FIELD AGENT'S REPORT

As Thanksgiving approaches at the end of the month, I like to take stock of all the things I'm thankful for.

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

What Is The Millennium?

What exactly is the nature of the "*millennium*" – that is, the "thousand-year" reign of Christ with his saints as described in Revelation ^(20:1-10)?

I. Some Christians, among them a few of the ancient Church Fathers, have taken what is called the "premillennial" interpretation of the verses. This position holds that after Christ returns to the earth in glory, He will reign for a thousand years in a literal earthly kingdom before judgment Day and the end of the world. Premillennialists teach that this period will be a golden age of natural, social, moral, economic, and political conditions.

The Church, however, eventually rejected this interpretation. In one statement on the Church's position, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith replied in 1944 to a formal query about the teaching "*that Christ the Lord before the final judgment...will come visibly to rule over this world.*" The Church's answer to the question was: "This notion '*cannot be taught safely.*"

II. "Postmillennialists," under the influence of the Protestant reformer John Calvin, teach that the kingdom of God is now being extended throughout the world by preaching the gospel, social activism, and the work of the Holy Spirit through conversions. Through this process, the world will eventually be Christianized. Then at the end of this "*millennium*" (figuratively 'a long time'), Christ will return to earth at the climax of a long period of righteousness and peace. The Catholic Church rejects this view as well. As the *Catechism* ⁽⁶⁷⁷⁾ teaches: "*The kingdom will be fulfilled, then, not by a historic triumph of the Church through a progressive ascendancy, but only by God's victory over the final unleashing of evil, which will cause his Bride to come down from heaven* ^(Rv 13:8; 20:7-10; 2:2-4)."

III. Since the time of St. Augustine, most Catholics have tended toward the so-called "amillennial" ("no millennium") position he made popular. Amillennialists might more accurately be termed "present millennialists," because they do believe in the "*millennium*" referred to in Revelation Ch. 20. But they insist that the "thousand years" refer symbolically to the present age between Christ's two advents rather than to some era in the future.

St. Augustin's views on this issue, though they have dominated Catholic thinking for many centuries, have not been officially adopted by the Church. In fact, the magisterium has never defined the "*millennium*" that St. John saw in his vision; it has only rejected certain interpretations of the term.



Brother Knights my day starts at 5 AM. Why? Yes, I enjoy my German Coffee. And I watch the sun rise. That's the evidence of God's power in creation. When the first Sunbeams of the rising sun touch the earth, what can you feel on your skin? The warmth of the sun. In reality, you are feeling the result of God's creative power.

How powerful is the Sun? At its core, its temperature is said to be about 27,000,000 degrees Fahrenheit (15,000,000 C). Every second, the sun emits energy equivalent to the explosion of many hundreds of millions of nucléar bombs. Yet our sun is small compared to many of the untold trillions of stars in the universe. Scientists estimate that one of the largest stars, named UY Scuti, has a diameter about 1,700 times that of the sun. Maybe that helps us to understand more fully Jesus's statement that God his Father made the heavens and the earth, that is, the universe, by his great power.

How do we benefit from God's power? Our life depends on God's physical creation, such as the sun and all the wonderful resources on earth. God uses his power to benefit humans in a personal way.

In the first century God the Son used His powers to perform deeds that were truly miraculous. We ask what about today? He gives us the power to create what we have and use.
