

Greetings Friends,

Grace and peace to you this season of Advent. We have stepped off into a new walk with Christ. Our lectionary readings supply us with the basic necessities for our journey together.

The first Sunday in Advent encourages us, as we begin to walk, keep watch for the great Day of the Lord, and to not be afraid because we are children of God, waiting to be taken - heart, mind, and soul. *Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.* (Matthew 24:44)

The second Sunday in Advent is a call to repentance and reminds us we can always begin again, and again. From generation to generation, the church has cried out, repent! Begin again!! John the Baptist appears in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, Make straight his paths." (Matthew 3:1-3)

The third Sunday in Advent places us on the holy highway along which we will walk with joy. The wilderness and dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom. The eyes of the blind shall be opened. The ears of the deaf unstopped. The burning sand shall become a pool. **A highway shall be there** and the ransomed of God shall return. Everlasting joy shall be upon their heads. They shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away. (Isaiah 35:1-10)

The fourth Sunday in Advent reminds us that the Holy Spirit will guide us on our way. Messengers from God, called angels, will speak to us in new and unexpected ways if we will slow down and pay attention. But just when

he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' (Matthew 1:20-21)

Remember, you do not walk alone. I pray the God of mercy, forgiveness, and peace be with you this season and throughout the year to come. Traveling Mercies to you all.

# Blue Christmas Service

#### What is a blue Christmas service?

A Blue Christmas service is a worship service that names and holds space for the sadness that accompanies the holidays. Heightened by the advertising of our consumerist culture, there is a definite Christmas ideal that includes neatly iced gingerbread houses, smiling children, and an excessive amount of neatly wrapped packages. These standards and the church's sometimes solitary focus on joy can make the holidays an isolating time for anyone who can't muster happiness or meet the criteria. A blue Christmas service is an invitation for anyone who wants to come and set their burden down, for a community to hold pain collectively.

This service is for a group of people who recognize that joy and sorrow intertwine, and those who love them.

The service falls on December 21 — the shortest day of the year. This offers an opportunity the for community to reflect on darkness and light in a literal sense. When the darkness feels overwhelming, we can take comfort in knowing that God meets us here. And whether it is a seed in the soil, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, we know that life comes out of the dark.

Central Presbyterian Church of Waxahachie is offering a Blue Christmas service this year on Wednesday, December 21st at 6 p.m. in the Patrick Chapel. Please enter through the side door adjacent to the parking lot off Jackson Street by Bethlehem Revisited. We have a ramp and stairs. The chapel is just to the left of the stairway. This is a brief service of hope and light in the midst of the darkness. Please join us.
