

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

Iconoclasm Heresy (Greek for "image-breaking")

People who support iconoclasm are called *iconoclasts*. In a Byzantine context, people who revere or venerate religious images and statues are known as *iconodules*, or *iconophiles*.

In Christianity, iconoclasm has generally been

motivated by a literal interpretation of the Ten Commandments, which forbid the making and worshipping of "graven images" *per se*:

Judaism: King Hezekiah purged the Temple of pagan symbols

Romans destroyed Christian images

Islam against Christianity, Buddhism, and ancient Arabian cultures

Protestants against Catholicism

Easter Island large stone heads toppled in

1700s

French Revolution

Russian Revolution

Communist China revolution

In 695 Justinian II put a full-face image of Christ on the <u>obverse</u> of his gold coins. The effect on iconoclast opinion is unknown, but the change caused Caliph Abd al-Malik to break permanently with his previous adoption of Byzantine coin types to start a purely Islamic coinage with lettering only.

Sométime between 726-730, the Byzantine Emperor Leo III began the iconoclast campaign. He ordered the removal of an image of Jesus prominently placed over the ceremonial entrance to the Great Palace of Constantinople, and its replacement with a cross.

THE ICONOCLAST POSITION

1. The only true and permitted "icon" of Jesus was the Eucharist, which was believed to be his actual body and blood. The assertion being that the biblical commandment forbidding images of God had been superseded by the incarnation of Jesus, who, being the second person of the Trinity, is God incarnate in visible matter. Therefore, the Eucharist was not depicted as the invisible God, but God as He appeared in the flesh.

- 2. By making an icon of Jesus, one separates his human and divine natures, since only the human can be depicted (separating the natures was considered nestorianism).
- 3. Combining Jesus' two natures into just one nature (monophysitism) conflicted with Christ being both human and divine without division or separation.

THE ICONODULES POSITION

By 780 an ecumenical council needed to be held to address the issue of Iconoclasm. On 24 September 787 a second general council was reassembled at Nicaea (Nicæa II) During those proceedings the following was adopted:... "the production of representational art is quite in harmony with the history of the spread of the gospel, as it provides confirmation that the becoming man of the Word of God was real and not just imaginary." Jesus, "The Word", the incarnation of God on earth, himself was an icon.

In Exodus 25:18-22 Moses was instructed by God to make golden statues of <u>cherubim</u> angels on the lid of the Ark of the Covenant, and

In Exodus 26:31 God instructed Moses to embroider the curtain which separated the Holy of Holies in the Tabernacle with cherubim.

John of Damascus declared that he did not venerate matter, "but rather the creator of matter." However, he also declared, "But I also venerate the matter through which salvation came to me, as if filled with divine energy and grace." He includes in this latter category the ink in which the gospels were written as well as the paint of images, the wood of the Cross, and the body and blood of Jesus.

In a 'nutshell', images, statues, art work, etc. (icons), depicting God and his plan of salvation for mankind are to be encouraged because the Savior of mankind himself is an icon of God the Father.
