

GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT

Brother Knights In Christ:

The month of April is dedicated to The Holy Spirit. The entire month falls during the Easter season. The liturgical color is white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence. The meaning of April is "to open". It symbolizes spring, the time when buds open and flowers appear.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge,

piety and fear of the Lord.

Wisdom is the first and highest gift of the Holy Spirit because it is the perfection of the theological virtue of faith and the desire to contemplate the things of God. Understanding is the second gift of the Holy Spirit which allows us to grasp, at least in a limited way, the very essence of the truth of our Catholic faith. Through understanding, we gain a certitude about our beliefs that moves beyond faith. The third gift of the Holy Spirit is Counsel which is the perfection of the cardinal virtue. The gift in which a person is open to others' insights about a problem and skilled at working with the people to solve that problem. Fortitude is the fourth gift of the Holy Spirit because it gives us the strength to follow through on the actions suggested by the gift of counsel. The fifth gift of the Holy Spirit is knowledge which allows us to see the circumstances of our life the way that God sees them. Through this gift of the Holy Spirit, we can determine God's purpose for our lives and live them accordingly. Piety is the sixth gift of the Holy Spirit which is the perfection of the virtue of religion. This takes that willingness beyond a sense of duty so that we desire to worship God and to serve Him out of love, the way that we desire to honor our parents and do what they wish. The seventh and final gift of the Holy Spirit is the fear of the Lord. This gift of the Holy Spirit gives us the desire not to offend God, as well as the certainty that God will supply us the grace that we need in order to keep from offending Him. 
Lent is a wonderful time to make a monthly pledge to support our Catholic mission. I thank you all for your support and volunteering time to meet our principle mission of charity.

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher Why Does the Church Teach That Jesus Is God?

Isaiah prophesied, "A child is born to us, a son is given to us...They name him...God-Hero" (15 9:5). Christians have long seen in these

words a prophesy of Jesus' birth and an affirmation of his divine identity. Though it took several centuries for the Church to develop her understanding of the relation between Jesus' human and divine natures, nevertheless, from the beginning she has declared of Christ, as the apostle Thomas declared, "My Lord"

The reality that God himself became a man for our salvation — what is called the Incarnation, literally "becoming flesh" (carne = meat), is at the heart of Christian faith. Denial of this truth has been the hallmark of many heretical sects. Jesus himself declared, "The Father [that is, God] and I are one" (In 10:30). When he did, some of those who heard him picked up stones to kill him for blasphemy, because they correctly understood the implication of what he was saying: He

was claiming to be God (Jn 10:0-33; Jn 5:17-18).

In fact, Jesus claimed virtually every attribute of the Father in heaven, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, who revealed himself in the Old Testament, for himself. He spoke authoritatively *as* God rather than merely *for* God as did the prophets: He accepted worship. He forgave sins. He said he was equal to his Father. And he claimed that he had existed eternally.

New Testament authors verified his claim: "For in him," St. Paul wrote, "dwells the whole fullness of the deity bodily" (Col 2:9); "In the beginning," the Gospel according to John announced, "was the Word...the Word was God... All things came to be through him... and without him nothing came to be... And the word became flesh" (In 1:1, 3, 14).

Several people have been asking about the white PVC pipes on the ground outside of the Knights of Columbus building by the Fall Festival grounds. The pipes, assembled into two long rectangles, are bocce courts. The courts belong to Special Olympics of Santa Rosa County, who obtained permission from the parish to use the space.

Most Americans that I've heard pronounce bocce as BAH-chee, but I'm sure our Italian friends would be happy to correct us on that. Bocce is similar to lawn bowling. For me, it's like a cross between bowling and horseshoes. In any case, it's a competitive game. The Special Olympics athletes needed a place to practice, and their director asked if our parish had room. Special Olympics of Santa Rosa County provided their proof of insurance, and they provide the coaches and equipment.

Many of the athletes who participate in bocce also attend our monthly dances, so watching bocce has been a good opportunity for us to get to know each other better. They use the bocce courts each Saturday evening, starting at 4:45 pm. Occasionally, they use the time to conduct the local competitions instead of practicing.

On Saturday, March 23, Nina and I were asked to help present the award ribbons for the Santa Rosa County Bocce competition. Somehow, Nina ended up behind the camera and I was in front of it. That was poor planning on someone's part, as she is much prettier that I am.

Bocce will continue each Saturday through late May. I strongly encourage everyone to come watch and make new friends. It's a great deal of fun and very heart-warming.

And don't forget – our Special Dances are the fourth Thursday of every month, from 6pm to 8pm, almost always in the parish hall. Come on out and have some fun with us!


