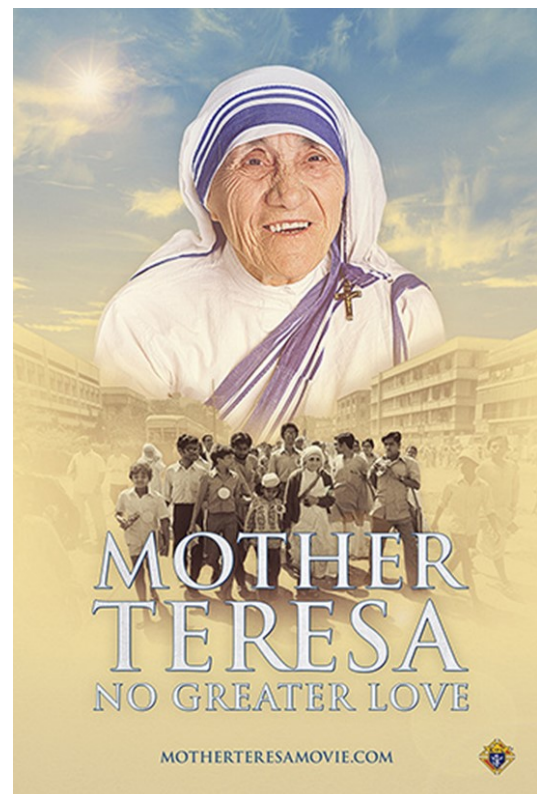

Perhaps you have heard about the recent article in "The Atlantic Magazine"; "How the Rosary Became an Extremist Symbol" which insinuates somehow a connection between the rosary and guns and violence. Of course, this is nonsense, but it does continue with the anti-Catholic sentiment that is in our society. The rosary is in fact a "weapon" as St Padre Pio used to say: it is a weapon in the spiritual warfare against evil and the evil spirits. What is my point?

Our Blessed Mother Mary has on numerous occasions, during her appearances, told us to pray the rosary, and we know that praying the rosary can change the course of history i.e., Battle of Lepanto and the fall of the Soviet Union. When was the last time you prayed the rosary? Do you carry a rosary with you? The Knights have a special devotion to the Blessed Mother, and we were all given a rosary to carry and pray regularly. I encourage you to do that.

One way to say the daily rosary is to come to church and pray the rosary with others at 7:15AM on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday; 6:30PM before Wednesday evening mass; 3:00PM before the Vigil mass on Saturday; and 7:25AM before Sunday morning mass.

Also, join those praying the rosary the first Saturday of the month at noon at the corner of Park and Dogwood.

There are many reasons to pray the rosary and there are 5 listed below, but I would like to suggest praying a rosary for those on our KofC prayer list especially for Dani Massey who is battling serious health issues.

Five reasons to pray the rosary suggested by our Order:

A field agent like me who is lucky enough to be doing this great work for even a few years, undoubtedly has a personal story of the chaos and disorder that a devastated family stares at when there is a sudden loss. If our goal is to protect Catholic families from the near devastation that our Venerable founder faced, then I have to tell the story of how I can help my brother knights. The process of making sure one has adequate protection for the family is not painful; in fact since we are brother knights serving brother knights, it is often a time of not only helping to protect all that is important to a family, but also a shared experience that leads to an abiding friendship. There are two stories I'd like to relate.

The first is about a young boy named Julius. When Julius was 7 years old his mother, Irene, who was 37, died of cancer. His father, Norman, had two teenage girls along with 7 year old Julius to support and raise. The family was forced to rely on the help and generosity of friends and relatives because Irene died without life insurance. Norman had a three hour commute to his job, but always supported his children's activities. Julius excelled at sports, especially football and his dad spent what little free time he had fostering Julius and his talent. Julius later admitted that he "was handed a life lesson early, growing up with one parent. It wasn't the easiest life—my dad sacrificed a lot."

Fast forward to Julius some 30 years later and he is married, has a wife and two children. He's done quite well for himself both professionally and financially. He has had a distinguished career and he has a considerable amount of life insurance to protect his family. Julius understands protection quite well after the early life he experienced. He understands

the hardships of a family that loses a parent and what the children must go through. In his professional life he enjoyed considerable success because of those that protected him. For 13 years he was protected in his career. You see that protection for Julius came in the form of 300 pound offensive linemen...nobody called him Julius. His nickname was "Boomer"...Boomer Esiason—a four time Pro Bowler, an NFL Most Valuable Player and a Walter Peyton NFL Man of the Year. Most importantly, a husband to Cheryl and a father to Sydney and Gunnar.

"Life happens at the most unexpected of times, and life insurance is about protecting the future and the people you love," Boomer says.

"Remember, if something happens and you haven't done the planning, the people you leave behind will feel the brunt of your mistakes." That story comes from LifeHappens.org.

The other story is not similar at all. It's about a member of the Knights of Columbus. He passed away recently and like in Boomer's family, left behind a spouse and several young children. There were no whispered worries at the funeral home. There was no GoFundMe page to raise money. There is no concern that the children will not go to college or that the wedding he promised his daughter will not take place. No, their home and future are secure. Who was that knight? I don't know; you don't hear about those men. Because the council didn't have to have a spaghetti dinner or pass the hat. But I assure you he was out there. But you'll never know it...because he planned.

Let's sit down and do some planning and put your mind at ease.

Deacon's Teaching

Theotokos vs Christotokos

Theotokos (Θεοτόκος) "Greek for Mother of God Incarnate" vs Christotokos (Χριστοτόκος) "Greek for Christ-bearer"

Last month we looked at four aspects of Mary's Role in Salvation History; the first was her giving birth to God, the second person of the Trinity. This article will look deeper into the Church's reasoning supporting that teaching.

Non-Catholic Christians presume that Catholics give too much honor to Mary without any Biblical citation, while the un-churched think that Catholics worship Mary as a goddess who gave birth to a god.

The truth is that Catholics worship ^[Latreia, Greek for worship] only God, the supreme homage that is given to Him alone. But they honor, love, and venerate Mary ^[Doulia, Greek for veneration] as the most saintly, Spirit-filled woman and seek her intercession ^[The Communion of Saints].

Because she is the most saintly, Spirit-filled person ever (besides Jesus and Adam & Eve before their fall), Mary's veneration is termed *hyperdulia* - but still, she is not a goddess or divine.

Regarding her giving birth to God, let's take a simple quiz. If you can attest to:

Jesus had two natures, human and divine in one person ^(In Greek, the *hypostatic union*), and

At his conception and gestation in Mary's womb, He took on his *hypostatic union*, then Mary is *Theotokos*. Therefore, as the Mother of God, isn't she a unique, special human being who deserves to be honored and venerated above all other women?

But still, there are those who do not believe Mary deserves honor higher than any other woman because the Bible doesn't say she is different from any other woman nor deserves such unwarranted veneration. These Christians contend that she gave birth to the Human Jesus, not the Divine Jesus, and therefore, is no different from any other woman. But this position is also without an explicit Biblical citation! Hence, it brings up the question, "*At what point was Jesus' hypostatic union broken, and then reunited to be the Jesus we all accept today – human and divine?*"

This separation of Jesus' divinity and humanity by non-Catholics was first advanced by Nestorius ^(Patriarch of Constantinople from 428 to 431). He taught the doctrine that there are two separate hypostases ^(entities) in the Incarnate Christ: One the Divine, and the other the Human. The Council of Ephesus ^(431 AD) condemned this false teaching and decreed that the Incarnate Christ is a single *hypostasis* ^(entity), at once God and man - the *hypostatic union*.

Nestorius's opponents charged him with detaching Christ's divinity and humanity into two persons existing in one body, thereby denying the reality of the *Incarnation*.

If one believes that Jesus is both divine and human and that the Virgin Mary is not to be considered *Theotokos*, then one must do some extra-Biblical, God-given gift of human reasoning to arrive at a solution for the dilemma.

It is through service that we share the love of God. I will be addressing the Council concerning preparations for future events, and I look forward to working with each of you in the service of our Lord.

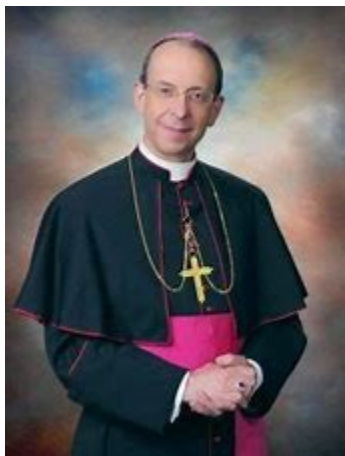
