



Every September a non-profit organization | charitable works and strong advocacy for known as Life Happens coordinates the Life Insurance Awareness Month campaign. Born in Bandon, County Cork, Ireland, he was ordained for the Diocese of Mobile in July, 1939. He immigrated to the United States and was naturalized May 25, 1942. He spent his life in service to the people of Alabama and Northwest Florida, serving as pastor at St. Rose of Lima from June, 1970, until January, 1982. He became a charter member of the Knights of Columbus Council 7027 and was named its patron. He retired to Milton, FL., and died Sept. 8, 1997.







Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher The Virgin's Role In Salvation History

The Catholic Church has honored Mary by proclaiming four major doctrines of faith about her based on Holy

Scripture and Tradition. They are:

- **1.** Divine Maternity. This dogma declares Mary as the mother of God (*Theotoko*s, "God-Bearer"), at the third ecumenical Council of Ephesus in A.D. 431. This dogma defines that Jesus has both the Divine nature and the Human nature in one person. Hence, The Man-Christ is the God-Christ, and his mother is God's mother.
- **2.** Perpetual Virginity. Mary's Perpetual Virginity means that before and after giving birth to Jesus, Mary was a virgin and that she remained a virgin for the rest of her life. Joseph, therefore, did not have sexual relations with her and she never physically bore any other children.

The Perpetual Virginity of Mary has never been officially defined as a Marian Dogma of the Church, but because of its <u>universal</u> <u>acceptance</u> and continued reference in Papal documents throughout the history of the Church; it has come to be accepted as a Marian Dogma. Consequently, it can be said that the perpetual virginity of Mary is a Catholic Dogma by virtue of the ordinary and universal Magisterium.1 The Protestant reformers Martin Luther, John Calvin, and Ulrich Zwingli all affirmed their belief in Mary's perpetual virginity.

While the Bible does mention the "brothers" and "sisters" of Jesus (Matthew 13:55; Mark 6:3), they are never referred to as the sons and daughters of the

Virgin Mary – because - they are not her children. Mark (15:40) mentions a woman called "Mary the mother of James the less and of Joses". James and Joses are two of the "brethren" of Jesus mentioned in Matthew (13:55), so this woman is clearly their mother, not the Mother of Jesus. This "other Mary" (Mt 28:1) is mentioned in John (19:25) as "Mary, the wife of Cleophas", the "sister" of Jesus' mother ("sister" here probably refers to a sister-in-law, since they are both called Mary).

So, James and Joses are the sons of Cleophas and the other Mary, who are most likely Jesus' uncle and aunt on Joseph's side. Since Simon and Jude are mentioned with James and Joses, they are probably also Jesus' cousins. (There is no Hebrew word for *cousin*.)

That the Bible calls them "brothers" does not contradict this interpretation. In that culture, as in many Middle Eastern cultures today, the term "brother" was used for many relatives who were not full siblings, such as half or stepbrothers, brothers -in-law, nephews, cousins of various degrees, etc. Thus, Jesus' "brothers and sisters" were His cousins; Scripture calls them "brothers and sisters" in accord with the custom of the time. Also, the term "brothers/ sisters is used in referring to fellow Christians yet today, as well as fellow comrades-in-arms, or people of the same race.

3. The dogma of Immaculate Conception. This is a dogma based mainly on Christian Tradition and theological reasoning. It was defined

by Pope Pius IX as a dogma of faith through the Apostolic Constitution Ineffabilis Deus (Ineffable God, 'beyond expression') (December 8, 1854) states, "From the first moment of her conception, Mary was preserved immune from original sin by the singular grace of God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, savior of the human race"(CCC #491). This means that original sanctity, innocence, and justice were conferred upon her and that she was exempted from all the evil effects of original sin - excluding sorrow, pain, disease, and death which are temporal penalties inherited through Adam's disobedience (Catholic Encyclopedia)

4. Mary's Assumption into Heaven. Pope Pius XII defined the dogma

Munificentissimus Deus (The Most
Bountiful God November 1, 1950) stating "...we
pronounce, declare, and define it to be a
divinely revealed dogma, that the
Immaculate Mother of God, the everVirgin Mary, having completed the course
of her earthly life, was assumed body and
soul into heavenly glory." [Reference also (Elijah 2
Kings 2:1–18 and Enoch Gen 5:21–24)]

Let us thank God for the Church that his Son endowed with divine authority, for the Holy Spirit that has guided it since Pentecost, and that it continues to teach Truth about God's plan of salvation for all mankind.







Supreme Chaplain's Challenge by Archbishop William E. Lori

"I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance." (Gospel for Sept. 11, Lk 15:7)

This Gospel reading links the parable of the lost sheep with the parable of the prodigal son. Together these parables remind us that God constantly seeks us whenever we go astray. We are all sinners, and like the prodigal son we must wake up, repent and return to the Father. When we do this, we find that he runs to meet us. My brother Knights, let us create some joy in heaven. Let us recognize that we are sinners in need of repentance and ask the Father for his forgiveness.

This month, I challenge you to watch the "Sacramental Life" episode of the *Into the Breach* video series, particularly reflecting on the importance of the sacrament of reconciliation. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action Sacramental Gifts program.

Are there ways you see yourself as a lost sheep, a prodigal son? What concrete steps can you take to overcome sinful habits and avoid temptations? Do you "come home" to the Father to receive his mercy and forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation?
