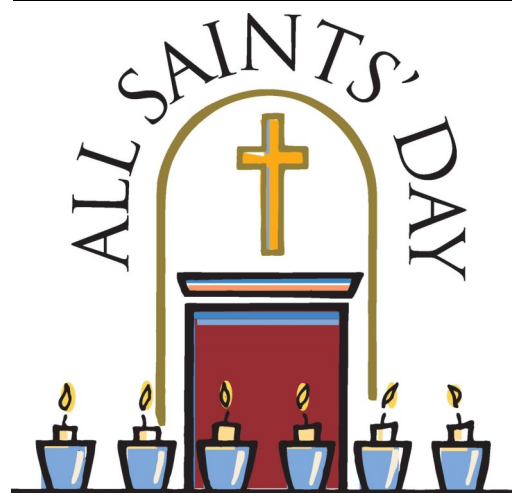

Field Agent's Corner: Top 10 Facts to Know About Long-Term Care Planning

November is National Long-Term Care Awareness Month, an event recognized by Congress and a number of States. To mark the occasion, here are 10 interesting facts shared by the American Association for Long-Term Care Insurance.

1 - Americans are living longer, in large part due to advances in medical care and public health. Life expectancy in the US for those reaching 65 was 20 years on average in 2019.

2 - By 2030, one in five residents in the US will be 65 or older.

3 – The number of people in need of long term support services (LTSS) in the United States is already at 14 million and expected to grow to 27 million by 2050.

4 – Average out-of-pocket costs are \$140,000 for those individuals who utilize paid long term support services (LTSS). Roughly 17 percent will spend over \$100,000 on LTSS. Almost 9 percent will spend over \$250,000 on LTSS.

5 – By 2040, the total prevalence of Alzheimer's disease and related dementias in the US is expected to approximately double from 7.2 million to nearly 13 million, with 8.5 million women and 4.5 million men expected to develop dementia.

6 – For those requiring high levels of LTSS, individuals and families pay 55 percent of long-term care costs out of pocket.

7 – Currently, the majority of older single-person households are female. Women comprised 74 percent of solo households aged 80 and over.

8 – Some 7.5 million Americans have some form of long[1]term care insurance. Two-thirds of all new individual long[1] term care insurance claims pay for care needed by women.

9 – The long-term care insurance industry paid out \$11 billion in benefits to some 310,000 individuals with insurance protection in 2019. The number will increase each year as the current number of policyholders grow older and, as a result, are more likely to begin their claim.

10 – 69.5 percent of new claims start after the policyholder reaches age 80. If you live a long life, you are very likely to need long term care. You'll be very glad you have a policy to pay benefits.

Deacon's Teaching (Sacred) Tradition as the Basis of Catholic Theology

Two months ago, we looked at The Virgin Mary's Role in Salvation History to which all Christians agree.

Last month we looked at The Virgin Mary as *Theotokos*, Mother of God Incarnate that 'Bible Only' Christians deny. They claim the Bible doesn't say she gave birth to the 'Divine Jesus,' therefore, she must have only given birth to the 'Human Jesus.'

This article will briefly discuss why Sacred Tradition (with a capital T) is one of the two pillars on which Catholic theology rests (the Bible is the other) in supporting the doctrine of Mary as *Theotokos*.

Non-Catholic Christians claim that the Bible is the only voice of God and is sufficiently clear that one does not need apostolic tradition or the Church's Magisterium (teaching authority) to help one understand it. In this view, anything extraneous to the Bible is simply non-authoritative, unnecessary, or wrong—and may well hinder one from coming to God.

The problem with this claim is that the Bible itself is the product of Sacred Tradition - the teachings of God handed down orally before they were recorded and eventually compiled into what we today call the Bible. After all, we do not have a single copy or shred of scripture that is an original, Old, or New Testament! The Bible, therefore, is the embodiment of Tradition, not the negation of it; it supports those pre-existing oral teachings, not overrules them.

Closely examining the books of the Bible, we discover that at least 12 Old Testament books are anonymous and of

the 27 New Testament books, six are anonymous. Interestingly, non-Catholics today accept the Catholic Tradition of 27 books of the New Testament as divinely inspired despite some of them having unknown authors. *Somehow*, those anonymous books became accepted as part of the canon of scripture we all use today.

One thing the Bible does not have is an authoritative teacher/interpreter. Such an interpreter is needed because, as can be seen, today, a multitude of conflicting accounts of the true Christian message has evolved. This is because it is not possible to put together any selection of words in which a person may find a meaning that was not intended by the writer. (Luke 1:1-4; 2 Thes 3:6)

In the secular world, our own US Constitution is a prime example of this. Although we do have an original of it, we still need a voice of authority to rightly interpret what its authors intended – the US Supreme Court.

It's a mistake to limit God's word to the written word only; the Bible nowhere cites this notion. It does, however, refer to much that was said but not committed to writing.

That word *Somehow* above is what the Church calls the *sensus fidelium*, the sense of the faithful. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "*The whole body of the faithful... cannot err in matters of belief. This characteristic is shown in the supernatural appreciation of faith (sensus fidei) on the part of the whole people, when, from the bishops to the last of the faithful, they manifest a universal consent in matters of faith and morals.*" (CCC 92)

"By this appreciation of the faith, aroused and sustained by the Spirit of truth, the People of God, guided by the sacred teaching authority (Magisterium),... receives... the faith, once for all delivered to the saints..."^(CCC 93) "It is clear therefore that, in the supremely wise arrangement of God, sacred Tradition, Sacred Scripture, and the Magisterium of the Church are so connected and associated that one of them cannot stand without the others. Working together, each in its own way, under the action of the one Holy Spirit, they all contribute effectively to the salvation of souls."^(CCC 95)

Like a three-legged stool of divine revelation - Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the Magisterium – the Church makes sure that the Word of God is faithfully handed on to succeeding generations.

But, fundamentalists say, Jesus condemned tradition. They note, "And why do you transgress the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition?"^(Matt. 15:3) . And, Paul warned, "See to it that no one makes a prey of you by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ"^(Col. 2:8) .

These verses, however, are condemning erroneous human traditions, not truths that were handed down orally and entrusted to the Church. ^(1 Cor. 11:1-2; 1 Thess. 2:13; 2 Thess. 2:15; 2 Tim. 1:13-14; 2 Tim. 2:2; 2 Tim. 3:14-17) These

latter truths are part of what is known as Sacred Tradition, which is to be distinguished from human traditions (with a lowercase "t") or customs.

This brings us to the Church's teaching of Mary as *Theotokos*. Although defined dogmatically at the Council of Ephesus in AD 431, her title had been recognized since at least the 3rd century. * Mary's title only came into question when Nestorius, Patriarch of Constantinople, taught that Mary gave birth to the human Jesus, not the divine Jesus.

Because the title *Theotokos* was accepted by the faithful (*sensus fidelium*) and did not contradict Sacred Scripture or the Magisterium, the Council of Ephesus made its declaration that The Virgin Mary was *Theotokos*.

* The title has been in use since the 3rd century, in the [Syriac tradition](#) (as [Classical Syriac](#): ܡܪܝܡ ܐܠܘܗܝܐ Romanized: *Yoldath Aloho*) in the [Liturgy of Mari and Addai](#) (3rd century)^[6] and the [Liturgy of St James](#) (4th century).

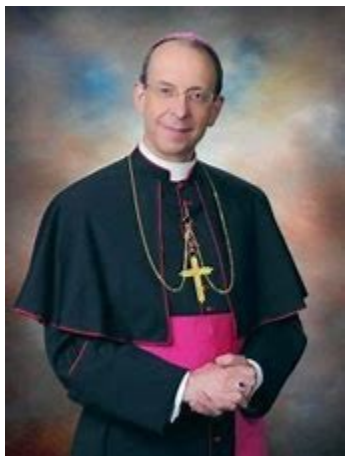
We must thank all our volunteers for their help, because without them none of this would be possible.
