2021 GRAND MARSHALL

Sean Parnell

We are honored to have as our Grand Marshall, our own Pittsburgh native and decorated Afghan Veteran, Captain Sean Parnell.

Sean was studying elementary education at Clarion university when the twin towers were struck on 9/11 and immediately transferrred to Duquesne University to join thier ROTC Program. Upon completion Sean was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Army and contined on to Airborne and Ranger School before joining the 10th Mountain Division. Sean then spent 485 days of fierce fighting along the Afghan-Pakistan border in 2006-07 where this unique group ("Outlaws") battled furioiusly in the most rugged terrain on the planet. Captain Parnell platoon remains one of the most decorated Army units since 9-11. (85% of his platoon including himself received purple hearts relating to wounds received in battle.) Sean's wounds following his 2006 deployment forced him from the Army and earned him the Captain rank and he was also awarded two Bonze stars, one for Valor and the Purple Heart.

Since his discharge he returned home to Western Pennslyvania where he returned to Duquesne University to earn a master degree in psychology. Sean has penned the NY Times best selling book "Outlaw Platoon." He has become a subject matter expert on Afghanistan, the insurgency we face there, leadership, and how to use it to inspire and motivate men and women to achieve common objectives.
