# From the Deacon's Bench

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



Greeting, as we begin the month of August.

We have many important Feasts and Memorials in August.

- Saint Alphonsus Liguori, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (1 August)
- Saint John Vianney, Priest (4 August)
- Feast of the Transfiguration (6 August)
- Saint Dominic (8 August) founder of the Dominicans also known as the Order of Preachers
- Saint Claire (11 August) one of the first followers of Saint Francis of Assisi founded the Order of Poor Ladies, in 1212. Pope Urban IV officially changed to the Order of Saint Clare in 1263
- Saint Maximilian Kolbe (14 August)
- Saint Bernard, Abbot and Doctor of the Church (20 August)
- Saint Pius X, Pope (21 August)
- Saint Monica (27 August) her son...
- Saint Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (28 August)
- Passion of Saint John the Baptist (29 August) which closes out the Month

Back to the Solemnity of the Assumption on 15 August. The word "Assumption" derives from the Latin word *assumptiō*, meaning 'taking up'. This has been celebrated in the Eastern Church from the 6th century. The Western Church adopted this date as a Holy Day of Obligation to commemorate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a reference to the belief in a real, physical elevation of her sinless soul and incorrupt body into Heaven.

The Assumption of Mary is one of the four Marian dogmas of the Catholic

Church. Pope Pius XII defined it on 1 November 1950 in his apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* as the assumption of Mary, body and soul, into heaven.

The 4 are:

## The Perpetual Virginity of Mary

Mary remained a virgin before, during, and after the birth of Jesus, signifying her complete dedication to God. Affirmed by Early Church Tradition, various councils, The Apostle's Creed and Nicene Creed in 325.

## Mary as the Mother of God

Mary is acknowledged as the Theotokos, or "God-bearer," affirming that she is the mother of Jesus, who is the Son of God, at the Council of Ephesus, 431 AD.

## The Immaculate Conception

Mary was conceived without original sin, preserving her from the stain of sin from the moment of her conception declared by Pope Pius IX in 1854.

## The Assumption of Mary

At the end of her earthly life, Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven declared by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Although made Official in 1950, the teaching of the Assumption of Mary became widespread across the Christian world, having been celebrated as early as the 5th century and having been established in the East by Emperor Maurice around AD 600.

In a homily, John Damascene (675–749 AD), citing the third book of the Euthymiac History, records the following:

*St. Juvenal, Bishop of Jerusalem, at the Council of Chalcedon (451), made known to the Emperor Marcian and Pulcheria, who wished to possess the*



*body of the Mother of God, that Mary died in the presence of all the Apostles, but that her tomb, when opened upon the request of St. Thomas, was found empty; where from the Apostles concluded that the body was taken up to heaven.*

As early as the late 4th century Epiphanius of Salamis wrote he could find no authorized tradition about how her life ended. Epiphanius could not decide on the basis of biblical or church tradition whether Mary had died or remained immortal, his indecisive reflections suggest that some difference of opinion on the matter had already arisen in his time. Because he identified three beliefs concerning her end:

1. that she had a normal and peaceful death;
2. that she died as a martyr;
3. that she did not die.

Even more, in another text Epiphanius stated that Mary was like Elijah because she never died but was assumed, like him.

We must note that The New Testament is also silent regarding the end of her life. Nevertheless, The Bible mentions two prominent figures, Enoch and Elijah, who were taken up to heaven. serving as important precedents for the assumption of Mary.

Enoch, referenced in the Book of Genesis, is noted for his intimate walk with God and is described as having been "taken" by God (Genesis 5:24), an event also reported in the Epistle to the Hebrews (Hebrews 11:5).

Similarly, Elijah, the great prophet, was taken up to heaven in a whirlwind, accompanied by a chariot of fire. (2 Kings 2:11).

The whole point is 2 fold.

1. God has taken people up to heaven, body and soul
2. From early times the Church believed this happened to Mary

Finally, on November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Virgin Mary as a dogma of faith with the apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* as follows:

*We pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.*

Written shortly after the devastation of World War II, the encyclical conveys the hope that meditation on Mary's Assumption will lead the faithful to a greater awareness of our common dignity as the human family. Further, Pope Pius XII expressed the hope that the belief in the bodily Assumption of the Virgin Mary into heaven

*"will make our belief in our own resurrection stronger and render it more effective".*

Bringing this to a close, as we begin August, I pray that all will spend time in prayer and reflection, not just on the Assumption, but on all the Saints whose lives we remember.

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Blessed Michael McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue, may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify Blessed Michael McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (*here make your request*). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us strive not to seek worldly honors in an egotistical spirit, but rather to live as servants to others so that God may exalt us to eternal life.

This month, in which we celebrate the feast of Blessed Michael McGivney on Aug. 13, I challenge you to pray each day the Litany of Blessed Michael McGivney or the prayer for his canonization — and take time to reflect on his humility in serving the people of God.
