
Research Advances in San Diego:

(Image credit: UC San Diego Health Sciences) Additional information about Dr Cleveland's portion of the talk above has appeared in articles and scientific journals. Scientists at the UCSD School of Medicine have made an exciting discovery that gives hope to sufferers of Parkinson's Disease and other neurological disorders.

You may have seen research efforts, such as stem cell trials, that attempt to restore neurons to their proper function. There is an entirely new line of study. By silencing a protein in the brain of a mouse called PTB scientists observed that certain cells converted into neurons. Mice that were so treated lost the motor symptoms of Parkinson's Disease, and remained symptom free for the remainder of their lives.

Please remember: Mice aren't people! This is promising, but a lot of study is still required to see if

this research translates to human beings. Small Social Groups



Parkinson's Registry

The California Parkinson's Disease Registry requires healthcare providers diagnosing or providing treatment to Parkinson's disease patients to report each case of Parkinson's disease to the California Department of Public Health beginning July 1, 2018. The information is used to record the distribution and prevalence of Parkinson's Disease. The information is protected, and the patient has the right to access what information has been provided. The information is provided directly by physicians, and patients need take no action.

The program is authorized under the California Health and Safety Code, and was to terminate on January 1, 2021. The legislature introduced Assembly Bill (AB) 2821 to extend the program for another year. The legislature unanimously authorized the program, but provided no funding to support it. The Michael J Fox Foundation has agreed to provided the required funding.

As of this writing the bill has been forwarded to the governor's office for signature. He must sign by September 30 for the legislation to take effect.
