FIELD AGENT'S REPORT

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn.

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs. I'll answer your questions because I want your decisions to be informed ones. DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

Are the Seven Sacraments in the Bible?

Some Christians have wondered why the Song of Songs is included in Scripture. It never explicitly refers to God. Instead, it's poetry celebrating the love of a husband and wife, "My lover belongs to me and I to him" (6:3).

Since ancient times, however, Catholic interpreters have read this book in light of St. Paul's insight that the marriage covenant is a sign of the everlasting covenant between Christ and his Church (Eph 5:25-32). AS an inspired portrait of ideal human love, then, the Song of Songs also portrays the mutual love of God and his people, to be fully consumed at "the wedding feast of the Lamb" (Rv 19:9).

In Christ's miracle at the wedding in Cana (Jn 2:1-11), the Church sees his proclamation that the ancient institution of matrimony (Gn 1:26-31; 2:1825) has been raised to the level of a sacrament – an efficacious sign of God's presence. In fact, in Ephesians 5:32, St. Paul uses the word "mystery" to refer to marriage, which in the Greek is also the word "sacrament". The other six sacraments are found in Scripture as well: Baptism, Reconciliation (Confession or Penance), the Eucharist, Confirmation, Anoint of the Sick, and Holy Orders (clergy ordination).

Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund



The Knights of Columbus held their Supreme Council International Convention in Philadelphia, during the first week of August. One of the highlights of that convention was Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson's announcement, that the Knights of Columbus will begin a new campaign to expose the crimes against humanity that are being committed. He said, "It is time for a season of truth about what is happening to Christians and other minorities in the Middle East".

The Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund, has already distributed more than \$3 Million. The humanitarian assistance provided so far, has included permanent housing for those who have had to flee their homes, as well as support for medical facilities in

areas flooded with Christians and other refugees.

Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, said that the Knights of Columbus will redouble its humanitarian efforts benefitting persecuted Middle East Christians, and begin an education campaign to make their plight better known.

Any individual Knights wishing to assist with the relief efforts, can donate by sending a check or money order, payable to Knights of Columbus Charities, at P.O. Box 1966, New Haven, CT 06509-1966. The memo portion should indicate that the donation is for "Christian Relief Fund".

Since the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council is recognized by the IRS as a charitable organization under *section* 501(c)3 of the *Internal* Revenue Code, 100% of all donations will directly support humanitarian assistance, and raising awareness of persecuted Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East.


