell**, **Sam and Georgia Lazar**, **Stephen and Stephanie Lester**, **and Phil and Nelly Souther** are among the regular attendees.

Cycling: **Art Bierle** rides his three wheel bicycle several times a week with friends often covering 25 miles at a time. He folds the bicycle for transport in his SUV.

Encinitas Elks Lodge: Coordinated by past Board treasurer Betty Byrd, the Encinitas Elks Lodge hosts a Parkinson's-focused exercise program. Participants include Lawrence and Joy Rogers, and Robert and Marianne Leard.
