OPEN NC COLLABORATIVE CHANGES NAME TO CODE FOR THE CAROLINAS

RALEIGH, N.C. – Open NC Collaborative, a nonprofit civic technology organization, announced today that it has changed its name to Code for the Carolinas. The name change reflects the organization's expansion to South Carolina.

For five years, Open NC Collaborative has connected residents across North Carolina to the Code for America program. The organization has provided community members with digital tools and resources to improve their communities. The organization will remain virtual while expanding its program and membership to South Carolina.

Code for the Carolinas will create a network for the Code for America brigades in North Carolina and South Carolina. With only seven brigades in North Carolina and one in South Carolina, the organization will also connect residents outside of a brigade to the Code for America program.

Code for the Carolinas will continue to support civic technology projects.

Previously, the organization has supported community-empowerment projects. Through its End Durham Hunger project, the organization created mobile applications that provided resource information to food-insecure community members.

The name change refers to North Carolina and South Carolina collectively as "the Carolinas." Code for the Carolinas will continue its mission to empower communities through civic technology.
