

### DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher What's the Difference Between Sanctifying Grace and Actual Grace?

**Sanctifying Grace** is the very life of God. It is *intrinsic* (interior) grace, which dwells in the soul and transforms it, making it holy. It is the means by which Christians are

transformed into the adopted children of God. This share in the divine life that God offers created persons is a real regeneration, a second birth. Christians possess a new life which is their own (Rom 6:4); they are new creatures (2 Cor 5:17), new men and men re-created in justice, holiness, and truth (Eph 4:24). This new life is "grace" because it is a divine gift and - "sanctifying" because it really transforms a person with the holiness of divine life.

Sanctifying grace is a state in which God allows us to share in his life and love. When we speak of being in the state of grace, we mean the state of sanctifying grace; there is no mortal sin in us. This grace comes to us first, of course, through baptism. The ordinary way we receive sanctifying grace is through the sacraments.

Actual grace is supernatural help from God, sort of like nudges. It is *extrinsic* (external) grace, working on us from the outside only; it does nothing to change the state of our soul. Everyone receives actual grace, and it comes to us when we need it. We have the free will to cooperate with it or ignore it.

Let's go into a little more detail about each.

#### Sanctifying Grace

First, an analogy that may be helpful: We all know that our human nature is not equipped to live in the ocean. We will die there unless we have something outside of (or beyond) our nature to sustain us. Scuba gear is an apparatus that allows us to transcend our human nature and live underwater. Similarly, our human nature is not equipped to live in Heaven. Sanctifying grace is the "apparatus" that allows us to transcend our human nature and live in Heaven. We need sanctifying grace because in our merely human state, we are simply not equipped to live in the presence of God.

When God created our first parents, Adam and Eve, He immediately infused them with the extraordinary gift of sanctifying grace, i.e., a sharing of His divine life. This undeserved gift elevated them above their own human nature and allowed them to live in the direct presence of God. Unfortunately, Adam and Eve lost this supernatural gift when they "fell from grace" by choosing to sin. Without sanctifying grace, they were separated from God, and Heaven was closed to them.

Since their Fall, humans are no longer given the gift of sanctifying grace at their creation. However, thanks to Jesus Christ and His atoning death, we are able to receive the gift of sanctifying grace through the sacraments of His Church. At our baptism, our souls are infused with sanctifying grace, God's very life, and we become fit for Heaven. Assuming we continue to live in God's friendship and not commit mortal sin, this grace can continue to grow in our souls throughout

our lives through prayer, acts of mercy, love, penance, etc., making us increasingly holy. We hope to die in a state of grace.

#### **Actual Grace**

An easy way to understand actual grace is to remember that it *enables* us to act. It is the strength that God gives us to act according to his will. Actual grace is like little nudges from God. These nudges can take many different forms and come to us from many different places (and people). Actual grace could come in the form of your mother reminding you not to miss Mass on Sunday, or a friend telling you that you should get to confession. It could be a catastrophic event that leaves you on your knees before God, when before you wouldn't have gone near Him. It could be the promptings of your own conscience when confronted with your sins. It might be a class you took or a book you read which compelled you in the direction of justice or righteousness or humility. It could be the unexpected presence of a holy person or the feeling of awe you get when you look at a coastal sunset. It could be just about anything that moves you closer to the Lord.

Actual grace can be acted on or it can be ignored in exercising our free will; but just like a train, there will always be another "nudge" coming around soon. God never abandons anyone, and every human being on the planet receives as much actual grace as is necessary to prompt one to seek out salvation. Unlike sanctifying grace, actual grace does not touch the interior of a person, but only works from the outside. Actual grace does not change the state of a person's soul, but is merely the agent that pushes a soul to seek out and receive sanctifying grace.

If you want to dig deeper about what grace is, try some of these:

HABITUAL GRACE - Constant supernatural quality of the soul that sanctifies a person inherently and makes him or her just and pleasing to God. Also called sanctifying grace or justifying grace.



## Fourth Degree St. Teresa of Calcutta Assembly 2823


#### Worthy Sir Knights,


