

# **Family Picnic**


### Saturday, July 27 at Whiting Park, (5499 Old River Rd. Milton) 10:00 am - 3:00 pm

# Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Cardinals

The St. Joseph Messenger, says: "Cardinals are chosen by the Pope to act as his principal assistants and advisors on affairs

of the Church. Collectively they form the Sacred College of Cardinals. They, together with the Pope as the head of the Church and the Vicar of Christ, act as the guardians of the Church on earth."

The role of this College is to:

Participate in papal elections when the Holy See is vacant (Cardinals over age 80 may not vote). Typically, they hold their title for life.

Advise the Pope about Church matters when he summons them to a consistory (A formal meeting of the College of Cardinals).

There are three ranks of Cardinals:

Cardinal Bishops. Cardinals who hold the more important offices in the Roman Curia or who, being Patriarchs of Eastern Catholic Churches are called Cardinal Bishops.

Cardinal Priests are bishops who serve in dioceses outside Rome. The overwhelming majority of Cardinals are Cardinal Priests. They include officials of the Roman Curia, as well as Archbishops of major dioceses from around the world. Cardinal Priests, hold seniority based on the date of appointment and may even advance by promotion by the Pope to the higher grade of Cardinal Bishop.

Cardinal Deacons. These are the lowest -ranking Cardinals. Only those who are already priests or bishops may be appointed Cardinals. Often called "The pope's cabinet," Cardinal

**Deacons** also work full-time in the curia. The senior Cardinal Deacon has the honor of ceremoniously announcing the newly elected pope from the balcony of the Vatican.

In 1586 Sixtus V fixed the total number of cardinals at 70, of whom 6 were Cardinal Bishops, 50 were Cardinal Priests, and 14 were Cardinal Deacons. In 1958 John XXIII eliminated the restriction of 70, increasing the number of cardinals to 87, and since then the number has reached more than 100.


Under the influence of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) and in recognition of the need for greater internationalization of the College of Cardinals, Paul VI and John Paul II (1978-2005) appointed many new cardinals. Under Paul, there were 145 cardinals, and under John Paul, there were 185, nearly all of whom had been appointed by him.

The growth of the college, however, prompted the imposition of new restrictions on the cardinalate. In 1970 Paul VI directed that cardinals who reach age 75 are to be asked to resign, and those who do not resign are to relinquish the right to vote for a pope when they reach age 80. Paul further decreed that the number of voting cardinals be limited to 120. This restriction was confirmed during the pontificate of John Paul II.

In 1996 a new set of rules issued by John Paul provided that, under certain circumstances, the long-required majority of two-thirds for election of a pope could be superseded by a simple majority. John Paul's successor, Benedict XVI, however, restored the traditional requirement of a two-thirds majority in 2007.

# Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to support one effort to serve the poor and those most in need in your community.

# Jesus can do anything, but he often expects his disciples to participate in his work. Notice that although Jesus performs the miracle, it is the disciples who find the boy with the loaves and fishes, distribute the food and collect the leftovers. We must reject the error of quietism — the idea that activity has little to no place in our spiritual life — and recognize that we have an active role to play in Christ's sacred mission.

### **Questions for Reflection:**

Do you recognize that Christ has work for you to do in this life? When you see suffering around you, is your first response to consider what Christ might be asking you to do? How can you grow in your awareness of the tasks Christ is asking you to undertake?
