

What Does the Church Teach About War?



Christian pacifist communities often insist that the New Testament standard replaces the Old Testament example in this regard. They cite, for example, Jesus` gospel command to "offer no resistance to one who is evil" (Mt 5:39), and his warning, "all who take the sword will perish by the sword" (Mt 26:51-54.

Nevertheless, the New Testament also contains St. Paul's statement that the civil state "does not bear the sword without purpose; it is the servant of God to inflict wrath on the evildoer" (Rom 13:4). The natural law allows for self-defense, and Scripture commands us to "Defend the lowly and fatherless; render justice to the afflicted and needy. Rescue the lowly and poor, deliver them from the hand of the wicked" (Ps 82:3-4). In this light, Christians have reasonably argued that sometimes war is justifiable – in fact, that justice and charity may demand our engagement in war to defend both our own people and the innocent victims of aggressors in other nations.

As the Catechism teaches, on occasion war can indeed be just, and public authorities can "impose on citizens the *obligations necessary for national defense.*" But "the strict conditions for *legitimate defense by military force* require rigorous consideration" (CCC 2310 and 2309, emphasis in the original). For instance, all other means to resolve that issue must have proven futile (CCC2309 for a summary of all the conditions).

Meanwhile, the Church urges all people, especially governments, to work for peace – not just the avoidance of war, or the uneasy balance of power between adversaries, but the creation of just conditions that lead to social and political tranquility. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Mat 5:9).

We have over 250 members in our council; and he serves eight (8) other councils besides ours, so it could be TOO LATE by the time he gets around to calling you.

If you think you don't need his expertise, your family could be in for a RUDE AWAKENING when you die! So, PLEASE, do what is right for them.

These men need our support as they answer God's call. There are many ways we can support them. First, we should pray for them often. We should also communicate our support to them by writing to them or speaking in person if we have the opportunity.

We also have opportunities to support them financially. At our parish, the Burse Club collects a dollar a month, on the first Sunday of every month. The History of our Holy Rosary.

In the beginning, the Christians prayed the 150 psalms which were later replaced with simple memorized prayers.

According to our Catholic tradition, our Holy Rosary, that we pray now, was given to Saint Dominic in a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary and then later promoted by the blessed Dominican, Alanu Rupe (1428-1475), testified about the natural origin. 1571, the Moslems were defeated at the Battle of Lepanto. The following year, Pope Saint Pius V, known as the Pope of the Rosary, established the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7<sup>th</sup>. The faithful would not only remember this victory, but also give thanks to the Lord all of his benefits and remember the powerful intercession of our Blessed Mother. Pope St Pius V issued a papal document, Consueverung Roman Pontifices, in which he secured the uniformity of the Holy Rosary.

Saint Louis-Marie de Montfort (1673-1716) was a French Roman Catholic priest and confessor, was made to a missionary apostolic by Pope Clement XI. As well preaching, Montfort was also known for his particular devotion of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the practice praying the Rosary.

Pope Paul VI (1963-19780): There is no doubt that, after the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours, the high point which family prayer can reach, the Rosary should be considered as one of the best and most efficacious prayers in common that the Christian family is invited to recite.

Pope John Paul II proclaims the "YEAR OF THE ROSARY"

On October 16. 2002, the 24<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of his election as Roman Pontiff, Pope Paul II signed the Apostolic Letter "Rosarium Virginis Mariae" (The Rosary of the Virgin Mary) that presents the rosary as an outstanding way to contemplate the face and mysteries of Christ. He also proclaimed a "YEAR OF THE ROSARY" which extends from October 2002 to October 2003

Joachim Cardinal Meisner, Bishop from Cologne, wrote this:

If we take the Rosary in our hand, we touch the hem of Jesus garment. This is caused by the centuries praying hand - a relic of the Lord - it is sanctified by the believing prayers of millions of God's children and powerfully proven throughout history.

The Joyful Mysteries were chosen because world peace with the birth of the Savior. Let us pray that the Prince of Peace is born more fully into our world, especially in places of violence.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name.

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee.


