DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher **Does the Church Teach Evolution?**

Are the opening chapters of Genesis a literal, scientific description of the world's creation? Or is their language more figurative, whose essential meaning points to

fundamental truths about God and the world? Christians have debated the matter since ancient times.

Perhaps the sharpest controversy over these passages has to do with human origins, usually focusing on the scientific theory of evolution. Some believe that Genesis, rightly understood, denies any possibility that human beings have descended in some sense from other species. Others, however, claim that such evolution is a proven scientific fact.

Catholic tradition provides a different perspective. Following the insights of St. Augustine and others, it allows that Genesis employs figurative language, so it cannot be cited as a scientific text that rules out human evolution altogether. At the same time, however, the "proven facts of science" accepted by one generation may be rejected by later generations because of new evidence. So the Church warns scientists against presumption in their conclusions. She specifically rejects any scientific theories, such as that of Charles Darwin, which insist that evolution was the result of random forces rather than the intelligent design of a personal Creator. Such pretentious claims move beyond the limited realm of scientific inquiry.

The Church teaches that a few fundamental truths about human origins cannot be contradicted by scientific speculation:

- 1. The entire universe, including the human race, is not the result of chance, but of God's purposeful, loving design (Gn. 1:1, 31).
- 2. Human beings are not simply more advanced animals; they bear the image of God in a unique way (Gn.1: 26-27).
- 3. If the first humans came about through evolution, their souls were immediately created by God at their conception (Gn. 2:7).
- 4. All human beings share a single, historical ancestry, so they all have the same nature and origin, and belong to one human family (Acts 17:26).
- 5. The primordial fall from original holiness of our first human parents was a real event within time. It left them and their descendants with original sin (Rom. 5:12-14, 18-19).

Council 7027 Awards Scholarships!

Every year Council 7027 Awards three college scholarships to deserving high school seniors who are members of St. Rose of Lima Parish. This is an ongoing awards program, funded and budgeted for by the Council and awarded through a selection committee of eight brother Kniahts.

Meeting as a committee for a three hour examination of the applications, the three required parts of each application are graded individually by each of the eight committee members. The three scholarship winners are determined by averaging the scores awarded by each committee member for each part of the applicant. To make the selection as fair as possible, all identification on the application documents is redacted so that effort to submit an application. A the evaluation process is totally anonymous and equal for all. The three scholarship winners for 2018 are: Marisol Victoria A. Baduya from Milton High School awarded \$1,500

Raeanne L. Nolasco from Pace High School awarded \$1,500 Grace M. Cabrera from Pace High School awarded \$1,500.

These are three outstanding young members of our parish and are most deserving of these scholarships. It should be noted, however, that there were two other applications examined by the committee and their credentials were equally impressive. But, the selection process indicated that the three winners collected more points during the evaluation process. All applications were competitive and the final scoring was very close.

Congratulations to all the fine high school seniors who took the time and made the particular note of congratulations to the three winners of our 2018 Scholarships. We only wish we could have recognized all of our applicants with a scholarship.

Annual Free Coast Guard Vessel Inspection Sponsored by the Blackwater Pyrates Saturday 19 May.

Whether your vessel is motor, wind or man-powered, the Blackwater Pyrates - in conjunction with the US Coast Guard Auxiliary – is sponsoring a free water vessel examination day on Saturday 19 May from 9 am to 12 pm at *Carpenter's Park* and *Russell Harbor* boat landings in Milton.

Vessels passing the inspection will receive an annual sticker for the vessel acknowledging the pass. As this is **not** a law enforcement inspection, vessels not passing will be given a checklist of deficiencies, but **not** a citation. Within reason and available resources, deficiencies will be corrected free of charge by the Blackwater Pyrates on the spot.

The Blackwater Pyrates in conjunction with The Knights of Columbus of Milton is sponsoring a **Blessing of the Fleet** that will take place at the Memorial Park Boardwalk in downtown Milton on Saturday 19 May at 1:00 pm.
