The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Sunday, June 6

Pope Urban IV established the Feast of Corpus Christi as a universal feast of the Church, on September 8, 1264. At his request St. Thomas Aquinas composed the office (the official prayers of the Church) for the feast. This office is widely considered one of the most beautiful in the traditional Roman Breviary, and it is the source of the famous Eucharistic hymns "Pange Lingua Gloriosi" and "Tantum Ergo Sacramentum."

We are in the last month of our fraternal year. We can be justifiably proud of the many ways we've served our parish and our community this past year. We had to be especially creative to get things done while keeping ourselves and others safe during this Coronavirus pandemic. After our Church was shut down by the pandemic, we helped re-open the Church and disinfect it after each Mass. We responded to our community's needs after Hurricane Sally. We've been called upon to do many things, and we successfully completed many of them. We embraced Leave No Neighbor Behind. There is more to be done.

At the 117th Convention of the Florida State Council held May 28 and 29, our council was recognized twice for the work we've done. Field Agent's Report

Income Protection!

Spring is here, we have a new season and after a blessed Easter and a beautiful Eastertide, it's time to start planning again. With spring and the break in the weather, I've started to put together my honey-do list that will take me outside into the sunshine...at least I hope it's going to be sunny when I get outdoors to do all these chores. I don't know about you, but this time of year seems to energize me. After being cooped up all winter, and this year really being cooped up, I've been able to think of all the things I need to get done. Some of that includes physical repairs around the house, getting the lawn and flowerbeds ready to go, maybe even washing some windows.

Now when you get outside to get that work done, please, please be careful! I'm reminded of two acquaintances who were up on ladders in the spring. In both cases, the ladder slipped, and each gentleman sustained two broken arms! Out of commission for quite a while. But there are many hazards that can put you out of commission...and that brings me to the important part of my message this month. Protecting your greatest asset!

Your greatest asset is your ability to work and earn an income! Take your annual income (probably fresh in your mind with tax filing day extended into May) and multiply it times your remaining years of working. A 35 year old making \$50,000 a year will earn \$1.5 million in the next 30 years....if he never gets another raise! So you have lots to protect. But what if you're sick or hurt and can't work. Maybe it's something simple like the gents above...a set of broken arms. But one of my members laid his motorcycle down on his leg...off from work for two years! That's a lot of house payments to miss. Luckily, his disability income policy came to the rescue. It can happen to any one of us.

And disability does not discriminate; man or woman; Black, white, Hispanic or Asian; young or old. A 2014 CDA Long-Term Disability Claims Review had a number of notes: More than 1 in 4

of today's 20 year-olds will become disabled before they retire, 76% of us live paycheck to paycheck; less than 5% of all disabling accidents and illnesses are work related. That means 95% of those are not covered by Worker's Compensation. You're on your own 95% of the time. Turn to Social Security; but Social Security's report on SSDI says that only about 40% of applicants are awarded benefits. Couple that with 69% of the private sector workforce having no long-term disability income insurance and it's no wonder disabilities are the #1 cause of mortgage foreclosures.

So what to do? Let's get together and find out. Do you need disability income insurance? If so, how much? Maybe you have some at work...is it enough? Is it taxable? Is it the right kind? Let me suggest you put your mind and your family's mind at ease. Life is unpredictable, pandemic or not. Let's plan for the worst...but expect the best. We can't see what the future will bring, I'm here to help you plan for the unexpected. Let's make sure that if you or your spouse are sick or hurt and can't work, that your family can stay in the home you've provided, pay the utilities, buy groceries...make sure the basics are covered.

Meanwhile, stay safe and healthy.

Deacon's Teaching

Father's Day – 3rd Sunday in June

What is special about Father's Day? It's a day for honoring fatherhood and the influence of fathers in society. Fatherhood is a vocation, a call from God, and like any vocation, it is tough, but fulfilling if done well.

Jesus illuminated our goals as fathers by showing how God accomplishes the task as our heavenly Father. He takes delight in His children (Mt 3:17), loves unconditionally (Mt 5:45), is provident and responsible (Mt 6:26), pays close and caring attention (Mt 6:8), forgives (Lk 6:36, 15:11-32), teaches (Mt 11:25-26, 16:17, Jn 6:44), lovingly disciplines (Heb 12:5-11), works hard (Jn 5:17, 36), and shares his life (Jn 6:40). We should strive to imitate His example not only as fathers but as children of God.

Pope Francis reminds us that *“a good father knows how to forgive from the depths of his heart. Certainly, he also knows how to correct with firmness: he is not a weak father, submissive and sentimental. The father who knows how to correct without humiliating is the one who knows how to protect without sparing himself.”*

Some fathers feel they are useless or unnecessary, but the fact is that children need to find a father waiting for them when they return home with their problems. They may try hard not to admit it, not to show it, but they need it. (Taken from his apostolic exhortation “Amoris Laetitia: On Love in the Family.”)

But not everyone was raised by a father who followed these guidelines. Maybe yours made some bad decisions. Remember that he is mortal just like you. As a father yourself now, and understanding what a demanding job fatherhood is, forgive him as God forgives us. Accept that he did the best he was able to

do.

For most of the members in Council 7027 our children are now adults, but this advice still applies - and extends to grandkids as well.

This Father's Day, let us be grateful for:

- Our earthly fathers who loved us and supported us through life.
- Our bishops and priests who act as spiritual fathers and take on the paternal role of guiding us through life.
- And God our Father, who always grants us boundless mercy and love.
