Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Some Basics of Ordinary Time

In the liturgy of the <u>Roman Rite</u> Ordinary Time, *Tempus per annum* is that part of the liturgical year that is not part of the two Great

Liturgical Seasons: Avent/Christmas or Lent/Easter. These two great seasons celebrate what could be thought of as "The Main Events in the life of the Church," namely, the Incarnation, Birth, Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension of Jesus, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Technically, Ordinary Time has two parts, but it remains one season. There is a short break between Christmas and Lent; then after Pentecost, it begins again until the following Advent.

Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many think that the Church's Ordinary Time refers to parts of the liturgical calendar that are less important. Not so! It's called Ordinary Time not because it is common or humdrum, but because its weeks are numbered.

Our word Ordinary originates from ordinalis. In Latin, ordo means order or ordinal: thus, we have the 1st Week of Ordinary Time, 2nd Week of Ordinary Time, 3rd Week of Ordinary Time; etc.

The Sundays are likewise so numbered, with one exception: there is no 1st Sunday of Ordinary Time because it is replaced by the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord immediately after the Christmas season ends.

Ordinary Time contains the rest of Jesus' earthly ministry and some of the major events in the Gospels we have come to know and love: the miracles, the parables, the calling of the twelve, the sermon on the mount, the bread of life discourse...we get all that and much more during this season.


It is also a great time to explore the lives of the saints on their feast days. As we follow these saints' feast days, we can find how their lives can be related to our own. They were human beings just like us, warts and all!

Ordinary Time is the season for our spiritual growth in applying what we learned about Jesus in the two Great Liturgical Seasons. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Thus, for Catholics, Ordinary Time is part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time for those days when there is no special feast—is green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which the Church founded by Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and spread the Gospel to all nations. Like spring, the liturgical color green is a time of hope, new growth, and new life.

Mary and Joseph trusted in you and welcomed Jesus into our broken world.


