

Grand Knight's Report George Elliott

Dear Brother Knights and Families, Our council mourns the loss of Nancy Opiela, beloved wife of **Sir Knight Richard Opiela**. Nancy passed on April 14. Please keep all of the Opiela family in your prayers. We welcome into our order and into our council two new brother knights. Brother **Michael Gaus** and Brother **Ronald Livorno** progressed from Candidates to Third Degree Knights when they underwent the Charity, Unity, and Fraternity Degree on Sunday, April 3 in Saint Rose of Lima Church. Joining them in the degree exemplification was Brother **Adrian Cuyuch**, who progressed to Third Degree Knighthood.

Michael was proposed for membership by his father, Brother **James Gaus**, and Ron was proposed by me.

That degree exemplification was unique in at least two respects. It was our council's first live degree since the start of the coronavirus pandemic, and it was our council's first time conducting the new degree which can be viewed by members and guests. Our degree team, consisting of **Deacon Jeff Massey, Chancellor Tom** Kubalewski, Financial Secretary Bill McDonald, Joey Davis, and Warden Justin Paul did a great job. Our Field Agent, **Jeff Fischer** provided valuable assistance to the team. And last but certainly not least, many thanks go to **our Chaplain**, **Monsignor Reed** for his participation in the degree and his support of our efforts.

If your schedule permits, I highly recommend going to Saint Paul Church in Pensacola at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, May 3rd, for the **Exposition of the Sacred Relics**. As described on this ministry's web page, *An exposition involves over 150 relics from every period of the Church's history, including St. Joseph, the Twelve Apostles, St. Mary Magdalene, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Maria Goretti, St. Thérèse of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope St. John Paul II, and Bl. Carlo Acutis. The*

supreme highlight is some of the largest remaining fragments of Wood from the True Cross (the Cross upon which Our Lord died) and a piece of the Veil worn by the Blessed Virgin Mary. More information can be found in this newsletter on Page 5.

Our **K of C Family Breakfast** held on April 10 for the people affected by the war in Ukraine was a great success. We collected and donated \$1,001.75 to the Knights of Columbus **Ukraine Solidarity Fund**. Our May breakfast will benefit **Santa Rosa Kids House**, a local child advocacy center that has been serving abused and neglected children since 2008. Please join us for breakfast and help support this worthy cause!

Our May Officers/Planning Meeting will be held on the usual first Thursday of the Month. but our monthly Council Meeting will be pushed back to the third Thurday (May 19). That's because several officers will be traveling to the Florida State Council's annual convention. Both of our meetings are open to all knights and are conducted in-person and online. Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Easter Tide

In most European languages, the word for the celebration of Christ's

resurrection is the same word for the Jewish feast of Passover; it is a derivative of the Hebrew Pesach (in Latin, Pascha). This is because Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Old Testament festival of Passover, the remembrance of God delivering his people out of slavery in Egypt. Through his passion, death, and resurrection, Jesus frees us from the slavery of sin and death. For this reason, He is called the Paschal Lamb.

Our celebration of the Paschal Lamb reaches its pinnacle at the dramatic Easter vigil. But a feast this momentous cannot be confined to a single day; we continue the celebration for a full 50 days until the feast of Pentecost. "The 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better, as one 'Great Sunday.'" (Congregation for Divine Worship, General Norms for the Liturgical Year.

and the Calendar). [As an aside, every Sunday throughout the year is a "little Easter;" that's why Sundays are not included in the 40 days of Lent.]

The first eight days of Easter Tide constitute the <u>Octave</u> of Easter and are celebrated as <u>solemnities</u> (a sense of seriousness and dignity) of the Lord.^[13] Since 2000, the Second Sunday of Easter is also called <u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u>.

The Sundays of Easter Tide rank as the paschal Sundays, and after Easter Sunday itself, are referred to as the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Sundays of Easter. This period of fifty sacred days ends on Pentecost Sunday.

The fortieth day after Easter is Ascension Thursday. This solemnity directs our attention to Christ who ascended to heaven before the eyes of his disciples, who is now seated at the right hand of the Father, and who is destined to come again at the end of time. Ascension Thursday has been transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter and is not a holy day of obligation.

The weekdays after the Ascension until the Saturday before Pentecost are a preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete (Greek: *parakletos* 10hn 14:16, 26; 15:26; and 16:7 meaning 'advocate' or 'helper' referring to the Holy Spirit). Easter Tide's season of joy comes to an end on Pentecost Sunday.

The liturgical color for the season is white, which is the color designated for feasts and festivals. Although gold is not a liturgical color, it may be used to accent the white; together, they are symbols of joy and glory.

The Easter Season is fifty days, not forty like Lent, or four weeks like Advent. It is sometimes known as the "Festival of Weeks," seven weeks of seven days (49 days), plus one, the fiftieth day, Pentecost.

The last nine days of the Easter Season from Ascension Thursday to Pentecost Sunday, are *novem*, Latin for "nine." Jesus instructed his disciples "*not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait* … [because] *in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit*" (Acts 1:4.5). The nine days from Ascension to Pentecost are a novena, a period of prayer before the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The foremost symbol of the season is the Christ Candle, the Easter Candle, or the Paschal Candle. It represents the Risen Christ who is the Light of the World (In 14-5.9, 8-12: 12-46). This candle is given a prominent location during the Easter Season, usually in the sanctuary or somewhere in the front of the church. After Pentecost, it is moved back to its usual place. The liturgical word for the Easter Season is Alleluia; it is used for the dismissal from Mass.

As St. John Chrysostom reminds us in his famous Easter homily, Christ has destroyed death, and now "enjoy ye all the feast of

faith." Once Easter Sunday and the Octave of Easter have passed, keep on celebrating and wishing your friends, "Have a Happy Easter."

TREASURES OF THE CHURCH IS A MINISTRY OF EVANGELIZATION OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Treasures of the Church is a ministry of evangelization of the Catholic Church. Directed by Fr. Carlos Martins, its purpose is to give people an experience of the living God through an encounter with the relics of his saints in the form of an exposition. Each exposition begins with a multi-media presentation on the Church's use of relics that is scriptural, catechetical, and devotional, leading to a renewal of the Catholic faith for many people. After the teaching those in attendance have an opportunity to venerate the relics of some of their favorite saints.

The veneration of relics is a communion with the heroes of our Christian faith, asking for their powerful intercession. Many people have reported outstanding blessings and conversions through this ministry, and many have reported healings. Attendees are encouraged to bring their articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which may be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercessory prayer.

St. Paul Catholic Church (3131 Hyde Park Rd., Pensacola) welcomes you to a teaching and exposition of sacred relics. Over 150 relics will be shown, some as old as 2,000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of the Apostles, St. Joseph, St. John the Baptist, St. Mary Magdalene, St. Maria Goretti, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be a fragment of the veil that belonged to Our Lady and some of the world's largest remaining pieces of the wood of the true cross.




