DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher What Does the Church Teach About Angels?

The Book of Judges repeatedly speaks of angels being sent by God to his people (verses 2:1-5). Are we to

understand that these and similar biblical accounts are references to real supernatural beings, or simply as accounts of visions?

Both Scripture and Tradition repeatedly affirm that God has in fact created non-human, angelic beings to be his agents, warriors, and messengers. They are personal and immortal; they have a rational intellect and free will, yet they are pure spirits without bodies like ours. They surpass in perfection all visible creatures, as is evident from their splendor (Ps 103:20-21).

Nevertheless, redeemed human beings will one day be perfected in such a way that the angels will be subject to them (1 Cor 6:2).

Angels have been present since creation and they have played critical roles in salvation history, from the fall

of man to the present. In various ways they carried out the divine plan for the ancient descendants of Abraham. When God became man in Jesus Christ, they surrounded and served him throughout his earthly life from his conception up to the very moment of his ascension into heaven. They will also announce his return to earth at the end of time and will serve him as he judges the earth.

Meanwhile, angels are ***“ministering spirits sent to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation*** (Heb 1:4). They join the Church in her worship and ministry, and serve us as guardians, intercessors, and guides. With the saints in heaven they behold the face of God and enjoy the eternal life of the Blessed Trinity.

Finally, Scripture speaks of various angelic hierarchies and provides the names of three particular angels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael.

A new part of the Faith in Action is to support Pregnancy Centers. We have been supporting our local Pregnancy Center for many years and most recent we have purchased an ultrasound machine for them. Now they have an opportunity to expand their services by purchasing a larger facility on Berryhill Road. Monsignor Reed is asking our council to help with a joint donation to the Pregnancy Center of \$10000 from our Council and \$10000 from St Rose. Please help our Council's efforts in supplying the Milton Pregnancy Center with these needed funds. We would like to engage in some fund raiser not only to raise funds but also educate the public of the issue of Life, and particularly the Life of our most innocent, the unborn child. If we are going to ask a mother to keep her child, we better have programs to support these families. Pregnancy Centers provide these supports. One idea of a fund raiser is to conduct a " Pull the Bus" event. The idea is to have several teams of 10 to 20 participants to engage in pulling a bus a predetermined distance in the fastest time. Each member of the team is asked to get donations for their efforts. The teams are

awarded prizes for being the fastest to pull the bus.

The Milton PRC will be conducting the third annual walk for life, Saturday, November 3 at Avalon Baptist Church. Particulars will be included below. Signing up will also be conducted at the next Knights meeting. All you have to do is walk and that is it. You are also asked to find donations for your efforts. Even if it's a few dollars please come out and walk as Knights have not participated in the last two events.

We are also involved presently in "40 Days for Life ". Even though the abortion mill is presently unlicensed to perform any medical procedures, we still need to pray for the end of abortion. As you can see from the pictures below it is a welcome sight to see an empty parking lot. They have not been able to perform abortions since April. In an estimate of 1400 babies have not been destroyed here in Pensacola. Praise God!! And praise your efforts for praying and standing at the mill. Our next council day is November 2 Friday.

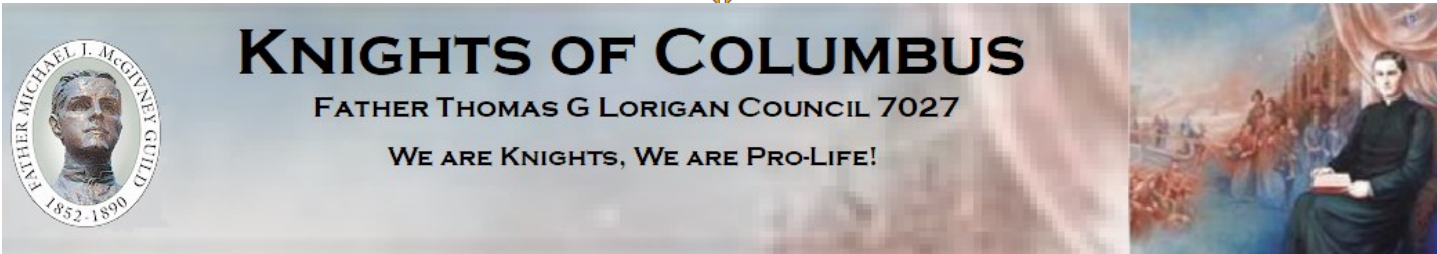

As you read this, I ask that you put your hand on your rosary. The reason should become clear in a moment.

October has a special significance with The Rosary. In 1572, Pope Pius V instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory to be celebrated on October 7. That date is the anniversary of The Battle of Lepanto. Lepanto was a naval battle in which, under severely unfavorable conditions, an outnumbered Christian fleet defeated an Islamic force whose goal was to conquer Rome and all of Europe and eliminate Christianity.

The Christian fleet was aided by a rosary campaign requested by The Pope. Also, one of the Christian ships carried one of the first five copies of the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In recognition of Our Lady's role in the victory, Pope Pius V named October 7 for Our Lady of Victory. He also granted a

plenary indulgence to all those who commemorated, on the first Sunday in October, the victory at Lepanto. That first Sunday in October came to be known as Rosary Sunday. As it turns out this year, Rosary Sunday falls on October 7.

At Lepanto and many other times, The Rosary has been proven to be a highly effective weapon against the forces of evil. I recall my days in the Army when we had to keep our assigned weapon with us at all times, even in our sleeping bags. That's why I asked you to put your hand on your Rosary. We all need to keep our weapon, the Rosary, with us always. Use this powerful weapon often in defense of Our Church and all that is good. Our Lady of Victory, pray for us!

Faith In Action – FAMILY

"The family is the foundation of co-existence and a remedy against social fragmentation." (Pope Francis, Humanum Conference, November 17, 2014). Against the backdrop of opioid epidemic, sexual abuse and pornographic proliferation, the family is a potent force in influencing good behavior and relationships with the ultimate goal of reversing this dreadful course.

In recognizing its value, the Supreme Council starting July 2018 has chosen Family as one of the 4 primary focus categories under the new charge of Faith In Action - along with Faith, Community and Life. While the groupings are simplified, they are expected to be more meaningful and truly responsive to the challenges of the time.

There are 8 programs recommended by the Supreme Council under the category of Family:

- Consecration of the Holy Family
- Family Fully Alive
- Family of the Month/Family of the Year
- Family Prayer Night
- Family Week
- Food for Families (featured)
- Good Friday Family Promotion
- Keep Christ in Christmas

None of the programs are exacting and mandatory except for the Consecration of the Holy Family which is required. Our council will strive to deliberate and decide as to what programs will work best for us, both our parish and community.

There will be some modification with respect to the selection of the Family of the Month/Year. As outlined in the Faith In Action guidebook, the Family of the Month will be

selected every month by the Council Committee, composed of council and parish leaders, to be assembled after consultation with the pastor (Monsignor Reed). At the end of the fraternal year, prior to the state convention, the committee will select one of the previous twelve winners, as Family of the Year – with a selection form to be submitted to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Missions. The Knights of Columbus Family of the Year is chosen by the Supreme Council and recognized each year at the annual Supreme Convention.
