COURSE OBJECTIVES: This course is designed as an introduction to acting technique. We will identify, define and pursue the development of the various skills and concepts that embody actors' work. Relaxation, focus, concentration, awareness, and physical expression will all be developed through various exercises. The student should complete this course with a deeper understanding of the process of acting, and some basic skills related to it.

Attendance is mandatory. There is an allotment of two unexcused absences per semester. In the case of emergencies or extended illness, the student must speak to the professor as soon as possible to determine a course of action.

LATENESS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. CLASS BEGINS PROMPTLY AT THE APPOINTED TIME. EACH INCIDENT OF LATENESS WILL EQUAL 1/4 ABSENCE. NO ONE WILL BE ADMITTED INTO CLASS AFTER 10 MIN., WHICH WILL COUNT AS AN ABSENCE. ANYONE WHO HAS A SCHEDULE PROBLEM THAT MIGHT RESULT IN FREQUENT LATENESS, TALK TO THE PROFESSOR.
