We have subscribed to an electronic forest and resource related news feed and will keep you updated on all new and pertinent articles.



The Western Legislative Task Force (WLFTF) was created in 1974 by a group of legislators who recognized the need for coordinated action to address forestry policies in the West. Present members are 2 Senators and 2 House/Assembly members from the following states: Alaska, California, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. WLFTF Chairmen are elected each year in a rotation of the states. Meetings are held at the members request and include an annual "summer" meeting in the state of the current Chairman. From time-to-time WLFTF members meet in Washington, D.C. to discuss policy issues at the national level.

PNWER



A delegation from Pacific Northwest Economic Region (PNWER) is visiting states and provinces in their annual briefing of legislatures and government officials. The delegation led by Matt Morrison - PNWER CEO and Larry Doke - Minister of Saskatchewan Gov't Relations and PNWER President, made a presentation to the Idaho Senate Transportation Committee yesterday. Afterwards, Roger Seiber, Executive Director for WLFTF had an opportunity to visit with Matt and Larry about the WLFTF interest in sharing and coordinating forestry related information with PNWER members. We will extend an invitation to PNWER to attend our annual summer meeting.

SUMMER MEETING

Idaho is hosting the 2019 Annual Summer meeting which will highlight the "Good Neighbor Authority Agreement" policies between States and the USFS. Many other topics will be discussed and "on the ground" site visits will be part of the program. Also, at this meeting we will elect the 2019-2020 Chairman and Vice-Chair. The current order of chairmanships is as follows: Idaho, Alaska, Oregon, Washington and California. We are working on dates and locations and will let you know shortly for your planning purposes.
