Brother Knights In Christ:

The month of November has finally come. The month of November represents the spiritual warrior and acts as a mirror this month reflecting that the battle always lies within our self. A time to remain mindful concentrating on our spiritual needs.

Thanksgiving is approaching which is one of America's most treasured holidays and traditions. Thanksgiving gives us an opportunity to gather with friends and family members.

Another holiday is Veterans Day, observed annually on November 11, which honors military veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces.

We celebrate All Saints' Day to honor all the saints, particularly those who do not have their own special feast day, on November 1st.

The month of November is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory, whose feast is celebrated on November 2. The entire month of November falls during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time and is represented by the liturgical color green.

Once again natural disasters are affecting us here in Florida, as well as the lives of members and their families in neighboring communities. Hurricane Michael in the Gulf of Mexico had a strong and devastating impact on the Florida Panhandle region. So, what do we do as Knights of Columbus? The best way for you to help at this moment is to first, pray for the people impacted and second, take up a collection. Any funds collected on behalf of disaster relief should be sent through our Florida K of C Charities, Inc., non-profit association.

The Knights has provided assistance to those affected by the recent Category 4 hurricane as Indiana Knights travel to Florida to help with Hurricane Michael cleanup. In Albany, Ga., soup kitchen serves community thanks to K of C contributions after Hurricane Michael. Knights of Columbus members are providing food, water

and sending supplies by the truckload to help the victims of Hurricane Michael in Florida and Georgia. The Knights respond with manpower and commitment in facing challenge to get volunteer help after Hurricane Michael. And on October 14, 2018 at our Knights of Columbus Breakfast, we provided free breakfast to the victims affected by Hurricane Michael and also free breakfast for everyone as donations only as proceeds go to Hurricane Michael Relief Fund towards our Florida panhandle area. With everybody's generosity, we receive donations totaling \$1,000.

On October 28, 2018 at our Corporate Communion Mass at 8:00am was represented a donation of \$20,000 to the Pregnancy Resource Center. In which \$10,000 was donated from Fall Festival proceeds from our church and our council match the church's donation of \$10,000.

The Knights of Columbus council goals is sponsoring council activities, by providing assistance to the Catholic Church, by doing charitable work in the communities where we exist. Rendering aid and assistance to its sick, disabled and needy members and their families. Promoting and conducting education, charitable, religious, social welfare and public relief work. Thus, the Order is considered a Catholic, Family, Fraternal, and Service Organization.

My Brothers Knights, I want thank you all for volunteering your time, your hard work and dedication to Charity as this would not be possible without you.

I want to take this opportunity to wish you and your family a Happy Thanksgiving and Happy Veterans Day.

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

Can Individuals Receive Special Revelations From God?

Like many biblical characters, the ancient Israelite judge Gideon acted on on a personal revelation he received from God (Jgs. 6:11-40). The stories of such special revelations are now

an important part of what is called the "public" revelation of God to the Church, which includes sacred Scripture and sacred Tradition – a deposit of faith that we must take as our norm of belief (2 Tm 1:14).

"In times past, god spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he spoke to us through a son" (Heb 1:1-2). Jesus Christ, the Son of God made man, is the Father's one, perfect, definitive Word, which can never be surpassed. In Christ, God has said it all. So the heritage of faith, given in Christ and contained in Scripture and Tradition, is complete. We expect no new public revelation until Jesus Christ returns to earth.

Over the course of centuries, however, the Church has gradually come to understand the meaning of that complete revelation more deeply. From this deposit, handed down by the apostles and their successors, the teaching office (magisterium) of the Church draws everything that it proposes to us for our belief as being divinely revealed. Catholics are obliged to accept this public revelation of God.

Do special revelations still come to

individuals from heaven? The Church certainly allows for that possibility. At times she has even authoritatively recognized such messages, as with the appearances of our Lady to St. Bernadette at Lourdes. But these "private" revelations, as they are called, do not belong to the deposit of faith. Their role is not to add to or improve Christ's definitive revelation, but to help believers live it more fully in a specific period of history.

For that reason, though the Church may recommend particular private revelations as worthy of acceptance, Catholics are not bound to assent to these in the same way they would place their faith on sacred Scripture and Tradition. At the same time, Catholics should exercise caution toward alleged "revelations" that have not yet been approved by the Church. And they must firmly reject as false any that offer a different gospel" (Gal 1:6-9), claiming to surpass or correct the deposit of faith given in Christ.

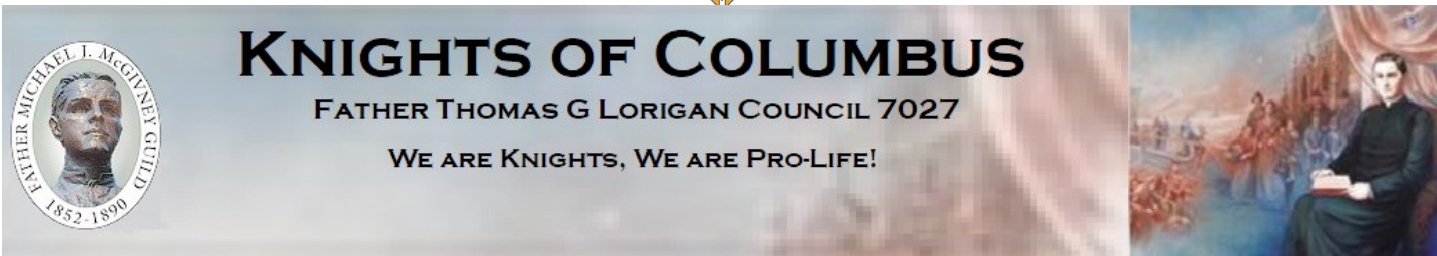

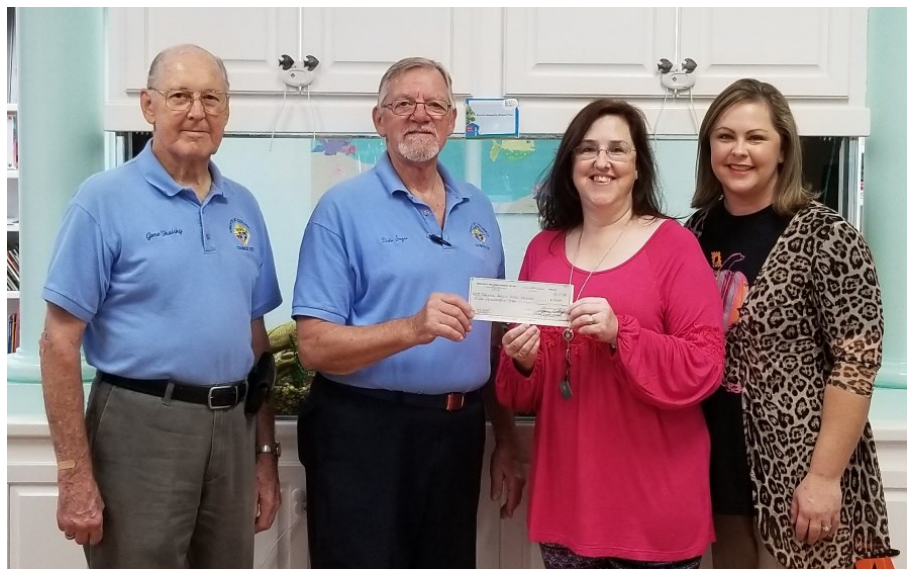

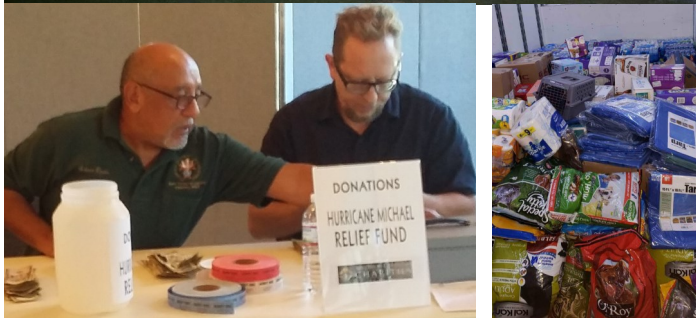
