# DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher Why is Mary Called Queen of Heaven?



Bathsheba was the mother of King Solomon of Israel (1  $\kappa$ gs 1:28-30). As any loving son would do, he obeyed God's command to honor his mother ( $\epsilon$ x 20:12). So even though the highest officials of the kingdom bowed when they came before his throne, Solomon himself stood and bowed before *her* when she entered the court.

Once he sat down again on his throne, "a throne was provided for the king's mother, who sat at his right" (1 Kgs 2:19), the highest place of honor he could give her. Then, when she interceded there with the king for his subjects, he gladly granted her request (1 Kgs 2:20).

Why did Bathsheba have her own throne at her son's right hand? Why did she receive such exalted honor at court? After all, she herself had not been born in a palace. Nevertheless, Bathsheba had borne this magnificent royal son. That made her the queen mother of the land, despite whatever humble circumstances from which she herself may have come.

Now consider this: Solomon may have been one of the most illustrious and powerful kings in biblical history. But his splendor pales to nothing beside the radiant glory of his descendant Jesus Christ, the **"King of kings and Lord of lords,"** ruler of all the nations (Rv 19:16; 15:4). Jesus fulfilled the prophecy that from David's throne would rule a Prince of Peace whose kingdom would be universal and everlasting (Is (:5-6). That throne is now **"in the heavens, far above every principality, authority, power and dominion"** (Eph 1:20-21).

If Solomon honored Bathsheba so highly as his queen mother, how much more must Jesus honor Mary as his own? How much more exalted must be the woman – however lowly her original state (Lk 1:48) – who bore the Son of God, Sovereign of the universe? No doubt her throne, too, is at the right hand of her Son's throne in heaven. And no doubt, just as Solomon was eager to grant his mother's requests, so Jesus gladly responds to her intercession for his subjects.

Mary's exalted rule among the saints also reflects her extraordinary position as our great exemplar of faith, the prototype of the Christian disciple. With St. Elizabeth, we say to her: **"Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled"**(Lk 1:45).

In St. John's vision of heaven, the "woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars," bore a son "destined to rule all the nations" (Rv 12:1, 5). Is it any wonder that in such a portrait, Catholics from very early on saw Mary as Queen of Heaven?

# The Apostles St. James the Greater

About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed sword...~ Acts 12:1-2



James was the brother of John the Evangelist. He was the first saint to be martyred, killed by the sword. He is represented by a pilgrim staff with a hook and scallop-shells. James's feast day is July 25th. He is the patron saint of pilgrims and laborers.

Almighty ever-lasting god, who consecrated the first fruits of your Apostles by the blood of Saint James, grant, we pray, that your Church may be strengthened by his confession of faith and constantly sustained by his protection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

(The Roman Missal. English translation according to the third typical edition. 2011)

In November 1991 ground breaking was held for the present Church of St. Rose of Lima. On December 24, 1992 the then-Bishop, Most Reverend John M. Smith, dedicated the Church. The Church has served the spiritual needs of Catholics of the central and northern parts of Santa Rosa County. Part of the beauty of the Church consists in the stain-glassed windows which adorn and add to the spiritual experience of those worshipping and visiting the Church.

If one looks up towards the heavens, one can see twelve circular stain-glass windows. These represent the twelve apostles. These articles will examines the twelve stain-glass windows, explains the symbolism of the images, and gives a short history of the saint, the feast day of the saint, along with the opening prayers from the Roman Missal for the feast day of the saint.

### **LENTEN ABSTINENCE & FASTING**

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to main strength. However, the two smaller

meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.





## **Knights of Columbus Crown Basketball Free Throw Champions**

Two boys and two girls from Milton and Bagdad, ages 10-13, were named District Champions of the 2014 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship on Saturday, January 25th. Fr. Thomas G. Lorigan Council 7027 of Milton, FL sponsored the competition held in the Milton High School gymnasium. The winners advanced from a local Council Competition held earlier in the day. All boys and girls, ages 9-14, were eligible to participate.
