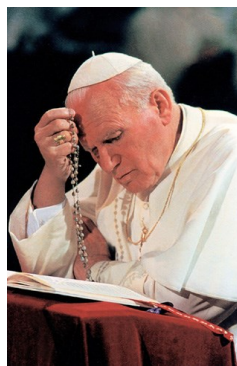
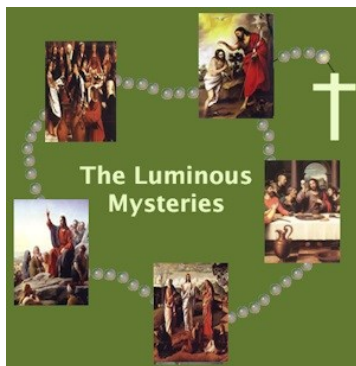

FIELD AGENT'S REPORT

A field agent like me who is lucky enough to be doing this great work for even a few years, undoubtedly has a personal story of the chaos and disorder that a devastated family stares at when there is a sudden loss. If our goal is to protect Catholic families from the near devastation that our Venerable founder faced, then I have to tell the story of how I can help my brother knights. The process of making sure one has adequate protection for the family is not painful; in fact since we are brother knights serving brother knights, it is often a time of not only helping to protect all that is important to a family, but also a shared experience that leads to an abiding friendship.

There are two stories I'd like to relate.

The first is about a young boy named Julius. When Julius was 7 years old his mother, Irene, who was 37, died of cancer. His father, Norman, had two teenage girls along with 7 year old Julius to support and raise. The family was forced to rely on the help and generosity of friends and relatives because Irene died without life insurance. Norman had a three hour commute to his job, but always supported his children's activities. Julius excelled at sports, especially football and his dad spent what little free time he had fostering Julius and his talent. Julius later admitted that he "was handed a life lesson early, growing up with one parent. It wasn't the easiest life—my dad sacrificed a lot."

Fast forward to Julius some 30 years later and he is married, has a wife and two children. He's done quite well for himself both professionally and financially. He has had a distinguished career and he has a considerable amount of life insurance to protect his family. Julius understands protection quite well after the early life he experienced. He understands the hardships of a family that loses a parent and what the children must go through. In his professional life he enjoyed considerable success

because of those that protected him. For 13 years he was protected in his career. You see that protection for Julius came in the form of 300 pound offensive linemen...nobody called him Julius. His nickname was "Boomer"...Boomer Esiason—a four time Pro Bowler, an NFL Most Valuable Player and a Walter Peyton NFL Man of the Year. Most importantly, a husband to Cheryl and a father to Sydney and Gunnar.

"Life happens at the most unexpected of times, and life insurance is about protecting the future and the people you love," Boomer says.

"Remember, if something happens and you haven't done the planning, the people you leave behind will feel the brunt of your mistakes." That story comes from LifeHappens.org.

The other story is not similar at all. It's about a member of the Knights of Columbus. He passed away recently and like in Boomer's family, left behind a spouse and several young children. There were no whispered worries at the funeral home. There was no GoFundMe page to raise money. There is no concern that the children will not go to college or that the wedding he promised his daughter will not take place. No, their home and future are secure. Who was that knight? I don't know; you don't hear about those men. Because the council didn't have to have a spaghetti dinner or pass the hat. But I assure you he was out there. But you'll never know it...because he planned.

Let's sit down and do some planning and put your mind at ease.

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

Do the Devil and Demons Really Exist?

The story of Job tells how Satan asked God for a chance to test Job (Jb 1:6-12). Are we to understand this as a symbolic reference to evil? Or do demons have a real existence as personal, but not human beings? Scripture, Tradition, and the Church's magisterium [Latin for the office of a teacher or other person in authority - from magister, master] all consistently affirm that God has in fact created angelic beings to serve him. But some of the angels made a radical and irrevocable decision to reject God and his reign (Jude 6). Though created good by God, they became evil through their own free will. So they were cast from his presence in heaven (Lk 10:18), and they now attempt to seduce human beings away from God as well (Gn 3:1-7).

The leader of these fallen angel, or demons, has many names in Scripture:

- The evil one, 1 Jn 5:18-19,
- The Devil, Greek word meaning "the one who throws himself across the divine plan", Mt 4:1,
- "The ruler of the world", Jn 14:30,
- Satan, in Hebrew "adversary, accuser", Jb 1:6, and

- The serpent or dragon, Rv 12:9.
- The great power and intelligence that belongs to angels by their nature, now perverted for wicked purposes by the diabolical rebellion against God, allows the demons to do great evil in the world. Nevertheless, as mere creatures they are by no means God's equal and in the end their utter defeat is sure through Jesus Christ (Heb 2:14-15).

In the meantime, except perhaps in the case of a genuine demonic possession which is rare, human beings cannot be forced by Satan against their will (Jas 4:7). His tactics instead are to tempt, deceive, and accuse (Mt 4:1-11; Rv 12:9-10; Zec 3:1-2). For that reason, our Lord has taught us to pray, "*Deliver us from the evil one.*" (Mt 6:13).

We have been opening our meeting with the "Knights Prayer".

Drilling down, I wish to focus on the third line.

believe in the Twelve Articles of our Faith, practice the Ten Commandments of the Law and, finally, be delivered from the seven capital sins to the last day of my life."

Seven Works of Mercy... The Corporal Works of Mercy.

1. To feed the hungry.
2. To give water to the thirsty.
3. To clothe the naked.
4. To shelter the homeless.
5. To visit the sick.
6. To visit the imprisoned, or ransom the captive.
7. To bury the dead.

From the CCC 2447:

The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities.

The First Six of the list given by Jesus himself in Chapter 25 of the Gospel of Matthew, in the famous sermon on the Last Judgment.

During the Middle Ages, the Seventh Work of Mercy, was added; which is found in the Book of Tobit, most likely as a response to the "Black Death" that killed 30 to 60% of Europe's Population.

In any event, they are very Biblical, with The Book of Isaiah, Chapter 58, having a similar list to the one Jesus used.

SO, what does all this mean for us, Sir Knights?

Simple, we have work to do, as best we can as often as we can, as these should be considered as part of our Marching orders as the Church Militant, our battle plan against the Evil that is at work in all of Creation.

A battle yes, but one we are more than equipped to win, by Virtue of our Baptism, by Virtue of the Graces from the frequent reception of the Sacraments, by Virtue of faithfully following the Principles of our Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.
