

# From the Deacon's Bench

Looking Forward to **Lent**



## Marching into **Lent**

Brothers, Greetings as we enter both the Month of March and the Second week of **Lent**. The full moon on Tuesday, 3 March 2026 is called the **Worm Moon**. (From the *Old Farmer's Almanac*)

The name "Worm Moon" refers to the earthworms that emerge as the ground thaws in spring, and is also associated with the arrival of spring and the awakening of nature.

For us, in 2026, the Worm Moon will coincide with a **Total Lunar Eclipse**. Lasting about 59 minutes, from 5:04 AM to 6:02 AM CST.

A Total Lunar Eclipse is also known as a Blood Moon, where the moon takes on a reddish hue.

The Worm Moon will reach its peak on **Tuesday 3 March**, at 5:38 AM CST. The Total Lunar Eclipse will occur around the same time, with totality being around 5:33 AM CST. This celestial event will be visible locally to us in Northwest Florida. As impressive as this is, it pales in comparison to our **Lenten** March as experienced through our Sunday Gospels.

**First Sunday of Lent** Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

Theme: Jesus' temptation in the desert, emphasizing that Jesus will not be tempted to lose his focus on his mission of our Salvation.

**Second Sunday of Lent**: Matthew 17:1-9

Theme: The Transfiguration of Jesus, on Mount Tabor; offering great Hope, while highlighting His

divine glory and the call to listen to Him.

**Third Sunday of Lent**: Gospel: John 4:5-42

Theme: Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. At Sychar, the very place where it was divided, Jesus will reunite the divided Israel, and call us to worship in Spirit and Truth.

**Fourth Sunday of Lent**: Gospel: John 9:1-41

Theme: Near the Temple in Jerusalem, on a **Sabbath**, Jesus will heal the man born blind.

**Fifth Sunday of Lent**: Gospel: John 11:1-45

Theme: The raising of Lazarus, demonstrating Jesus' power over death and foreshadowing His own resurrection.

I mention these so that they may become an additional place for reflection. The last three Gospels from Saint John can be seen almost as stairs. First united with Jesus and being called to worship, healed of our own blindness, then being raised by Jesus on the last day.

I pray that your **Lenten** days be filled with Prayer, Fasting and almsgiving as we March with Jesus to Easter Sunday.



**So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him." (Gospel for March 22, Jn 11:16)**

Look at the bravery of Thomas! Jesus had just announced his intention to travel to Judea, where he had narrowly escaped getting stoned to death. Given the potential danger ahead, Thomas seems prepared for martyrdom. Later, of course, he and the other disciples would flee as Jesus was arrested, and Thomas would doubt reports of Jesus' resurrection. As fallible humans, our strength and resolve sometimes collapse into weakness. May we always seek the courage to follow Jesus faithfully, even when the going gets tough.

## Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, as we continue through Lent, I challenge you to pray the Stations of the Cross each week — in your parish community, with your family or individually — with the intention of receiving the courage to suffer for Christ.
